George Washington served as the first U.S. President from 1789 to 1797 and is known as the 'Father of His Country.'

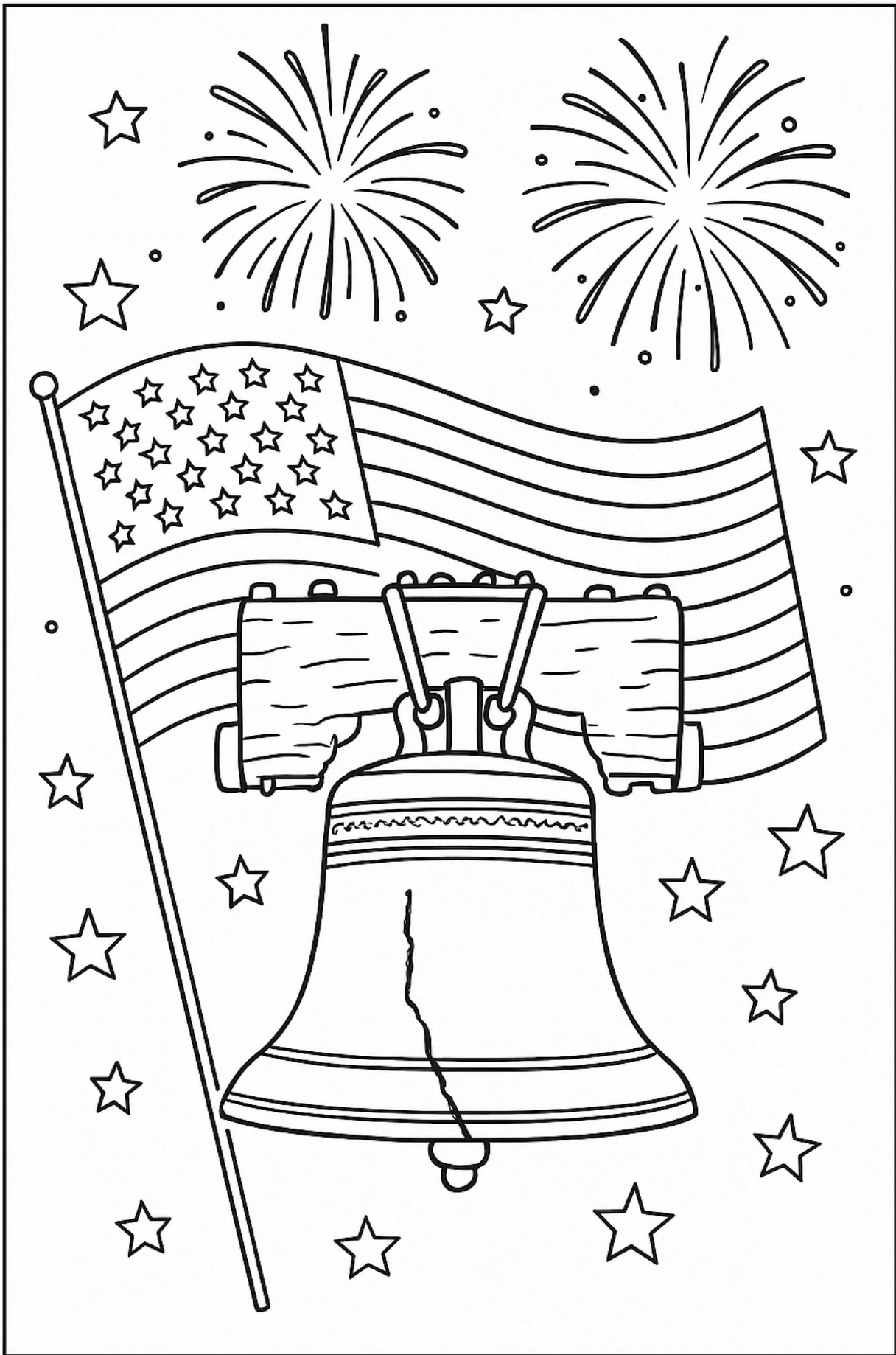


What is the significance of July 4th?
