2. What the System Measures

The System evaluates three interacting dimensions: Character, Pressure, and Leverage. These combined form the Signal. A Signal is not a tip or prediction — it identifies where structural significance exists within the race.

3. Character

Character represents the behavioral orientation of a horse derived from historical patterns. - Linear: predictable, stable but fragile under strain. - Drift: inconsistent or directionally variable behavior. - Underdog: overlooked or late-developing performance potential. Character does not predict outcomes; it indicates how a horse behaves under different structural conditions.

4. Pressure

Pressure is a numerical value that measures the structural strain or relief acting on a horse today. It is derived from past performance, weight carried, distance alignment, gate position, class expectations, and other proprietary variables. Positive Pressure (+): structural strain. - Common in Linear horses. - Early strength, late weakness. - Requires strong class support to avoid breakdown. Negative Pressure (-): structural relief. - Efficient energy use. - Strong late-race retention. - Often results in placement consistency. Pressure identifies where today's operational load is concentrated.

5. Leverage

Leverage is a numerical measure showing whether a horse is being promoted or demoted relative to its historical performance profile. Positive Leverage (+): elevated above baseline; supportive scenario. Negative Leverage (-): below baseline; structural resistance. Leverage does not forecast performance — it contextualizes how today's conditions compare to prior operating environments.

6. What a System Signal Means

A highlighted horse has triggered a Signal, meaning: - It meets structural criteria across Character, Pressure, and Leverage. - It holds informational importance in today's data harvest. - Its outcome clarifies system behavior. Signals reveal where to look — not what to choose.

7. Purpose of the Framework

The System Framework exists to: - expose structural design, - identify significant runners, - diagnose mispriced favourites, - map pressure distribution, - provide situational clarity. This is structural analysis — not traditional handicapping.
