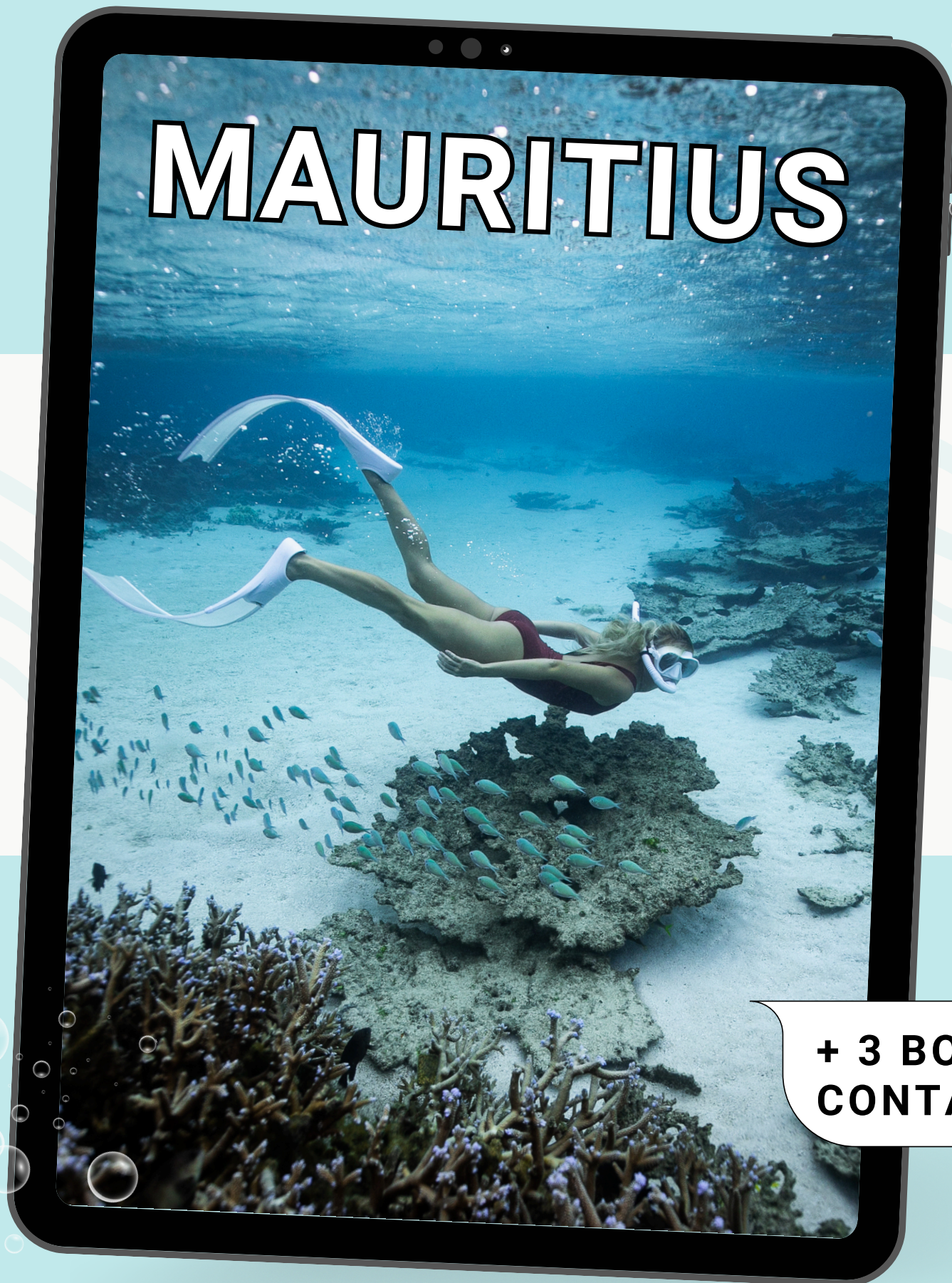

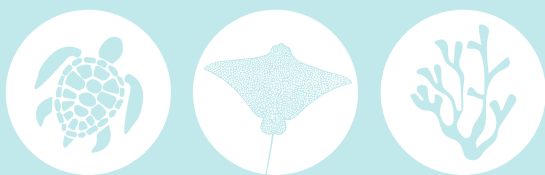

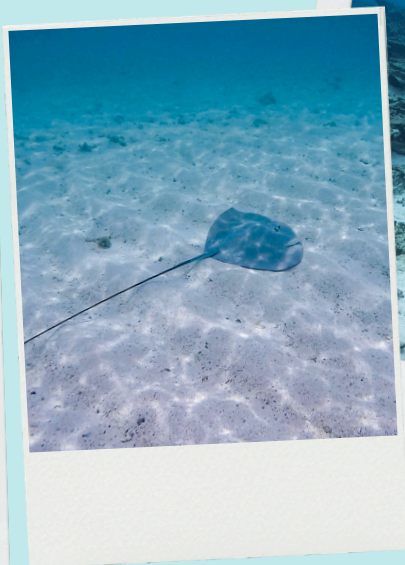


FLAT ISLAND

Spot information

Discover this unique diving spot, accessible only by boat (cost: 1,200 to 3,000 rupees/person). Snorkel between Gabriel and Flat Island, following the skipper's advice to avoid currents. Immerse yourself in crystal-clear waters, where peaceful turtles and rays live. Explore the beautiful and diverse coral formations beneath the surface.

Spot informations

Accessible by swim, kayak, or paddle for free, or by boat (cost: 1,000 to 2,000 rupees/person). Located on the left side of the long beach of Trou aux Biches, with access near Popo Supermarket. Avoid the touristy paid trips for turtle feeding and instead, snorkel near the reef. For those eager to explore the open sea and a wreck, opt for a kayak or paddle, or rent a boat to venture outside the reef. Stay close to the reef to witness a vibrant underwater world abundant with fish, corals, turtles, octopus, and eels. Alternatively, venture a bit further to the KT Mawar Wreck for a unique freediving experience (accessible only with a boat).

