

Easy Breezy Color (Color Wheel)



My Suggested Painting Supplies

As you set sail on your **Art@Sea Easy Breezy Color** painting journey; here are the supplies I recommend. I may use slightly different shades of red, yellow, or blue—my own favorites—but your starter kit if you decide to purchase will work beautifully also. As you continue painting, you can gradually add new colors and tools that reflect your unique artistic style.

- **Starter Kit** – a wonderful way to start and save a little! The ten colors included mix into a sea of gorgeous new hues.

✿ Paint

Golden Paints are my favorite and most highly recommended for their beautiful quality and rich, vibrant color. That said, you can use any good acrylics you have on hand; they will work fine! I especially love **Golden Fluid Acrylics** because of their smooth consistency and strong pigmentation, and I have linked a few size options for convenience.

If you are just starting out, try the **1-ounce bottles** first to see which colors you enjoy most. For larger paintings, it is worth investing in bigger sizes. I also suggest getting **Titanium White** and your favorite **underpainting wash color** in a generous size—you will find yourself using those two more than anything else.

Fluid Acrylics by Golden There are several different sizes linked. Choose the best size for you. These are the paint colors I used in my version of this color wheel:

- **Titanium White** – needed often to create different tints of a color or hue.

- **Phthalo Blue (Green Shade)** – a little goes a long way with Phthalo colors, so smaller sizes are plenty to keep on hand.

Canvas - choose one below

I mostly use Canva Paper because I paint in small spaces and the results are great.

- **Canson Canva Paper** - I love this as a canvas for many reasons and recommend it for acrylic artists. It is inexpensive, impressive results, wonderful for small space painting, & can be matted and framed. My favorite size is 9x12 and what I used for this tutorial.

- **Gessobord** - (another fave) smooth pre-primed with gesso smooth surface for acrylic.

Brushes: I recommend a 1-inch flat for wash, a couple of smaller flats, and a detail brush. For a looser style, use a long handle. Try out different brushes until you find out what works for you. I have linked two inexpensive assorted pack with several flats, and other shapes to experiment with.

Water Cup x2

One cup to get most paint off and 2nd for clean rinse.

Any cup will do but nice to have a lid. They are no longer carrying the cups I use with lids, but I found this collapsible one that also holds brushes. I am also linking one designed to be spill proof for kids. I have not tried either so cannot speak personally for either.

Palette

I love the Sta Wet Palette which is linked here. It is great for keeping acrylics wet for more than one paint session. That said, it is not necessary for beginners as you can use a paper plate as your palette.

Golden Satin Glazing

Great tool for layering acrylics, promotes flow and extends acrylic drying time, makes paint color more translucent, seals layers. Glazing - allows for smooth blending and layered glazing techniques.

Art Color Theory Tools on a Lanyard

Reference Color Wheel, Gray Scale Value Card, Plein Air Composition Viewfinder, Tape Measure all on a convenient lanyard. Helpful. Useful.

Gesso

Works as a primer on surfaces to use as canvas, so you don't waste paint soaking into the substrate such as wood. All Canvas recommended above are already primed, but other canvas might need priming. It can also be used to cover a painting you do not like and begin again. Not necessary when beginning unless painting a non-primed surface such as raw wood.
