CROCHET HAIR MAINTENANCE

Maintaining crochet braids is essential for keeping your style fresh and long-lasting. Follow these tips to ensure your crochet hair remains beautiful and your natural hair stays healthy underneath:

1. Nighttime Care

- **Wrap It Up:** Before bed, cover your crochet braids with a silk or satin scarf or bonnet. This reduces friction, prevents frizz, and helps retain the style. For longer styles, consider using a satin pillowcase or securing your braids in a loose, high bun or pineapple to keep them from tangling.
- **Moisturize Your Scalp:** Use a lightweight oil, like jojoba or argan oil, to keep your scalp hydrated. Apply a small amount to your fingertips and massage it into your scalp before bed to prevent dryness and itchiness.

2. Daily Styling

- **Avoid Over-Manipulation:** The less you touch your crochet braids, the better. Constant manipulation can cause frizz and shorten the lifespan of your style. Gently fluff your hair with your fingers to maintain volume and shape.
- **Use a Light Mousse:** If your crochet curls or waves start to look flat or frizzy, apply a light, alcohol-free mousse to bring them back to life. This will add definition and shine without making the hair stiff.

3 Keep Your Scalp Clean

- **Dry Shampoo or Scalp Cleansing Spray:** Use a dry shampoo or a waterless cleansing spray to keep your scalp fresh. These products absorb excess oil and dirt, helping to maintain a clean, fresh feeling without disturbing the crochet braids.
- **Witch Hazel Solution:** Dab a cotton ball with witch hazel and gently swipe it over your scalp to clean and soothe it. This helps remove buildup and reduces itchiness.

4. Moisturizing the Crochet Hair

- **Spray Conditioner:** Use a lightweight leave-in spray conditioner to keep your crochet braids soft and moisturized. Avoid heavy, creamy products, as they can cause buildup and make the hair look greasy. Focus on the ends, which can get dry over time.
- **Refresh with Water-Based Sprays:** To refresh curls or waves, lightly mist them with water or a water-based braid spray, then gently scrunch them to restore their shape.



CROCHET HAIR MAINTENANCE CONTINUED

. Avoid Heat

- **No Heat Styling:** Crochet braids aren't meant to be heat-styled, so avoid using curling irons, straighteners, or blow dryers. Heat can damage the synthetic fibers, causing them to lose their texture and shine.
- **Dry Naturally:** If your hair gets wet, let it air dry naturally instead of using heat to dry it. You can gently pat it with a towel to remove excess moisture.

6. Detangle Carefully

- **Finger Detangling:** If your crochet braids are curly or wavy, use your fingers to gently detangle any knots. Avoid using a brush or comb, as this can cause frizz and disrupt the curl pattern.
- **Trim Frizzy Ends:** If you notice any frizzy or tangled ends, trim them with a pair of scissors to keep your style looking neat. Regularly trimming problem areas can prolong the overall lifespan of your crochet braids.

7. Protect Your Edges

- **Use Edge Control Sparingly:** While you may want to keep your edges sleek, be mindful of using heavy gels that can cause buildup. Opt for lightweight, water-based edge control products and avoid tight styling that pulls on your edges.
- **Massage Your Hairline:** To promote healthy edges, gently massage your hairline with a nourishing oil. This can help stimulate hair growth and prevent breakage.

8. Know When to Remove Them

- **Watch for Growth:** Crochet braids can typically last 4-8 weeks, depending on how well you care for them. However, if you notice your natural hair growing out significantly or your braids getting loose, it's time to remove them.
- **Don't Overextend:** Leaving crochet braids in for too long can lead to tangling, matting, and damage to your natural hair. Make sure to schedule removal and give your hair a break before your next install.
