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
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



- 3. Share referral links and earn commissions for every sale made through them.



- Hire property managers to reduce hands-on involvement.




# THE FRONT-LOADED EFFORT OF PASSIVE INCOME

# WHAT IS SEMI-PASSIVE INCOME?


#### **Definition**

Evergreen products or content remain relevant and profitable over time with minimal updates.



To minimise how much time you spend on social media while keeping it effective, consider these strategies:


- **Automation:** Use tools like Buffer, Hootsuite, or Later to schedule posts in advance, reducing the need for daily involvement.

#### Savings Account Interest


- Income generated from high-yield savings accounts.


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
