Before You Begin

Universal Abbreviations

These abbreviations are used throughout all patterns in this book:

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **hdc** = Half Double Crochet
- **dc** = Double Crochet
- **tr** = Treble Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

Stitch counts are shown in brackets [like this] at the end of each round.

Skill Level Guide

INTERMEDIATE You should be comfortable with:

- Basic crochet stitches (sc, inc, dec)
- Working in the round with a magic ring
- Reading written patterns
- Attaching multiple parts together
- Simple color changes

ADVANCED In addition to intermediate skills, you should be comfortable with:

- Working with multiple yarn types and hook sizes
- Complex assembly techniques

- Creating decorative edges and embellishments
- Following longer, multi-part patterns
- Working with smaller details

General Materials Overview

Yarn

Most patterns in this book use **milk cotton yarn (4-ply)** which creates soft, durable amigurumi perfect for display or gifting. The Cupcake Turtle uses plush yarn for added texture.

Hook Sizes

- **3.0 mm** - For small decorative details
- **3.5 mm** - Main hook for most patterns
- **4.5 mm** - For plush yarn projects

Other Essentials

- **Safety eyes** (5mm, 8mm, or 10mm depending on pattern)
- **Fiberfill stuffing** - Use quality stuffing for best results
- **Tapestry needle** - For sewing parts and weaving in ends
- **Scissors** - Sharp scissors for clean cuts
- **Stitch markers** - Helpful for tracking rounds (optional but recommended)

Tips for Success

Before Starting

1. **Read the entire pattern** before beginning to familiarize yourself with the construction process
2. **Gather all materials** to avoid interruptions mid-project
3. **Check your tension** - If your stitches are too loose, size down your hook; if too tight, size up

While Crocheting

1. **Use a stitch marker** to mark the beginning of each round - this prevents losing your place
2. **Count your stitches** at the end of each round to ensure accuracy
3. **Stuff as you go** - It's easier to stuff parts before closing them completely
4. **Don't overstuff** - Firm stuffing is good, but overstuffing can distort the shape

Assembly Tips

1. **Pin parts in place** before sewing to ensure proper positioning
2. **Use the same yarn color** as the part you're attaching for invisible seams
3. **Take your time** - Proper assembly makes a huge difference in the final appearance
4. **Secure eyes carefully** - Make sure safety eyes are firmly attached before giving to children

Finishing Touches

1. **Weave in all ends** securely to prevent unraveling
2. **Shape your turtle** gently with your hands after stuffing
3. **Add personality** with eye and mouth placement - slight changes create different expressions
4. **Block if needed** - Lightly steam or wet block for a polished finish

Understanding Pattern Instructions

Attachment Instructions

When a pattern says "attach the head while working Round 2," this means:

1. Place the part (head, leg, etc.) on the **outside** of the shell
2. Insert your hook through the part **first**
3. Then insert through the designated stitch on the shell

4. Complete the single crochet as normal

This technique creates a secure attachment while you work.

Color Changes

When switching colors:

1. Work the last stitch of the old color until 2 loops remain on hook
2. Yarn over with the new color and pull through both loops
3. Continue with the new color
4. Weave in the old color tail later

Stuffing Guidelines

- **Head:** Stuff firmly for a rounded shape
- **Shell/Body:** Stuff very firmly to maintain structure
- **Legs/Flippers:** Stuff lightly or leave unstuffed for flexibility
- **Tail:** Stuff lightly or leave unstuffed

Ready to Begin?

You're all set! Choose your favorite turtle pattern and let's get started. Remember, amigurumi is meant to be fun, so don't stress about perfection. Each handmade turtle will have its own unique charm!

PATTERN 1: BEE TURTLE

Skill Level: Intermediate

This pattern requires familiarity with basic crochet stitches (such as single crochet, increase, and decrease), working in the round, switching yarn colors, and attaching multiple parts together.

Finished Size: Approximately 10 cm (4 inches)

Size may vary depending on yarn thickness, hook size, and your individual tension.





MATERIALS

Yarn:

Milk cotton yarn (4-ply) in:

- Yellow
- Black
- Off-white
- White

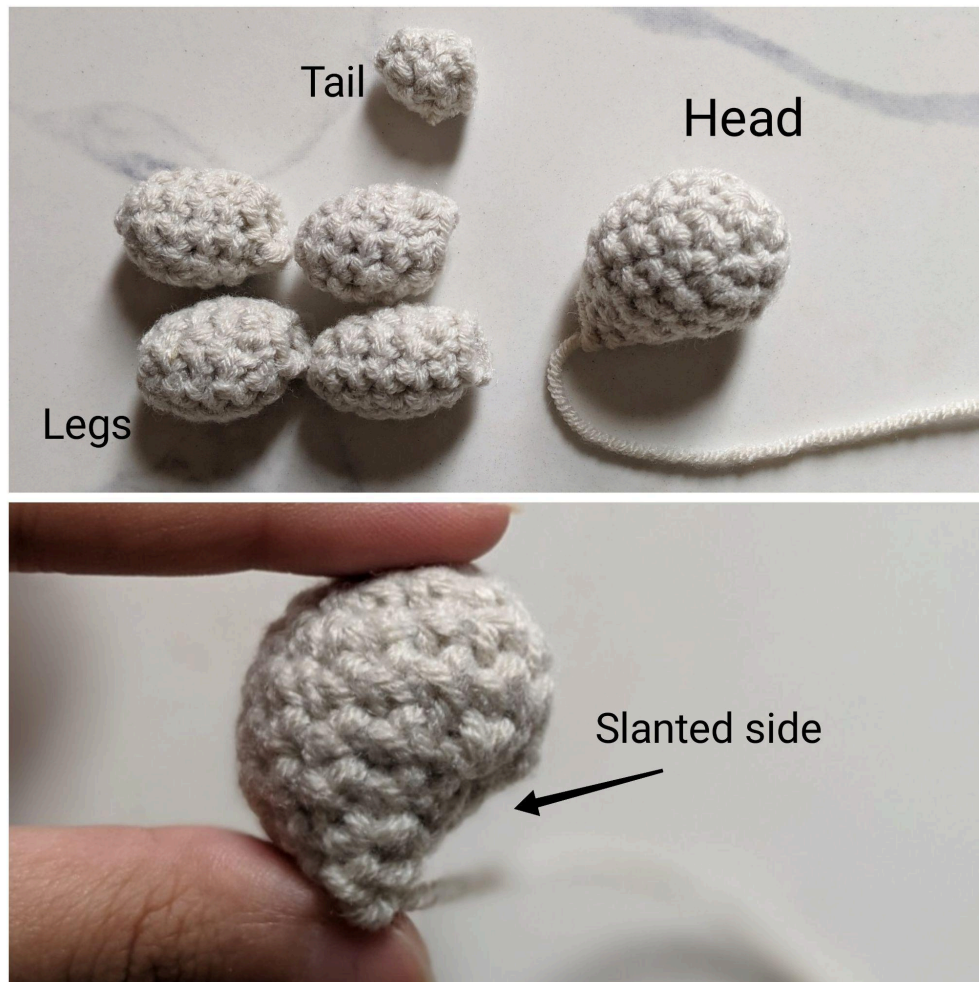
Other Supplies:

- 3.5 mm crochet hook
- 5 mm safety eyes (or small black beads)
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS



HEAD (OFF-WHITE YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (3 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [15]
- **R4–R5:** sc around [15]
- **R6:** 3 dec, 9 sc [12]
 - *Stuff with fiberfill*
- **R7:** 6 dec [6]
- **R8:** 6 sc [6]

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, leave a long tail for adjusting the head later, and cut yarn.

Note: When attaching, make sure the slanted side faces downward (this will be the bottom of the head).

LEGS (MAKE 4) (OFF-WHITE YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [9]
- **R3–R5:** sc around [9]
 - *Stuff lightly with fiberfill*
- **R6:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3 [6]

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, cut yarn, and weave in the tail.

TAIL (OFF-WHITE YARN)

- **R1:** 3 sc in MR [3]
- **R2:** 3 inc [6]
- **R3–R4:** sc around [6]
 - *Stuffing optional*

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, cut yarn, and weave in the tail.

UPPER SHELL

Start with yellow yarn

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]

Switch to black yarn

- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]

- **R4:** 3 inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc [24]

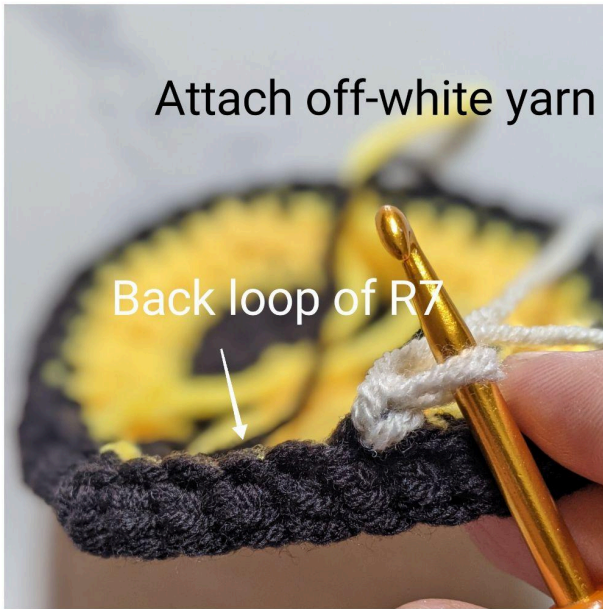
Switch to yellow yarn

- **R5:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3, 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3, 6 sc [30]
- **R6:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 3, 6 sc, (2 sc, 1 inc) × 3, 6 sc [36]

Switch to black yarn

- **R7:** sc around [36]
- **R8:** FLO, sc around [36]

