# POSITION

– Start from Identity, Not Insecurity

Scripture: Ephesians 2:6

## Kingdom Principle

You don't pray up to God like He's far away. You pray from your seated position beside Him. You're not striving—you're standing in spiritual confidence.

Lord, thank You that I am already seated with Christ. I pray from authority, not anxiety. I am not a beggar—I am Your beloved daughter.

# PURPOSE

– Pray With Vision, Not Just Emotion

Scripture: Proverbs 29:18

## Kingdom Principle

Prayer isn't just emotional release—it's divine strategy. You're not just asking for a spouse. You're praying into a Kingdom assignment.

**Father, align me with Your vision for marriage. Don't just give me what I want—prepare me for what You've called me to steward.**

# PETITION

– Ask Boldly, Believe Deeply

Scripture: Philippians 4:6

Kingdom Principle

God responds to faith-filled specifics. He's not offended by your boldness—He's drawn to it.

God, I bring my desires before You—specifically and boldly. I ask for a husband who fears You, leads with love, and honors covenant.

# PROPHECY

– Speak God’s Word Over Your Future

Scripture: Job 22:28

## Kingdom Principle

Don’t just wish for your future—  
speak it into alignment with God’s  
will. Prophetic prayer calls things  
that be not as though they were.

**I declare my marriage will be rooted in  
Christ, built on purpose, and covered in  
peace. What You’ve spoken, I agree with.**

# PREPARE

– Align Your Habits With Your Hope

Scripture: James 2:17

## Kingdom Principle

Praying like a wife means living like one in character, in conduct, and in calling—even before the ring.

Lord, prepare my heart, my habits, and my hands. Make me a wife in spirit long before I ever say 'I do.'
