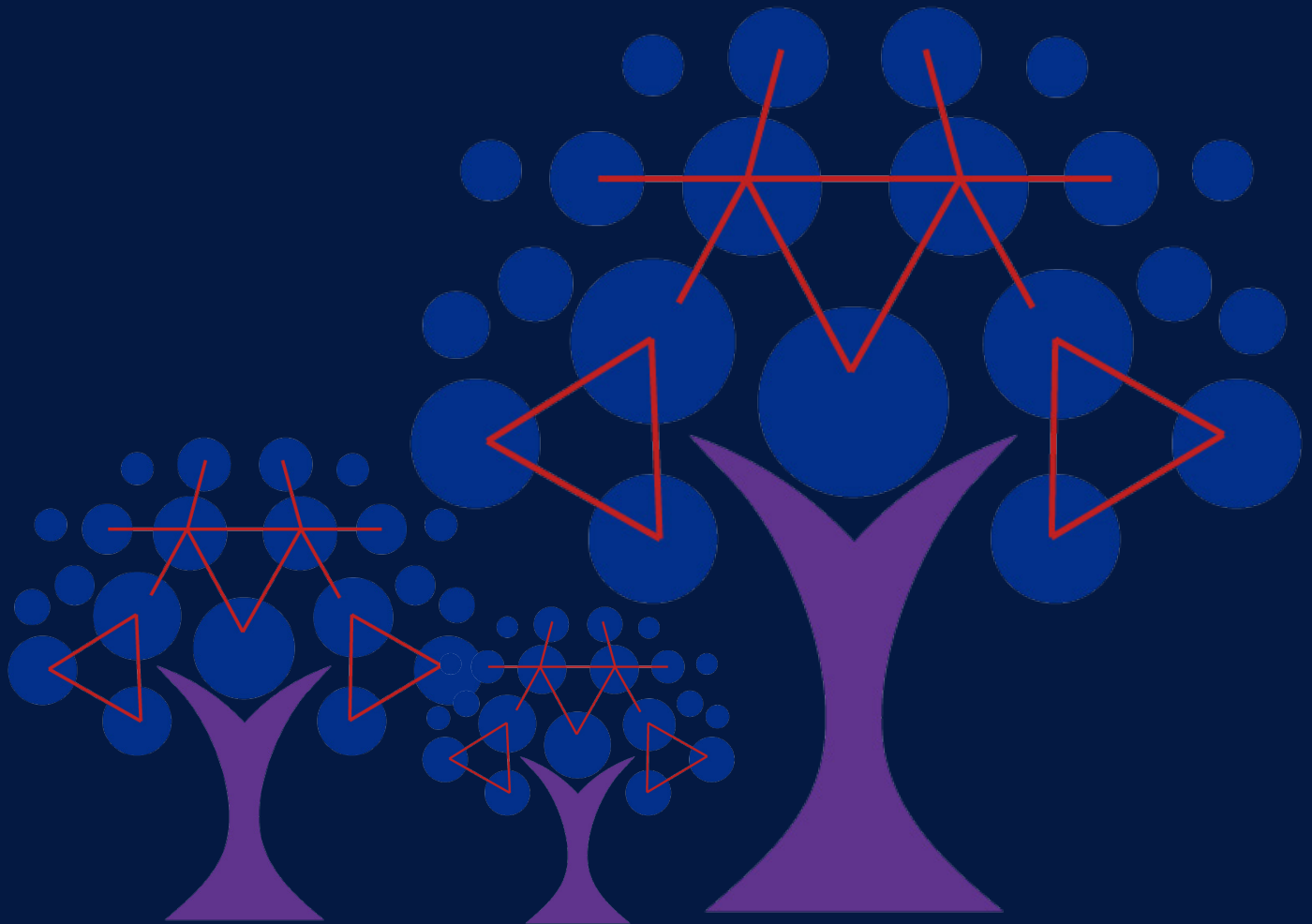

>> DITCH THE OBJECTIVE

Write_an_Impact_Summary

WHY IT MATTERS

An "Objective" statement talks about what you want. A "Summary" talks about the value you provide. Hiring managers want to see the value first.

BEFORE

"Objective: To obtain a challenging entry-level role in cybersecurity."

AFTER

"A motivated cybersecurity student with hands-on project experience in network analysis and threat hunting. Seeking to apply problem-solving and collaboration skills to help secure enterprise systems."

YOUR TO DO

Write a 2-sentence summary at the top of your resume that highlights your top 2 skills and the value you want to bring to a company.

>> ADD KEYWORDS

Beat_the_Bots!

WHY IT MATTERS

Most large companies use Applicant Tracking Systems (ATS) to scan resumes. If your resume doesn't have the keywords from the job description, a human will likely never see it.

BEFORE

Vague skills list: "Teamwork, Microsoft Office, Security Concepts."

AFTER

Specific, keyword-rich skills: "Threat Intelligence, Incident Response, SIEM, Python, MITRE ATT&CK, Network Security, Cloud Security (AWS)."

YOUR TO DO

Read the job description for a role you want. Find 5-7 keywords and add them to your "Skills" and "Projects" sections.

>> SHOWCASE YOUR PROJECTS

Over_Coursework

WHY IT MATTERS

Your classes show you can learn. Your projects prove you can do. A project section is the best way to show practical experience, even if you haven't had an internship yet.

BEFORE

"Relevant Coursework: Intro to Networking, Security 101."

AFTER

"Project: Home Lab Network Monitor

Configured a virtual network using VMware to simulate a small business environment.

Deployed a SIEM to collect and analyze logs, successfully identifying three simulated intrusion attempts."

YOUR TO DO

Create a "Projects" section on your resume. Detail 1-2 key projects from school, a hack-a-thon, or your personal time.

>> QUANTIFY YOUR IMPACT

With_Numbers

WHY IT MATTERS

Numbers provide proof and scale. They turn a vague statement into a concrete achievement.

BEFORE

"Helped the team improve security processes."

AFTER

"Contributed to a team project that improved a security process, reducing alert response time by 15%."

YOUR TO DO

Find at least 3 bullet points in your resume and add a number, percentage, or dollar amount to show your impact.

>> INCLUDE YOUR HUMAN SKILLS

Technical_Skills_Are_Expected

WHY IT MATTERS

Human skills are what make you a great teammate. "Your ability to communicate and collaborate is just as important as your technical skill."

BEFORE

Leaving soft skills off or using clichés like "Hard worker."

AFTER

A dedicated section titled "Professional Skills" that includes: "Teamwork & Collaboration, Technical Communication, Problem-Solving, Adaptability."

YOUR TO DO

Add a "Professional Skills" or "Soft Skills" section to your resume and list 3-4 key human skills you possess.