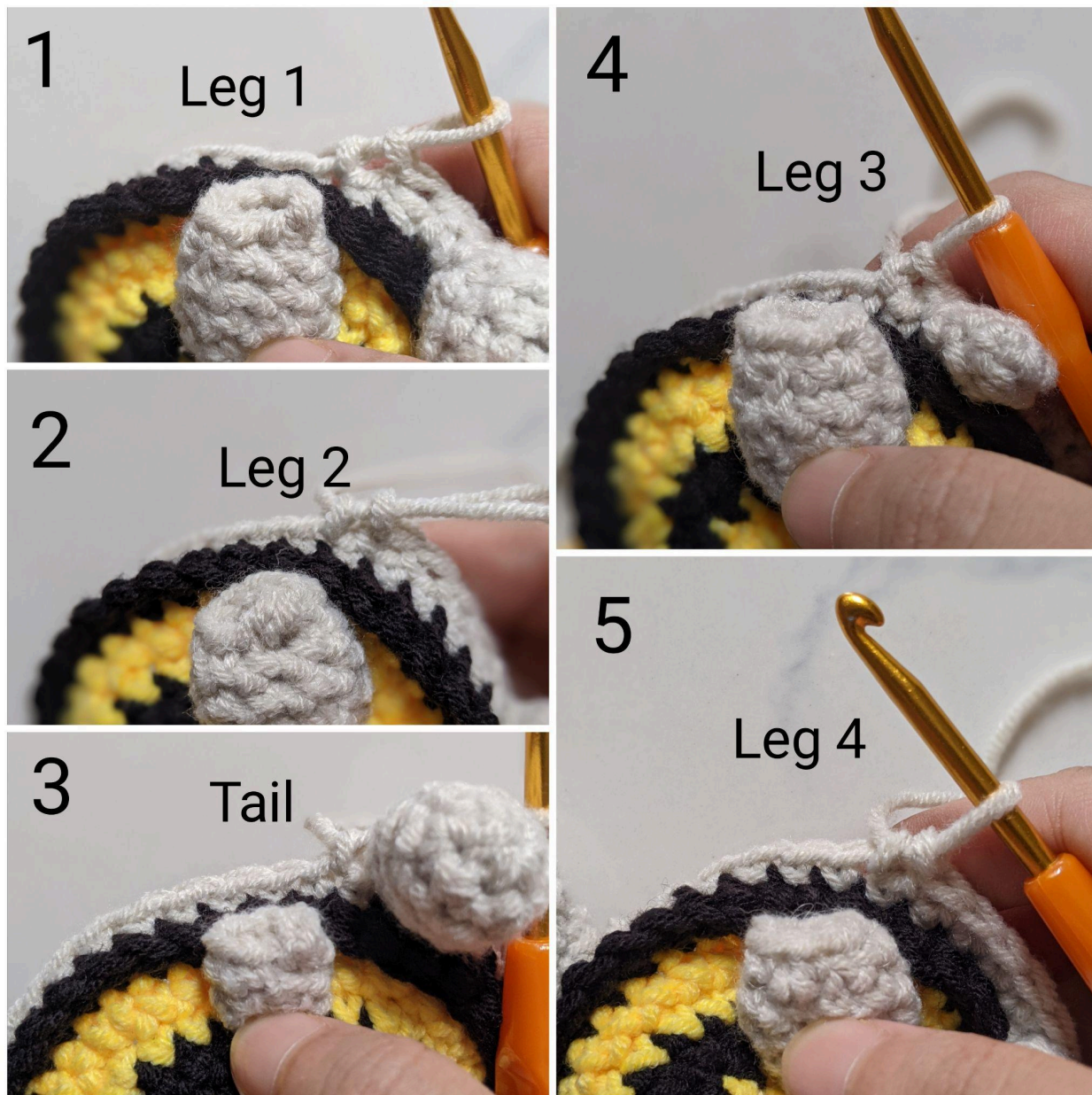
Fasten off, cut yarn and hide the tail.



LOWER SHELL

Attach off-white yarn to the **back loop** of Round 7 of the upper shell.

- **R1:** BLO, sc around [36]
- **R2:** While working Round 2, attach the head and flippers. Place each part on the **outside** of the shell. Insert the hook through the part first, then through the back loop of the shell, and complete the sc.



Placement order (36 stitches total):

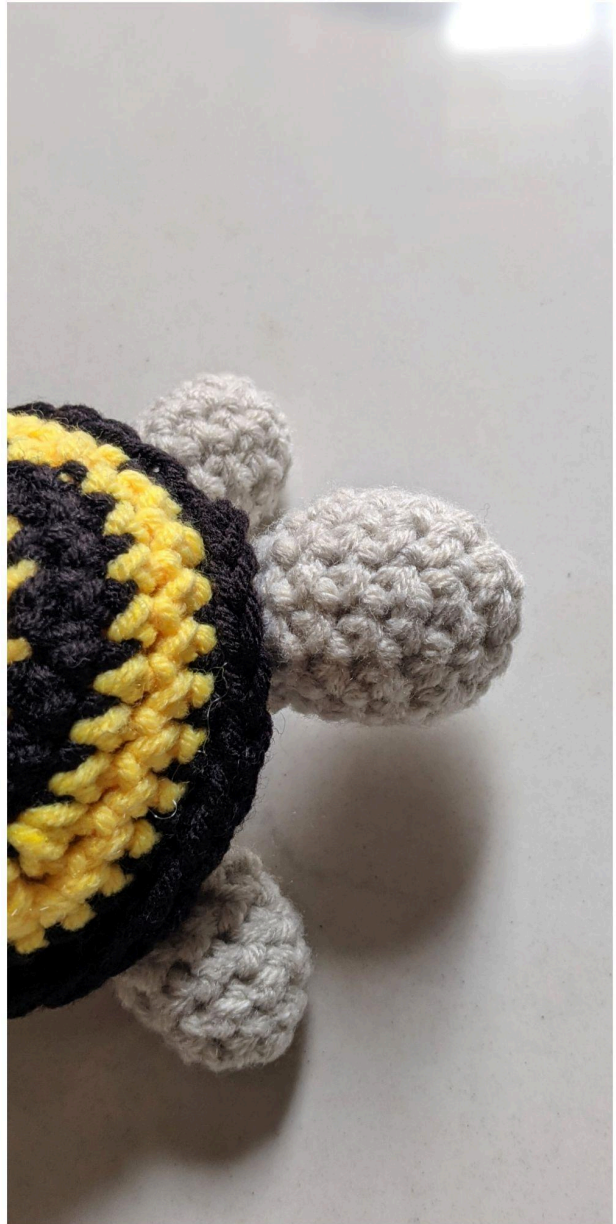
2 sc, 3 sc attaching the head, 2 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 6 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 1 sc, 3 sc attaching the tail, 1 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 6 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg [36]

- **R3:** (2 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc, (2 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc [30]
- **R4:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc [24]



- **R5:** 3 dec, 6 sc, 3 dec, 6 sc [18]
 - *Stuff firmly*
- **R6:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [12]
- **R7:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off, then close the gap by weaving through the **front loops only** of the remaining 6 stitches. Pull tight to close, and weave in the tail.



Use the long tail to adjust the head by sewing the back of the head to the top shell.

Wings

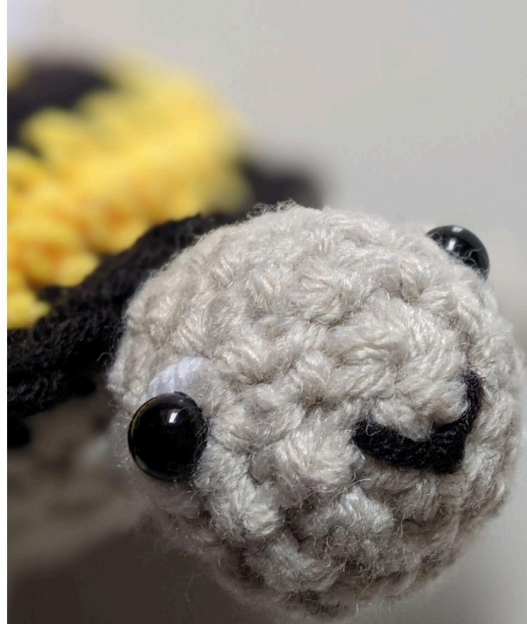
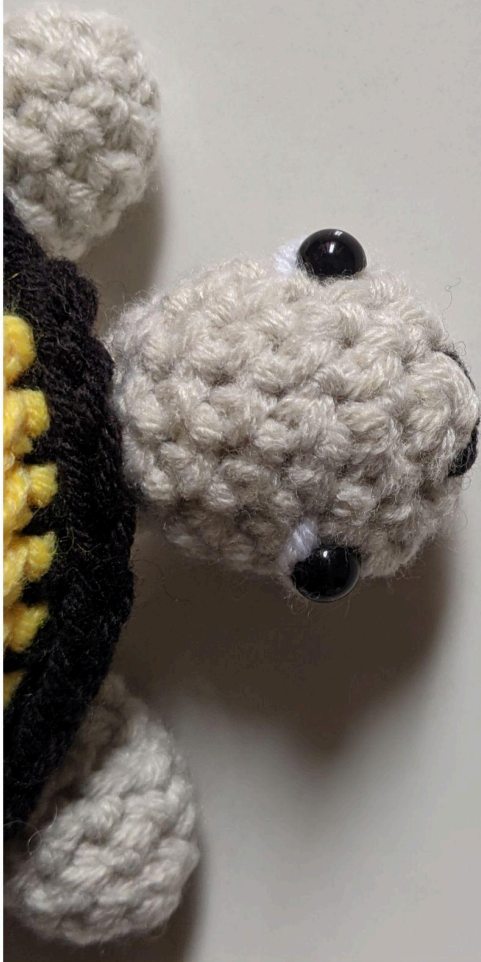


WINGS (MAKE 2) (OFF-WHITE YARN)

- **R1:** 7 sc in MR [7]
- **R2:** 7 inc [14]

Fasten off, cut the yarn. Attach them on top of the shell with glue, and hide the tails.

Attach eyes and embroider small mouth



FINISHING TOUCHES

- Attach the safety eyes in your preferred position
- Embroider a small mouth using black yarn
- Add a tiny white highlight on each eye with white yarn

PATTERN 2: STRAWBERRY TURTLE

Skill Level: Intermediate

This pattern requires familiarity with basic crochet stitches (such as single crochet, increase, and decrease), working in the round, and attaching multiple parts together.

Finished Size: Approximately 11.5 cm (4.5 inches)

Size may vary depending on yarn thickness, hook size, and your individual tension.





MATERIALS

Yarn:

Milk cotton yarn (4-ply) in:

- Red
- Green
- Dusty pink
- Black
- White

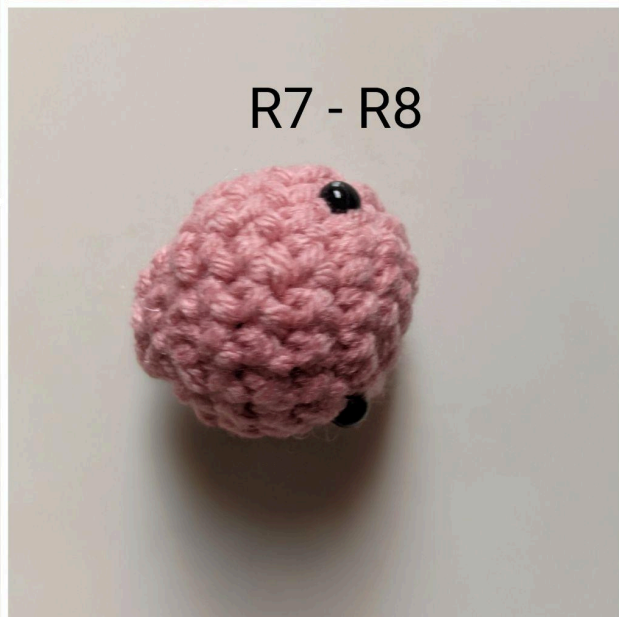
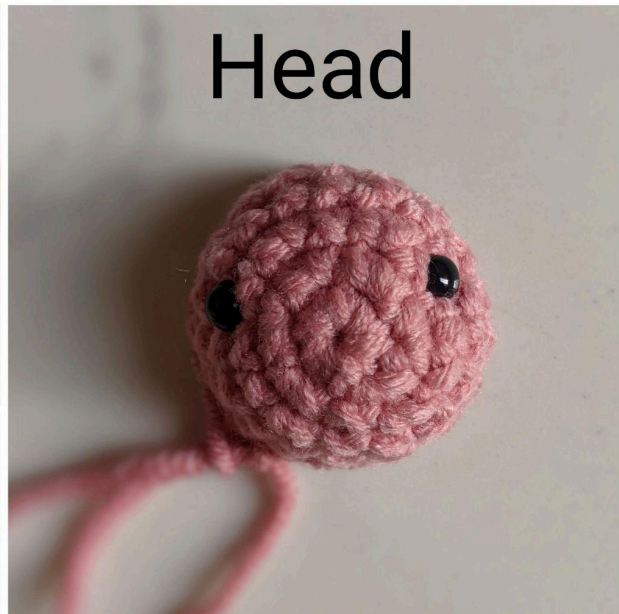
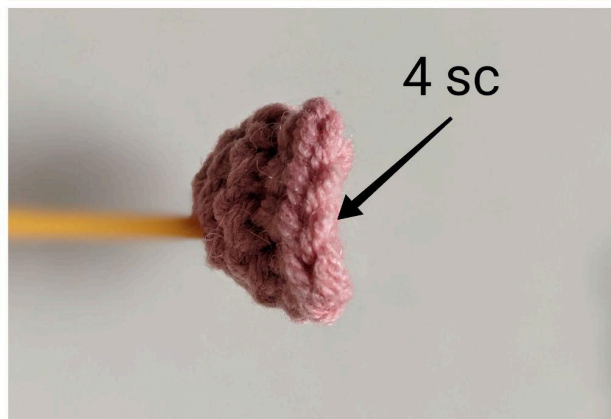
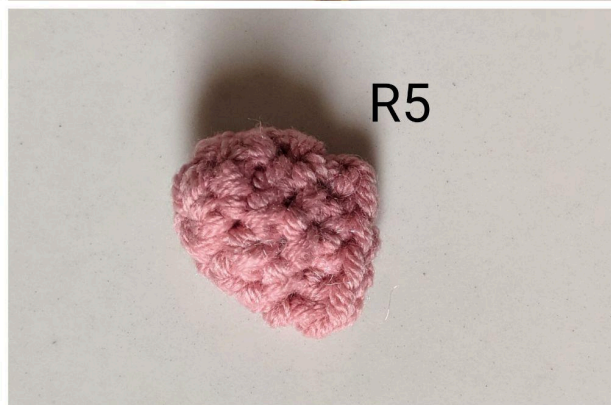
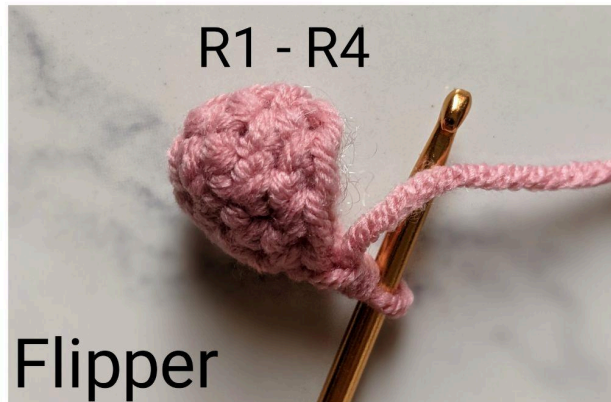
Other Supplies:

- 3.5 mm crochet hook
- 5 mm safety eyes (or small black beads)
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS



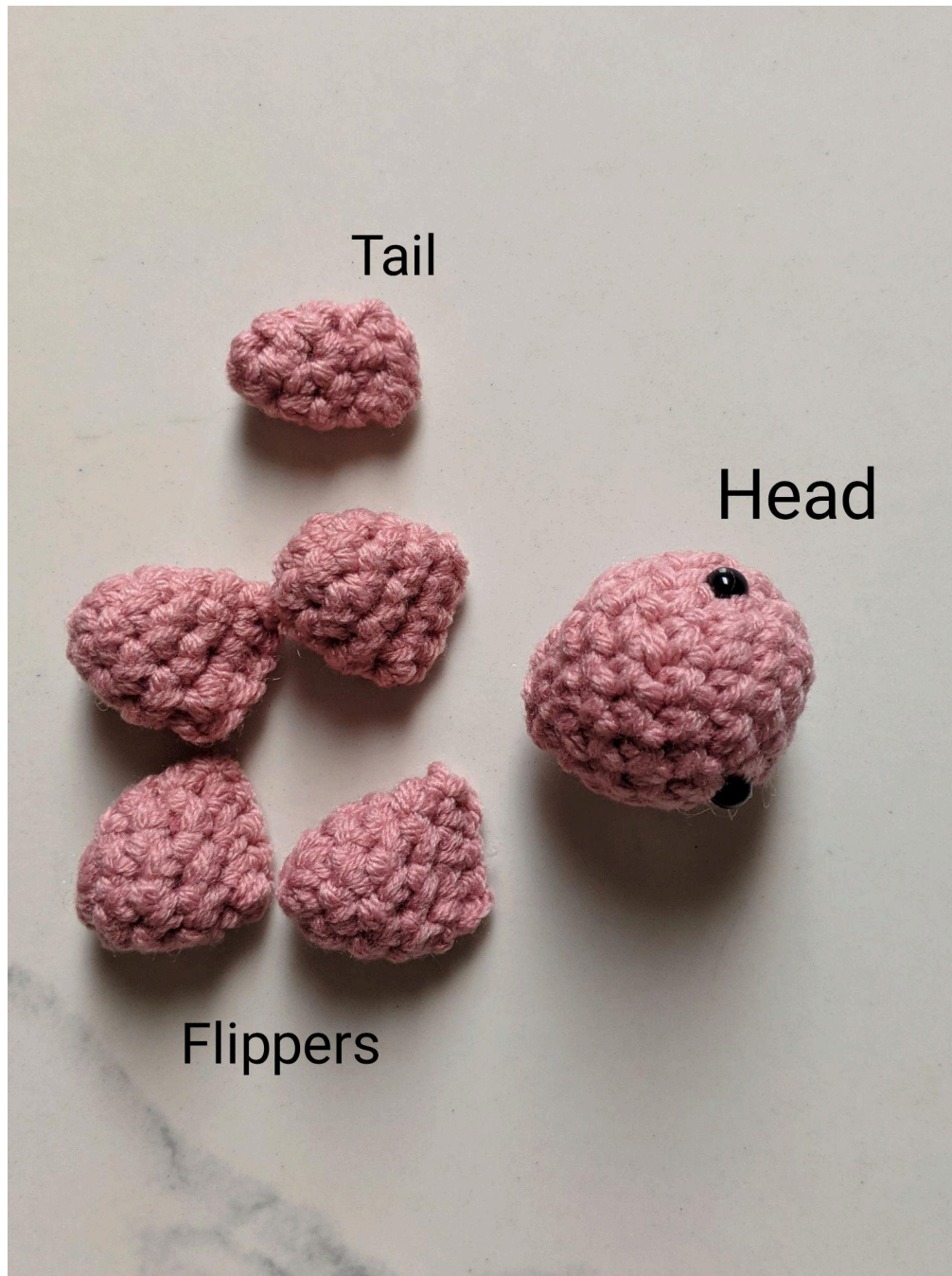
HEAD (DUSTY PINK YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4–R6:** sc around [18]

Insert safety eyes between Rounds 3 and 4, approximately 7 stitches apart.
Stuff the head lightly.

- **R7:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [12]
- **R8:** 6 dec [6]

Do not close the gap. Fasten off and weave in the end.



FLIPPERS (MAKE 4, DUSTY PINK YARN)

- **R1:** 8 sc in MR [8]
- **R2–R4:** sc around [8]

Stuff lightly. Fold the flipper in half and crochet across both sides with 4 sc. See picture. Fasten off and weave in the end.

TAIL (DUSTY PINK YARN)

- **R1:** 3 sc in MR [3]
- **R2:** 3 inc [6]
- **R3–R4:** sc around [6]

Stuff lightly (optional).

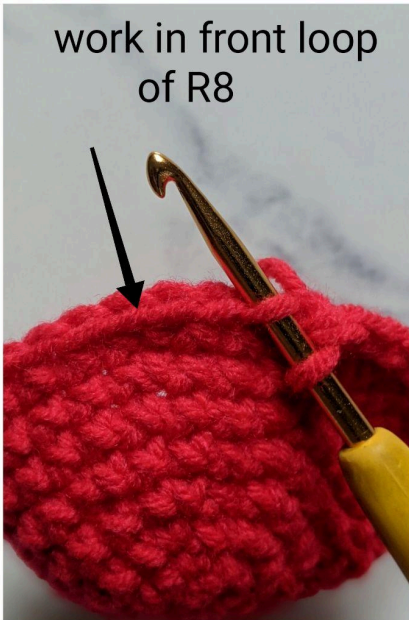
- **R5:** Fold tail and sc across both sides [3]

Fasten off and weave in the end.

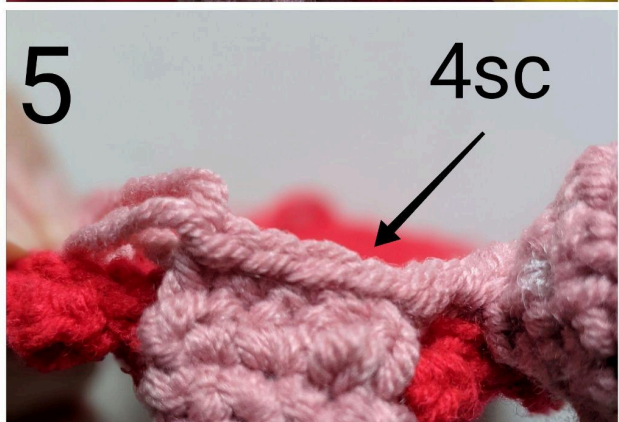
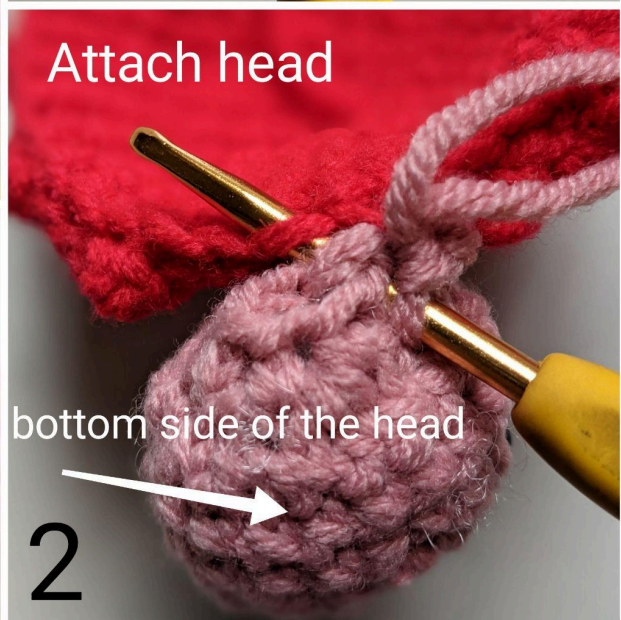
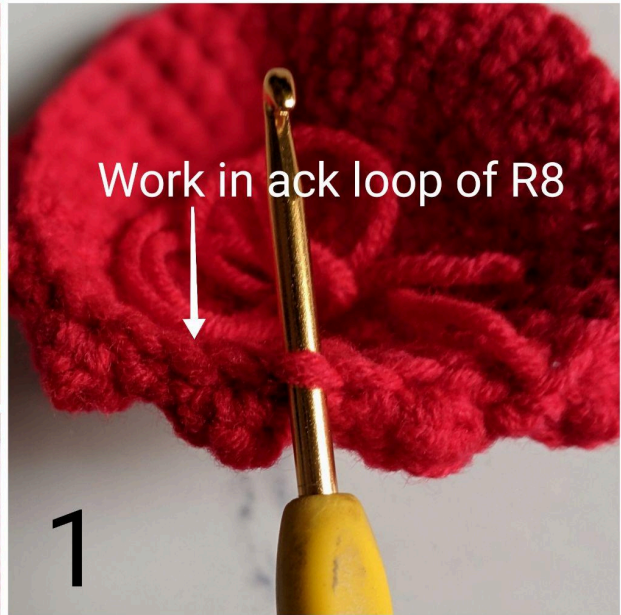
- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [24]
- **R5:** (3 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [30]
- **R6:** sc around [30]
- **R7:** (4 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [36]

- **R8:** sc around [36]

SHELL EDGE

- **R9:** FLO, {sl st, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 sc), sl st} × 12 [60]

Fasten off and weave in the end.