Coin de Mire, offers 4 unique spots for exploration. Snorkel in the vibrant marine life of Confetti Bay or The Wall, where you can encounter beautiful, colorful corals, turtles, fish, octopuses, and perhaps eagle rays, reef sharks, whale sharks, and dolphins if you are lucky! Explore the hidden gem behind Coin de Mire, my secret spot with caves and a beautiful white sand bank.

For experienced freedivers, venture to Djabeda, a wreck 33m deep with its top at 26m.

Be aware of currents and ensure your boat is equipped with GPS to find the right spot.

Accessible by boat only (cost: 1,500 to 2,500 rupees/person), keep an eye out for humpback whales on your way (from July to October), turning your journey into an unforgettable marine spectacle.

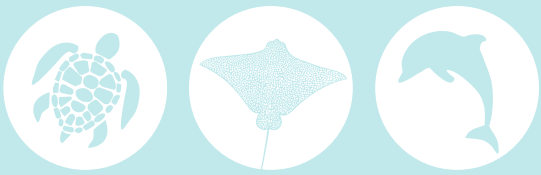

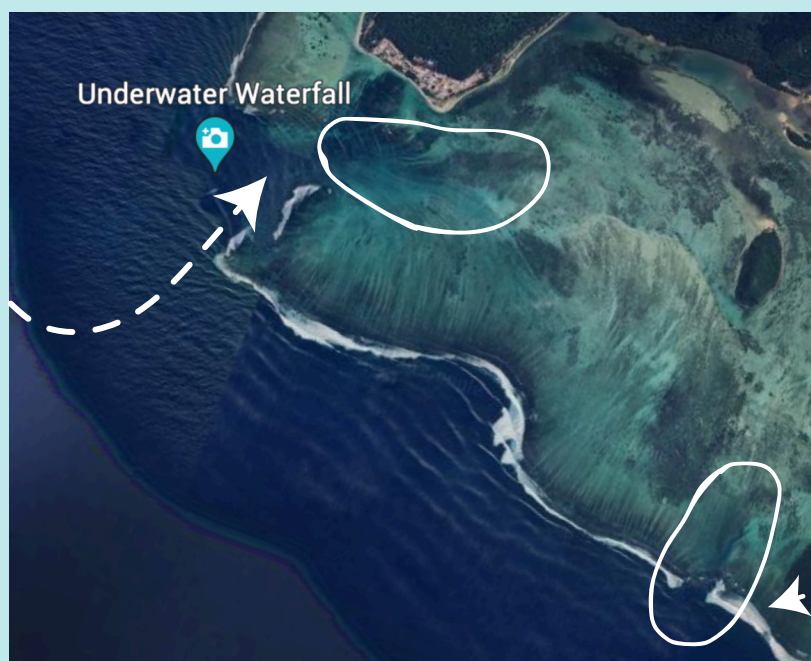
Explore 3 aquatic spots near Le Morne. For advanced snorkeling, Passe St Jacques and the Pass of the underwater waterfall are accessible by boat only (cost: 1,000 to 2,000 rupees/person).

