2.2 Feeding Guidelines

The amount of food your Aussie needs will depend on their age, size, and activity level. Generally, adult dogs require about 1 to 2 cups of food per day, divided into two meals if you decide or one meal a day is fine too. Puppies will need more frequent feeding, typically three to four times a day. If they do not eat the food in 15 to 20 minutes, we remove until the next meal. Don't be afraid if they "fast" for a day or a few days. That is totally normal. Dogs won't allow themselves to starve. If they stop eating their kibble, keep track of what else is being offered for them, that could be why they aren't interested in eating their food.





Regular veterinary check-ups are essential for monitoring your dog's health. Incorporate holistic practices into your dog's health regimen, such as frequencies and natural alternatives for flea and tick prevention, like essential oils and herbal remedies. Prioritizing dental care with natural dental chews and safe herbal solutions can also promote oral hygiene. While spaying or neutering is important for preventing health issues and unwanted litters, consider waiting until your dog is a bit older, around 1.5 to 2 years, to support their growth and development while ensuring their overall well-being.