BOTTOM SHELL (DUSTY PINK YARN)

Attach yarn to BLO of Round 8 of the upper shell. While working this round, attach the head and flippers. Place each part **outside** the shell.

Insert the hook through the part first, then through the back loop of the shell, and complete the sc.

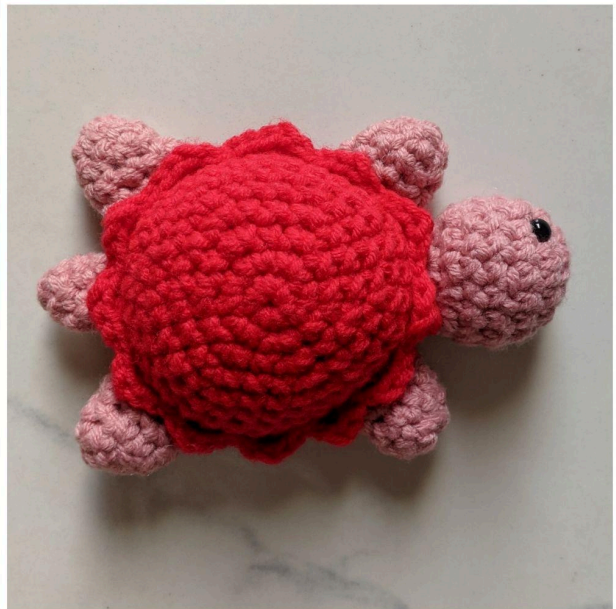

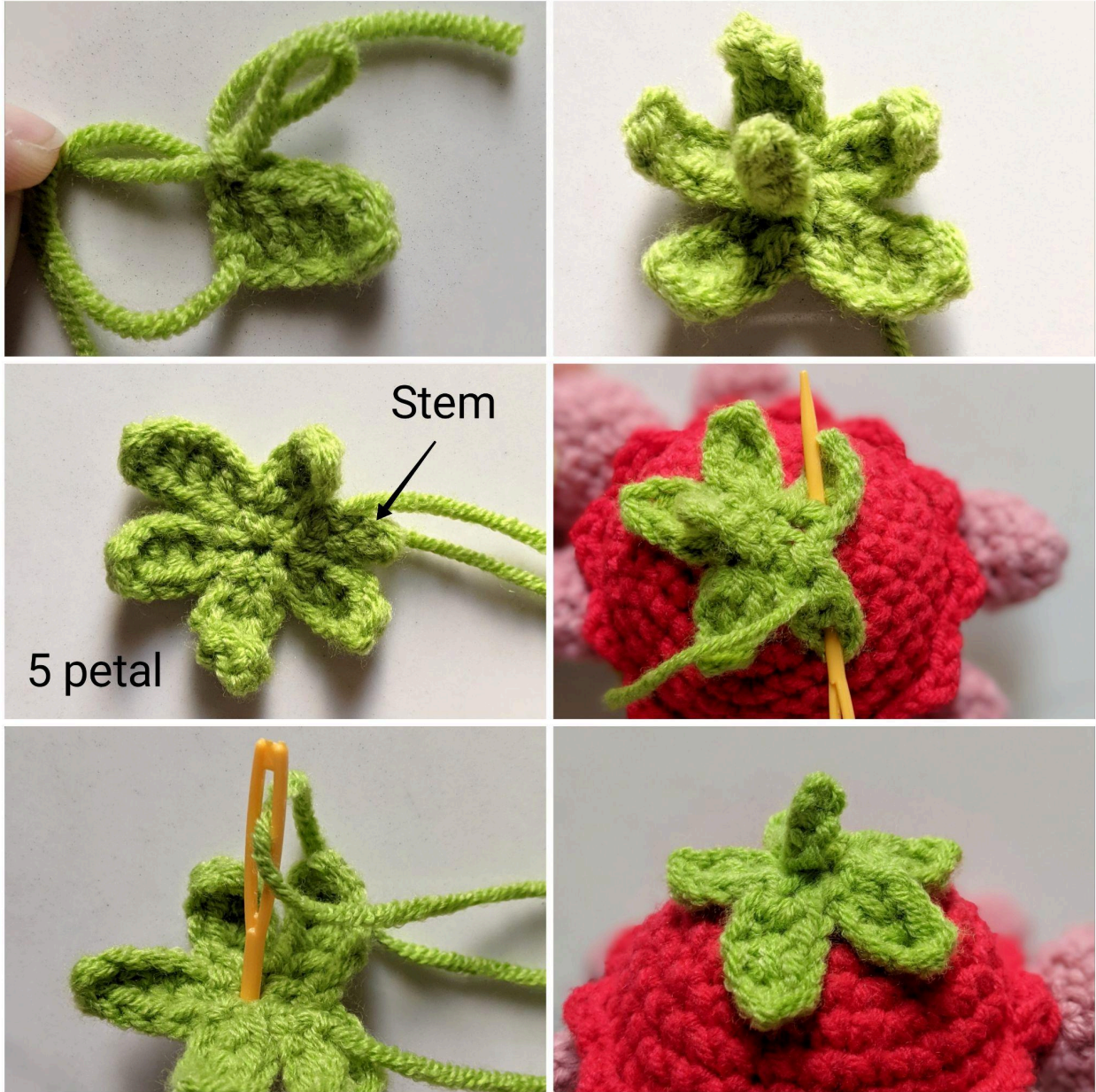
- **R2:** (2 sc, 1 dec, 2 sc) × 6 [30]
- **R3:** (3 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [24]
- **R4:** 12 dec [12]



Stuff with fiberfill.

- **R5: 6 dec [6]**

Fasten off, then close the gap by weaving through the front loops only of the remaining 6 stitches. Pull tight to close and hide tail.



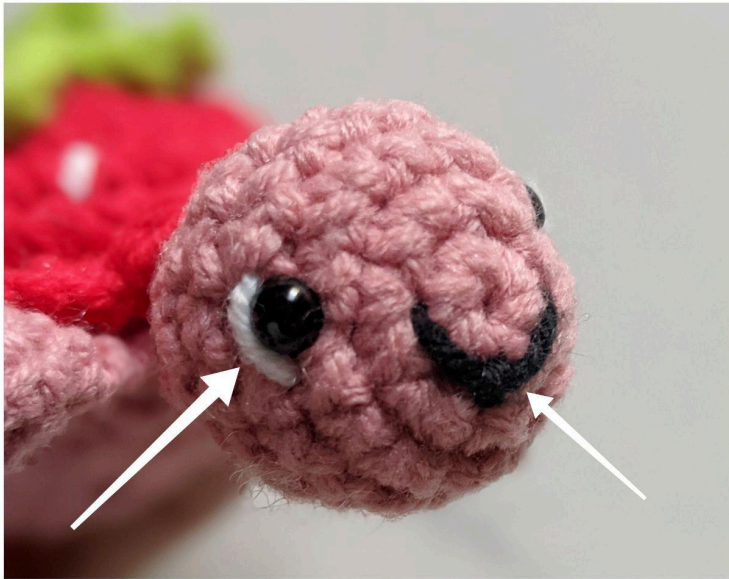
STRAWBERRY TOP (GREEN YARN)

Make a magic ring.

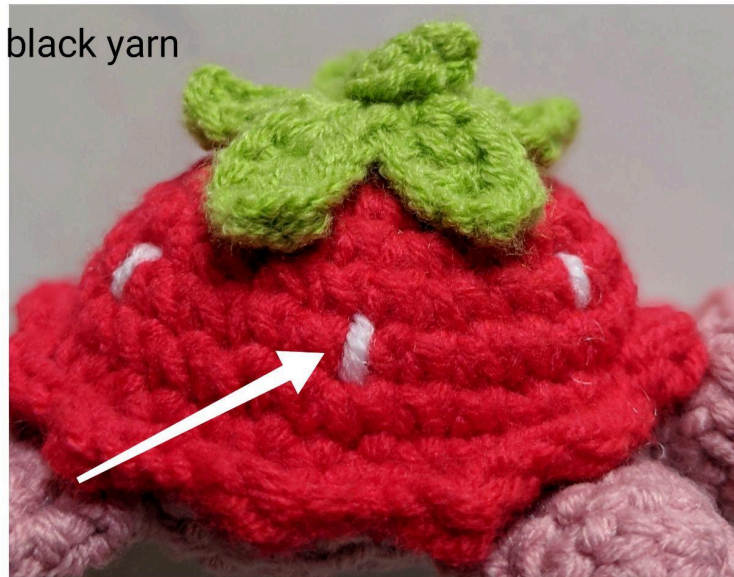
Repeat the following **5 times** into the MR: (ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc, dc, dc, sl st into MR)

Then: ch 5, skip the 5th ch, sl st into next 5 ch.

Cut the yarn and leave a long tail for sewing. Pull the long tail through the MR using a needle. Sew securely onto the center of the upper shell.



Add details using white, black yarn and needle



FINISHING TOUCHES

- Embroider a small mouth using black yarn
- Add a small white highlight on each eye with white yarn
- Stitch small white lines randomly on the red shell to resemble strawberry seeds

PATTERN 3: SUNFLOWER GARDEN TURTLE

Skill Level: Intermediate

This pattern requires familiarity with basic crochet stitches (such as single crochet, increase, and decrease), working in the round, and attaching multiple parts together.

Finished Size: Approximately 12 cm (5 inches)

Size may vary depending on yarn thickness, hook size, and your individual tension.