Ensure favorable sea conditions with calm waters and low wind/current. The boat will stay next to you at all times during the snorkeling experience, ensuring safety. Encounter a diverse marine life, including dozens of turtles, eagle rays, stingrays, whiprays, barracudas, and sharks.

For freediving, the Pass St Jacques offers depths exceeding 30m beyond the barrier reef, even though waves can pose a danger, always go with a boat for safety. Classic snorkeling in the shallow spot provides beautiful corals, a variety of fish, moray eels, and stunning views of Le Morne mountain.

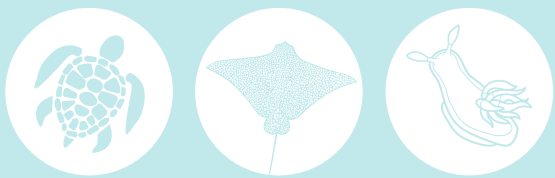

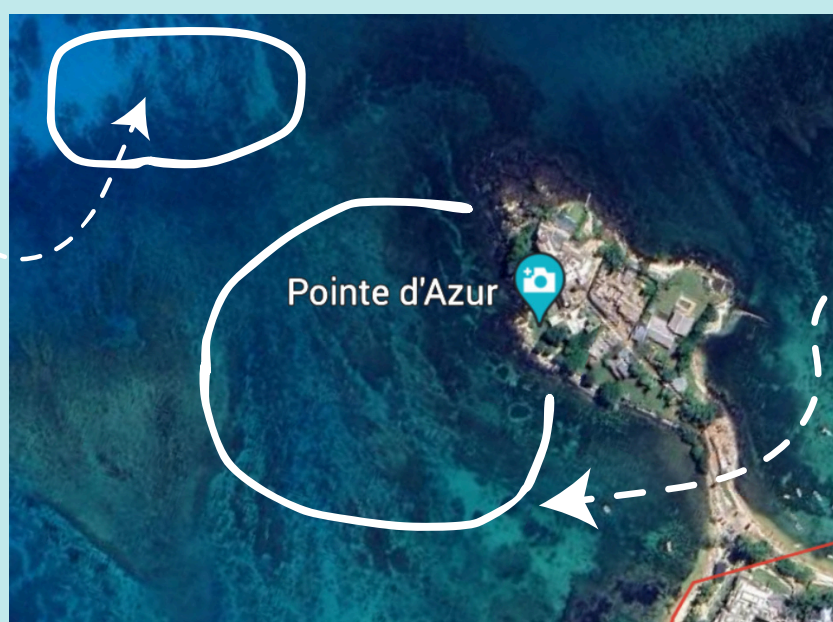


Spot informations

Explore a captivating snorkeling spot inside the lagoon, where many resident turtles live. I've even named them, describing their physical features and sent identifications to Kélonia association in Réunion Island. Easily accessible, you can swim directly from the beach. However, when the sea is not perfectly calm, visibility might be limited. It's an ideal spot for beginners due to its shallow depth. Venture to the freediving spot beyond the reef. To ensure diver safety, a boat or buoy is necessary due to frequent boat traffic. This spot is from 5 to 14 meters deep, and you can encounter eagle rays, stingrays, whiprays, turtles, large fish, and dolphins if you are lucky.

RIVIÈRE BANANE

Rodrigues island

During my third stay on Rodrigues Island, a small Mauritian island lost in the Indian Ocean, I discovered this shallow snorkeling spot, which was a true paradise. The corals were full of colors, and there was an abundance of various fish species!

A friendly local named Jackson offered boat tours to explore the underwater world of his island. You can also choose to swim from the shore for a more adventurous experience.

BASSIN VERT

Flic en Flac

This snorkeling and freediving spot begins at a shallow, natural pool hidden under a small waterfall that flows into the sea on the island's western coast. You can reach it by boat or take a nice walk along the coastline. It's a good idea to wear water shoes because the ground is rocky and often slippery.

Here, you will observe see turtles, rays, dolphins, different types of fish, and if you swim a little further, you'll find a lovely sandy area to explore.

TROU MOUTOU

Pointe d'esny

Magical snorkeling spot inside Mauritius' eastern lagoon. Trou Moutou, is a snorkelling area accessible only by boat. There, you'll find Hindu statues underwater and have the chance to swim alongside turtles and many fish.

To make the most of your underwater adventures, reach out to my special friend and local guide, Christophe Orange. He'll show you the way to these incredible aquatic wonders on our island. Just remember to stay safe around boats; using a buoy to signal your presence is always a good idea.
