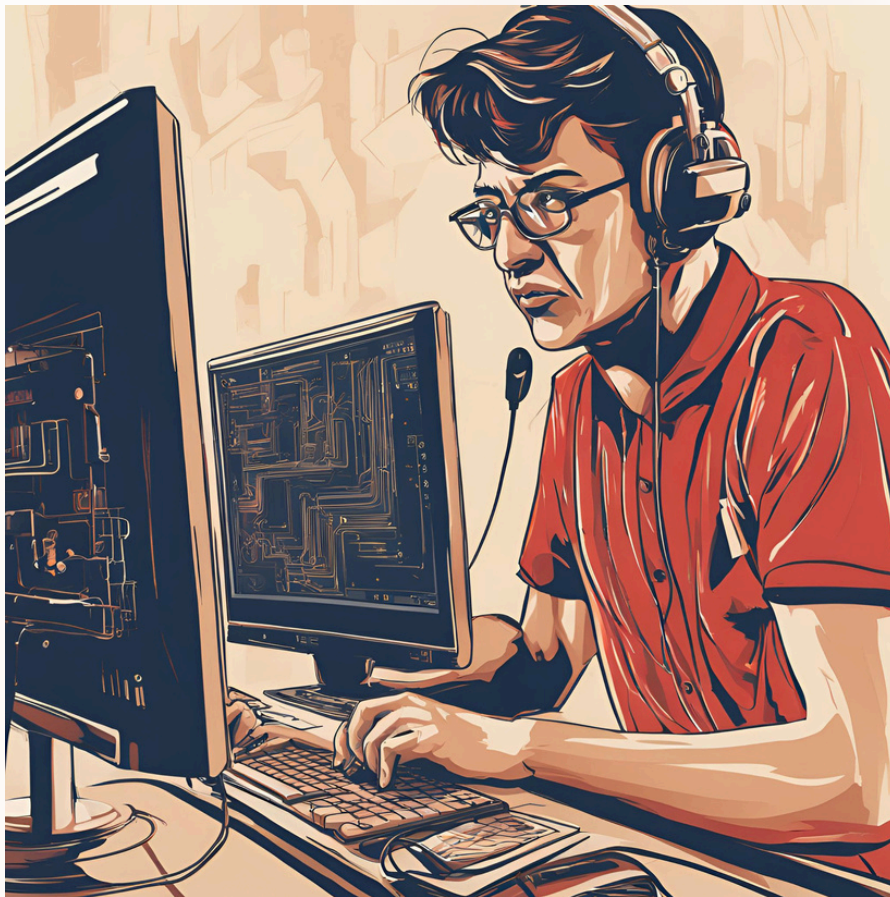

- **Deeper Understanding**

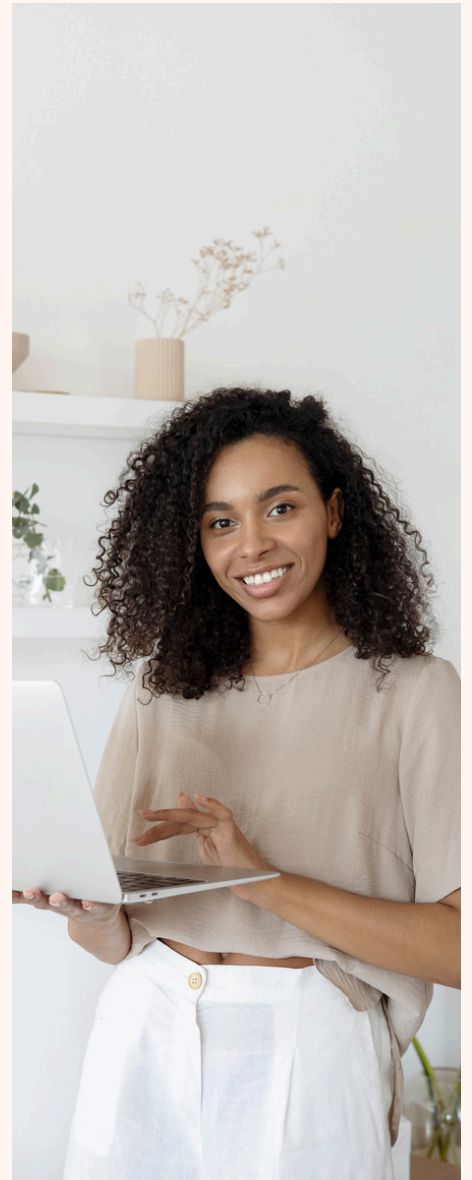
Writing by hand encourages summarizing and paraphrasing, which aids comprehension.

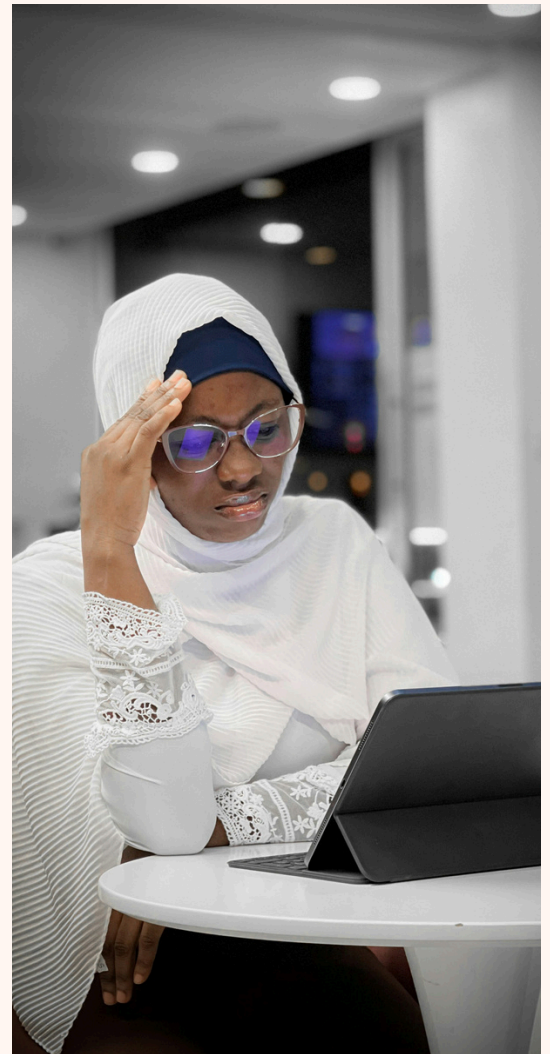