MATERIALS

Yarn:

Milk cotton yarn (4-ply) in:

- Dark brown
- Light green
- Yellow
- Black
- White

Other Supplies:

- Crochet hooks: 3.0 mm (for flower petals), 3.5 mm (for all other parts)
- 8 mm safety eyes (or small black beads)

- Fiberfill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

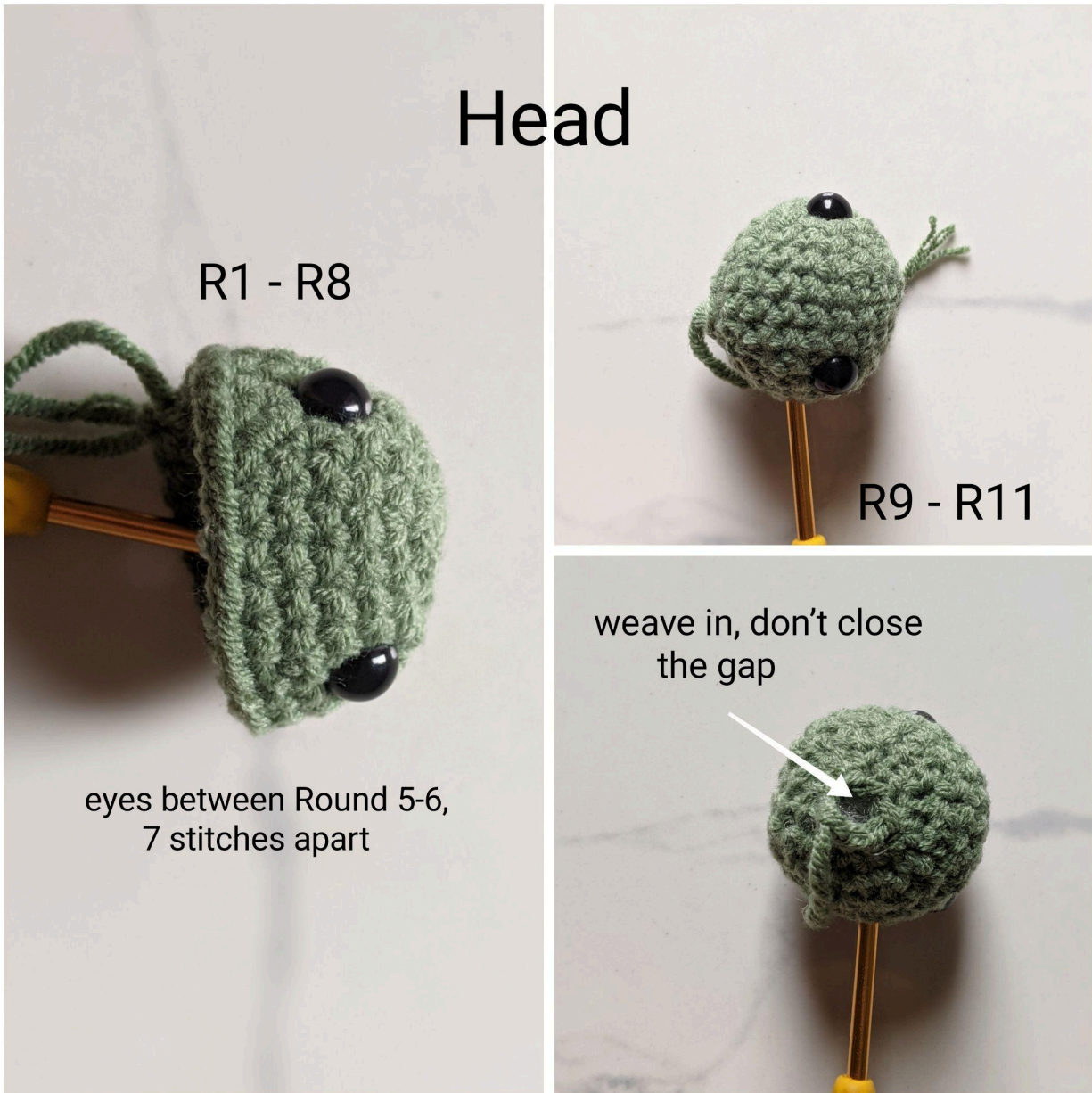
PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS



UPPER SHELL (DARK BROWN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [24]
- **R5:** (3 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [30]
- **R6:** sc around [30]
- **R7:** (4 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [36]
- **R8:** sc around [36]

Fasten off and weave in the end.



HEAD (LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [24]
- **R5–R8:** sc around [24]

Insert safety eyes between rounds 5–6, 7 stitches apart. Stuff the head lightly.

- **R9:** (2 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [18]
- **R10:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [12]
- **R11:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off and weave in the end.



FRONT FLIPPERS (MAKE 2, LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 8 sc in MR [8]
- **R2:** 8 inc [16]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 8 [24]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 8 [32]

Fold in half and work 16 sc across both layers. Fasten off and weave in the end.

BACK FLIPPERS (MAKE 2, LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 8 sc in MR [8]
- **R2:** 8 inc [16]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 8 [24]

Fold in half and work 12 sc across both layers. Do not stuff. Fasten off and weave in the end.

TAIL (LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2–R4:** sc around [6]

Fasten off and weave in the end.

BOTTOM SHELL (LIGHT GREEN YARN)



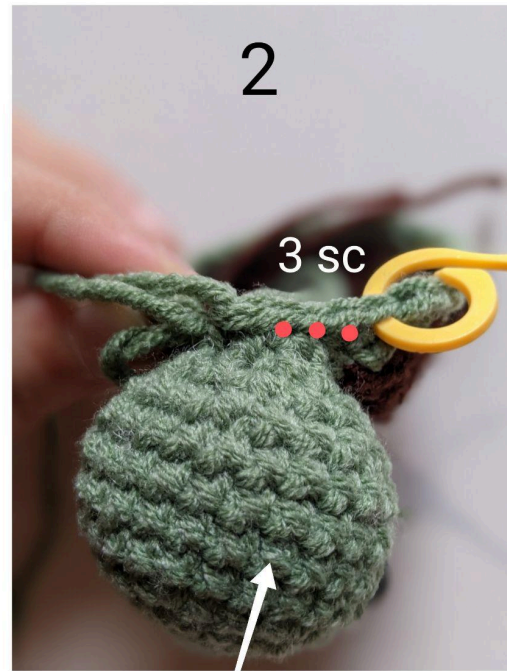
Attach yarn to the **BLO of Round 8** of the upper shell.

- **R1:** BLO, sc around [36]
- **R2:** While working this round, attach the head and flippers. Place the head/flippers outside the shell, insert the hook through the head/flipper first, then through the shell, and complete the single crochet. (See pictures)

Attaching Head

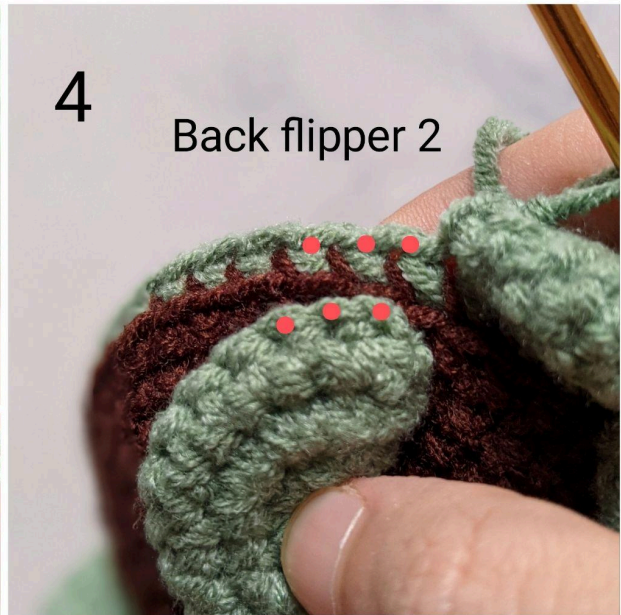
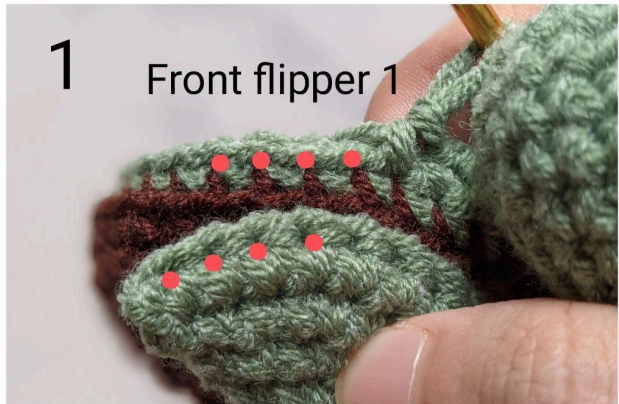


Go through both layers of the head first, then into the shell



Keep the bottom of the head facing you while attaching.

(Work in both loops)



2 sc, attach head with **3 sc**, **2 sc**, attach front flipper with **4 sc**, **6 sc**, attach back flipper with **3 sc**, attach tail with **3 sc**, attach back flipper with **3 sc**, **6 sc**, attach front flipper with **4 sc** [36]



R3 - R6

Close the gap with a needle going through the front loops

- **R3:** (2 sc, 1 dec, 2 sc) × 6 [30]
- **R4:** (3 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [24]
- **R5:** 12 dec [12]

Stuff with fiberfill.

- **R6:** 6 dec [6]



Fasten off, then close the gap by weaving through the front loops only of the remaining 6 stitches. Pull tight to close and hide tail.



FLOWER PETALS (YELLOW YARN, USE 3.0 MM HOOK)

Attach yellow yarn to the **FLO of Round 8** of the shell.

Repeat the following pattern around: ch 2, (1 dc, 1 tr, **peacock stitch**, 1 tr, 1 dc) in the next st, ch 2, sl st in the next st.

Fasten off and weave in the end.

Peacock Stitch: ch 2, sl st into the back bump of the first ch.



FINISHING TOUCHES

- Embroider a small mouth with black yarn
- Add a tiny white highlight on each eye with white yarn

PATTERN 4: CHRISTMAS TURTLE

Skill Level: Intermediate

This pattern requires familiarity with basic crochet stitches (such as single crochet, increase, and decrease), working in the round, switching yarn colors, and attaching multiple parts together.

Finished Size: Approximately 10 cm (4 inches)

Size may vary depending on yarn thickness, hook size, and your individual tension.





MATERIALS

Yarn:

Milk cotton yarn (4-ply) in:

- Dark green
- Light green
- Red

- Black
- White

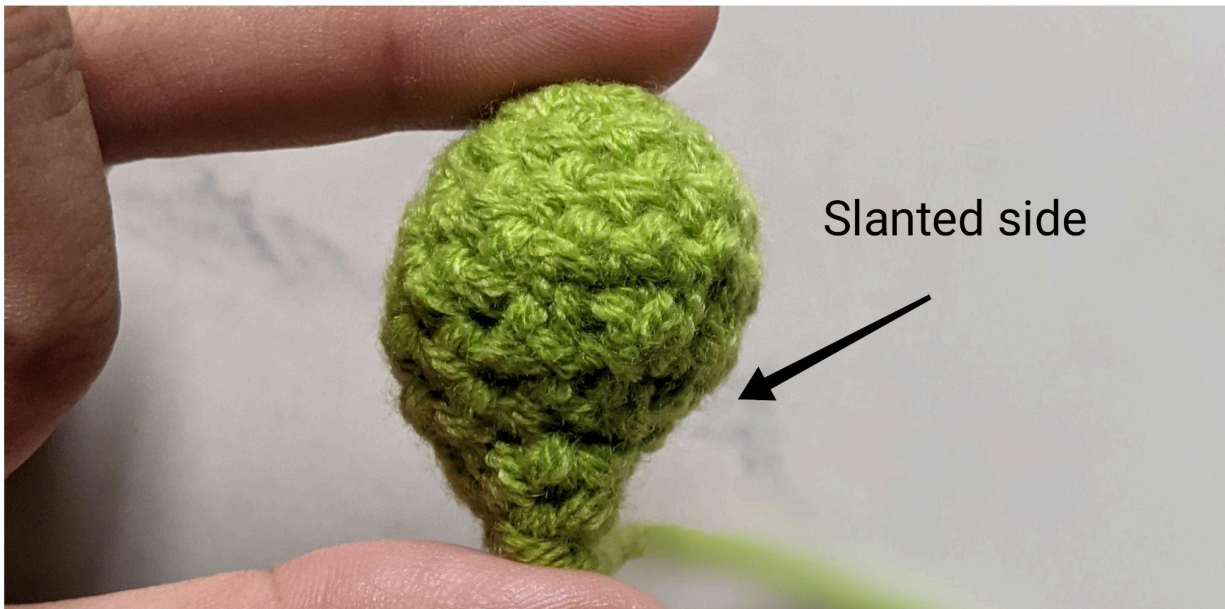
Other Supplies:

- 3.5 mm crochet hook
- 5 mm safety eyes (or small black beads)
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **hdc** = Half Double Crochet
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS



HEAD (LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (3 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [15]
- **R4–R5:** sc around [15]
- **R6:** 3 dec, 9 sc [12]

- *Stuff with fiberfill*
- **R7:** 6 dec [6]
- **R8:** 6 sc [6]

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, leave a long tail for adjusting the head later, and cut yarn.

Note: When attaching, make sure the slanted side faces downward (this will be the bottom of the head).

LEGS (MAKE 4) (LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [9]
- **R3–R5:** sc around [9]
 - *Stuff lightly with fiberfill*
- **R6:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3 [6]

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, cut yarn, and weave in the tail.

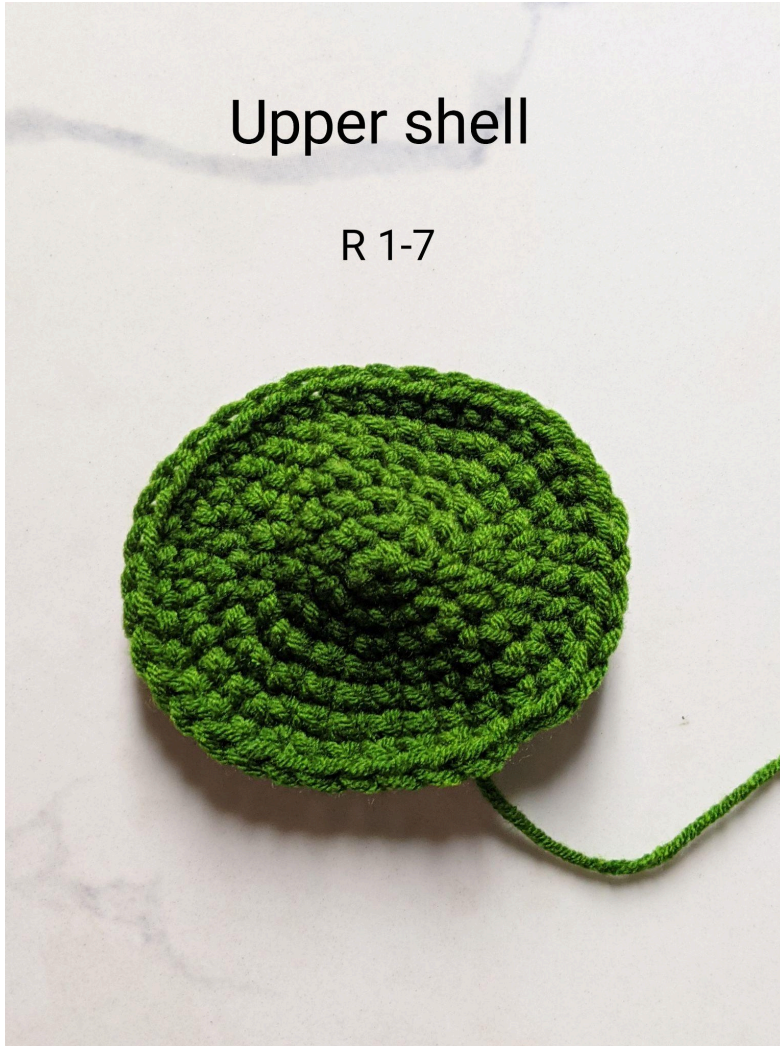
TAIL (LIGHT GREEN YARN)

- **R1:** 3 sc in MR [3]
- **R2:** 3 inc [6]
- **R3–R4:** sc around [6]
 - *Stuffing optional*

Do not close the gap. Fasten off, cut yarn, and weave in the tail.

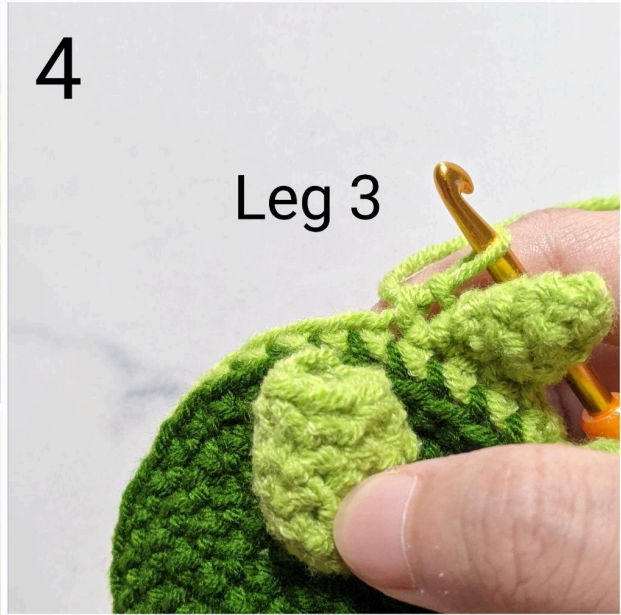
Fasten off, cut yarn and hide the tail.



LOWER SHELL

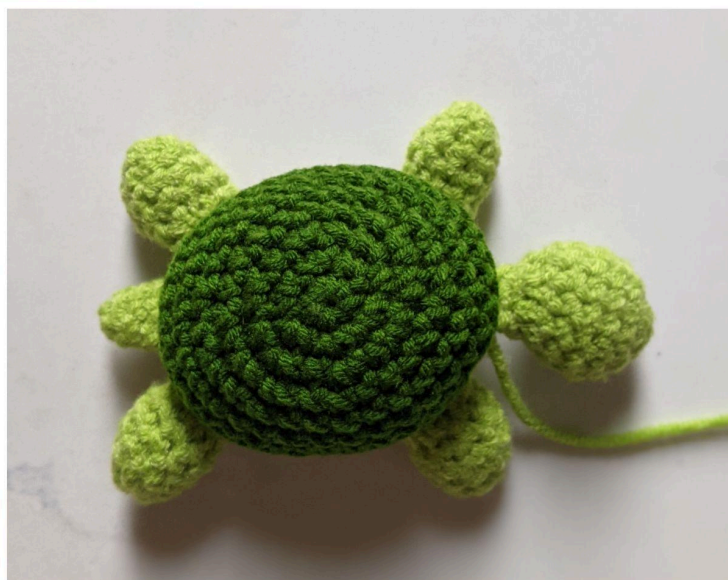
Attach light green yarn to the **back loop** of Round 7 of the upper shell.

- **R1:** BLO, sc around [36]
- **R2:** While working Round 2, attach the head and flippers. Place each part on the outside of the shell. Insert the hook through the part first, then through the back loop of the shell, and complete the sc.



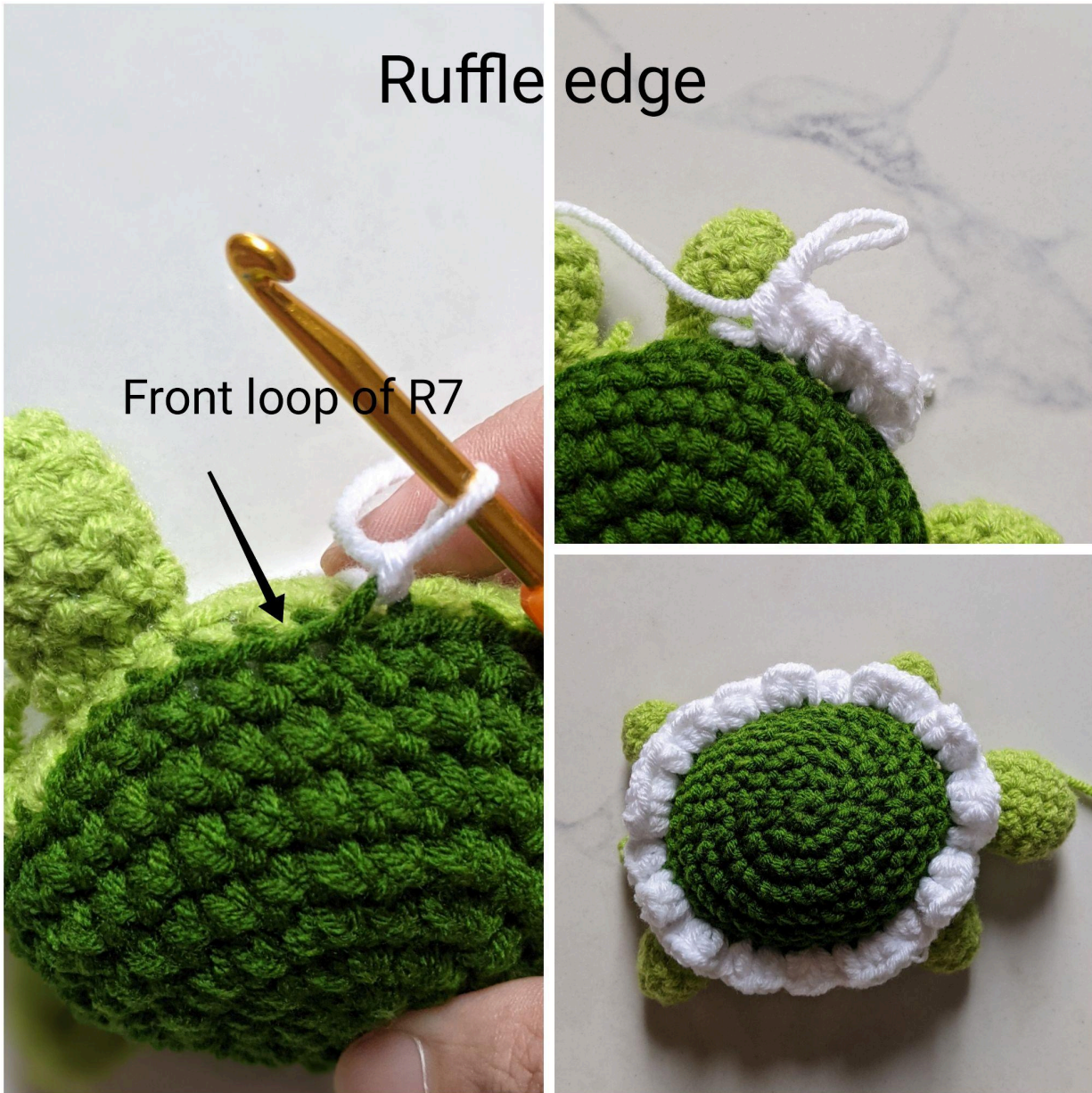
Placement order (36 stitches total):

2 sc, 3 sc attaching the head, 2 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 6 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 1 sc, 3 sc attaching the tail, 1 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg, 6 sc, 3 sc attaching a leg [36]



- **R3:** (2 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc, (2 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc [30]
- **R4:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc, (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3, 6 sc [24]
- **R5:** 3 dec, 6 sc, 3 dec, 6 sc [18]
 - *Stuff firmly*
- **R6:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [12]
- **R7:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off, then close the gap by weaving through the **front loops only** of the remaining 6 stitches. Pull tight to close, and weave in the tail.

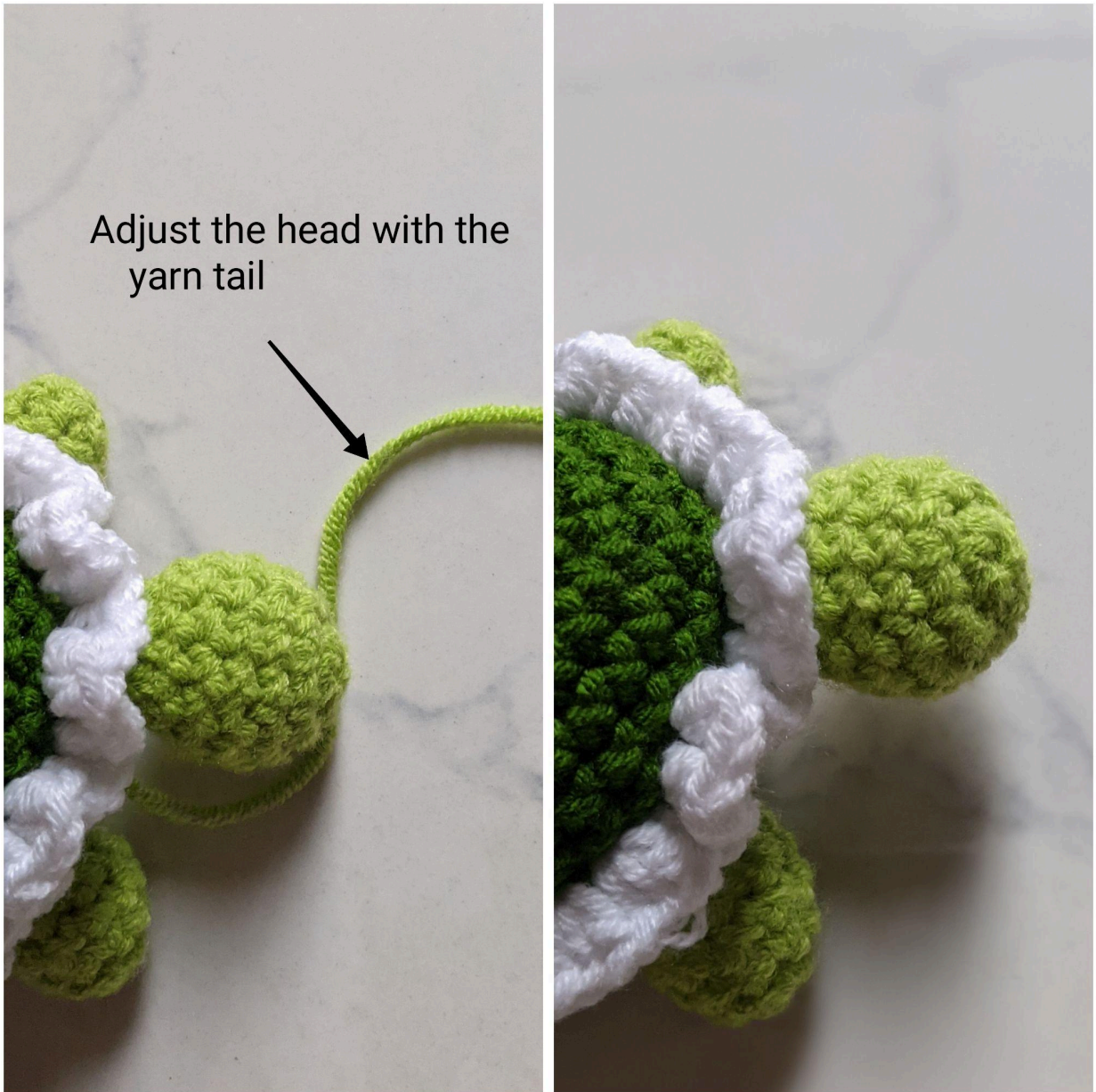


RUFFLE EDGE

Attach white yarn on the front loop of round 7.

Do 3 hdc in each front loop of the round.

Cut yarn and hide the tail.



Use the long tail to adjust the head by sewing the back of the head to the top shell.



Add detail on upper shell. Take two strands of white yarn and add white details in upper shell with a needle.

SANTA HAT

Start with white yarn

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [9]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 3 [6]

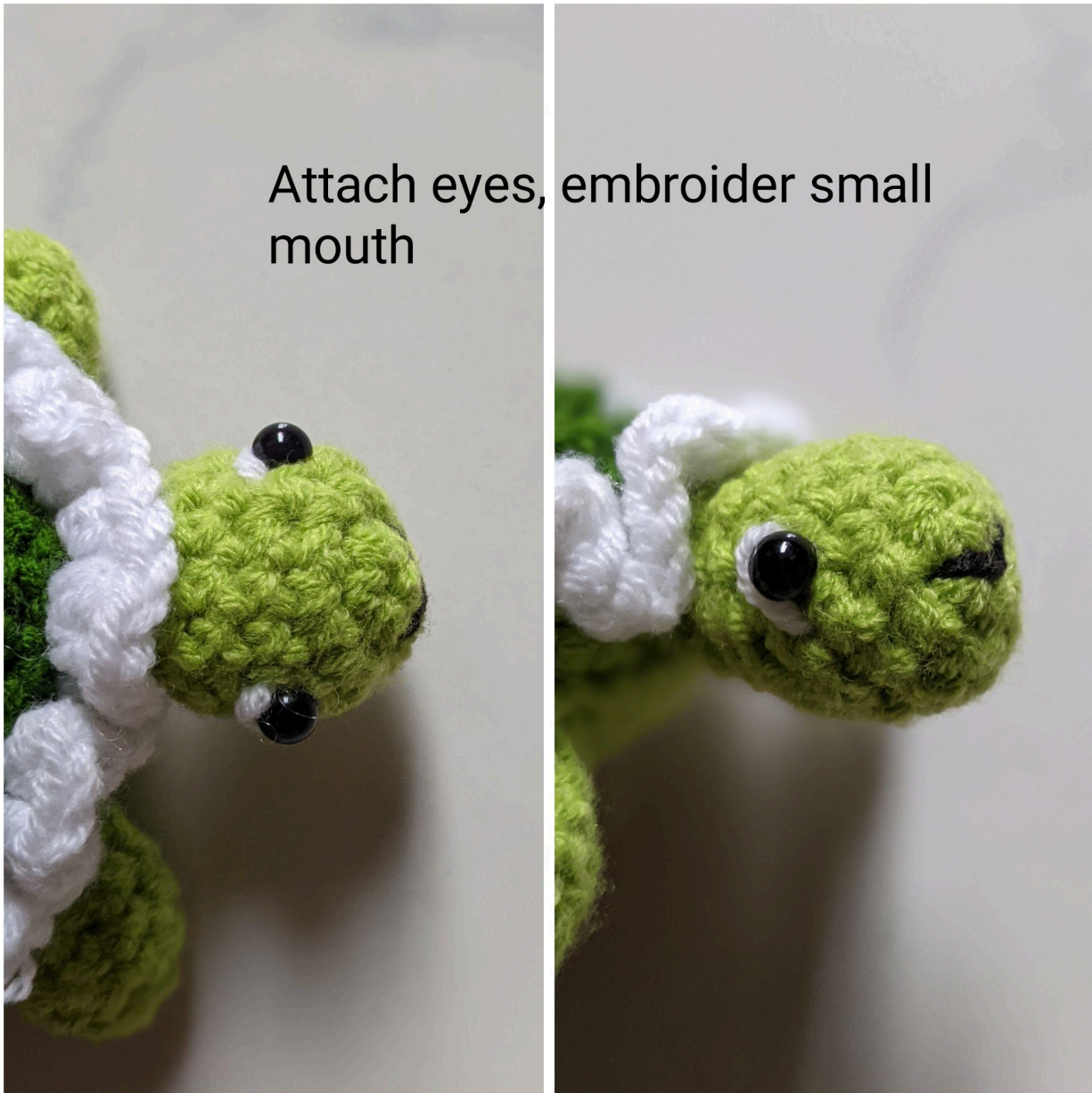


Switch to red yarn

- **R4–R7:** sc around [6]
- **R8:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [9]
- **R9–R10:** sc around [9]
- **R11:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 3 [12]
- **R12:** sc around [12]

Fasten off, leave a long tail and cut the yarn.

Bend the tip of the hat and secure it in place with a small amount of glue.
Stuff lightly and sew it on top of the shell.



FINISHING TOUCHES

- Attach the safety eyes in your preferred position
- Embroider a small mouth using black yarn
- Add a tiny white highlight on each eye with white yarn

PATTERN 5: CUPCAKE PLUSHY TURTLE

Skill Level: Advanced

This pattern requires familiarity with basic crochet stitches (such as single crochet, increase, and decrease), working in the round, and attaching multiple parts together.

Finished Size: Approximately 15 cm (5 inches)

Size may vary depending on yarn thickness, hook size, and your individual tension.





MATERIALS

Yarn:

Plush Yarn (4.5 - 5 mm hook):

- Pink
- White

- Light brown

Milk Cotton Yarn (4-ply, 3 mm hook for details):

- Red
- Green
- White
- Black

Other Supplies:

- Hooks: 3 mm (strawberry), 4.5 mm (main parts)
- 10 mm safety eyes (or small black beads)
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = Chain
- **sc** = Single Crochet
- **inc** = Increase (2 sc in one stitch)
- **dec** = Decrease (2 sc together)
- **sl st** = Slip Stitch
- **R** = Round/Row
- **BLO** = Back Loop Only
- **FLO** = Front Loop Only

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS



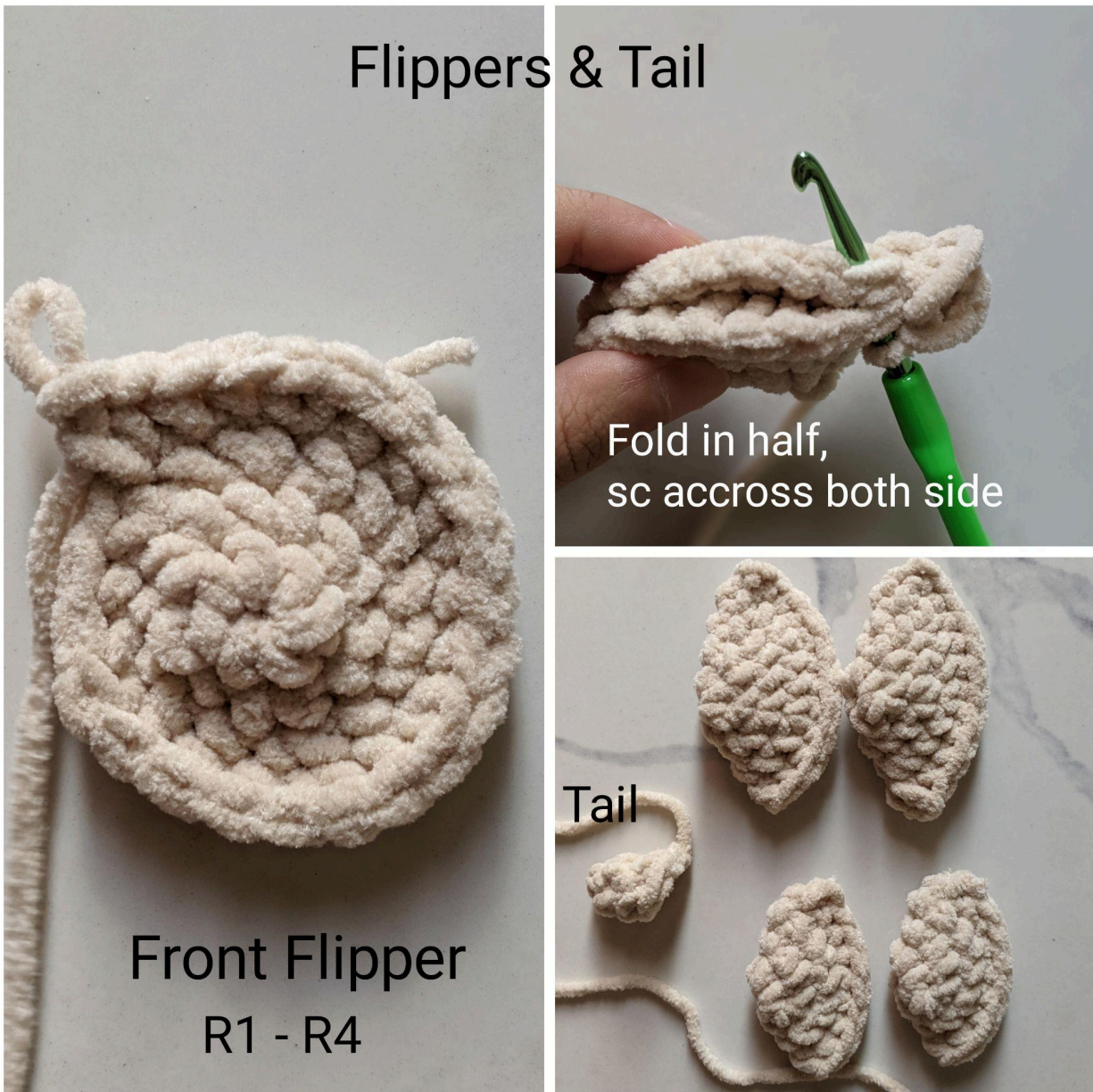
HEAD (LIGHT BROWN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4–R5:** sc around [18]

Attach eyes between R3-R4, approximately 6 stitches apart.

- **R6:** (1 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [12]
- **R7:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing.



FRONT FLIPPERS (MAKE 2, LIGHT BROWN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]

- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [24]

Fold in half and work 12 sc across both layers. Fasten off and weave in the end.

BACK FLIPPERS (MAKE 2, LIGHT BROWN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]

Fold in half and work 9 sc across both layers. Do not stuff. Fasten off and weave in the end.

TAIL (LIGHT BROWN YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2–R3:** sc around [6]

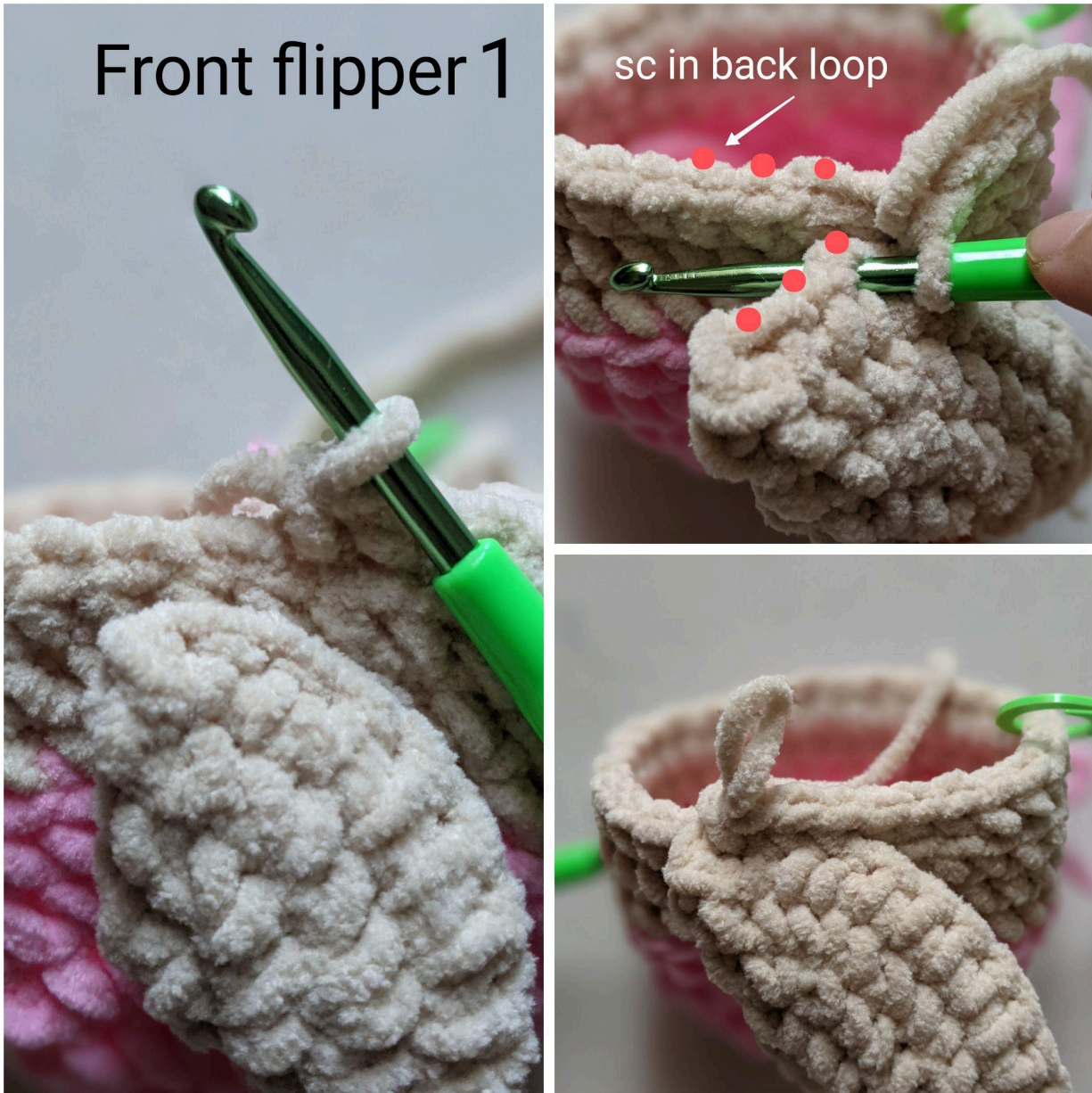
Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.



UPPER SHELL (PINK YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 inc [12]
- **R3:** (1 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [18]
- **R4:** (2 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [24]
- **R5:** (3 sc, 1 inc) × 6 [30]
- **R6:** sc around [30]

Front flipper 1



Do not cut the yarn.

BOTTOM SHELL (LIGHT BROWN YARN)

Attach yarn to the **BLO** of **Round 6** of the upper shell.

- **R1:** BLO, sc around [30]
- **R2–R3:** Work in both loops, sc around [30]



- **R4:** While working this round, attach the flippers. Place the flippers outside the shell, insert the hook through the flipper first, then through the shell, and complete the single crochet. (See pictures)

(Work in both loops)

6 sc, attach front flipper with **3 sc**, **5 sc**, attach back flipper with **2 sc**, **4 sc**, attach back flipper with **2 sc**, **5 sc**, attach front flipper with **3 sc** [30]

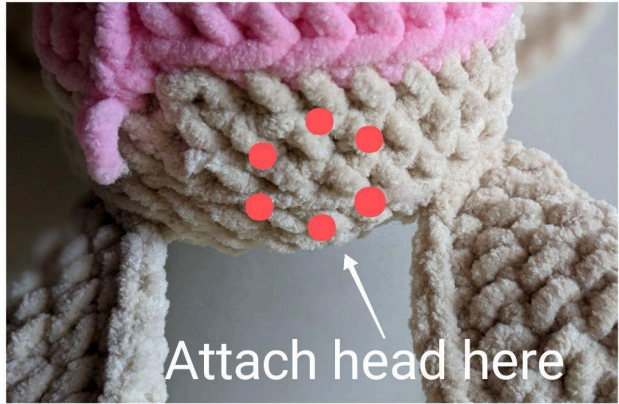


- **R5:** (3 sc, 1 dec) × 6 [24]
- **R6:** 12 dec [12]

Stuff with fiberfill.

- **R7:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off, then close the gap by weaving through the front loops only of the remaining 6 stitches. Pull tight to close and hide tail.



ATTACHING HEAD AND TAIL

Attach the head between the front flippers and the tail between the back flippers using a tapestry needle.

Side ruffles

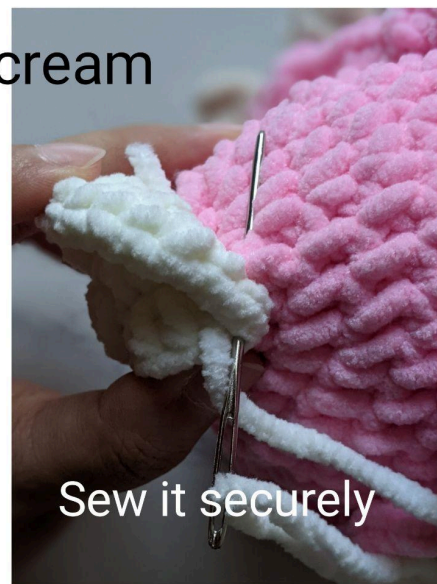


Work in the back loops
3sc in each loop

SIDE RUFFLES (PINK YARN)

Continue working with the pink yarn in **FLO of Round 6** of upper shell.

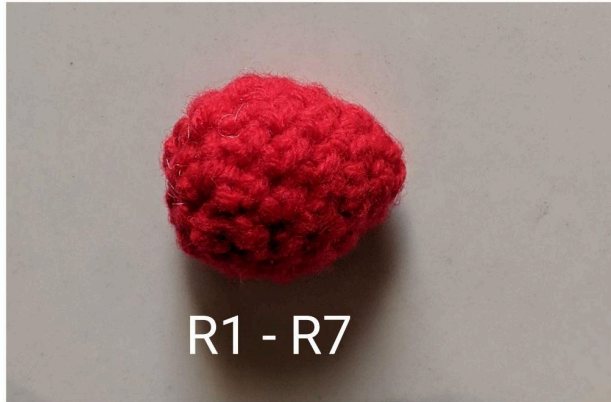
Work 3 sc into each loop around. Sl st, fasten off and weave in the end.



WHIPPED CREAM TOPPING (WHITE YARN)

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** (3 hdc) × 6 [18]

Fasten off and weave in the end.



STRAWBERRY (USE 3 MM HOOK)

Use red yarn

- **R1:** 6 sc in MR [6]
- **R2:** 6 sc [6]
- **R3:** 6 inc [12]
- **R4–R6:** sc around [12]

Stuff with fiberfill.

- **R7:** 6 dec [6]

Fasten off, close the gap with a needle, and weave in the end.

GREEN PART (USE GREEN YARN)

Do a magic ring.

(ch 4, skip the first ch from hook, sc in 3 ch and sl st into MR) × 3

Fasten off, leave a long tail and attach it to the strawberry by sewing.



FINISHING TOUCHES

- Sew the whipped cream and strawberry securely to the top of the shell
- Embroider a small mouth with black yarn
- Add a tiny white highlight on each eye with white yarn
