Recommended Interior Flow

1. Cover Page
2. Welcome / Intro Page
3. How to Use This Book Page
4. Practice Pages (A–Z tracing & coloring)
5. Bonus Practice Pages (optional)
6. End Page / Thank You Page (optional)

Recommended Page Structure

For ages 3–5, keep pages simple, clean, and spacious.

A recommended layout for each letter page can include:

- Large uppercase and lowercase tracing letters
- A simple tracing word (example: A for Apple)
- Large tracing space for practice
- A matching coloring image
- Plenty of white space for easy use

Simple Page Layout Tips

- Keep designs clean and uncluttered
- Use large tracing space for young children
- Avoid overcrowding pages with too many activities
- Use simple and familiar words
- Keep font size large and easy to trace
- Ensure images are easy to color

Recommended Page Count

Recommended range: **80–120 pages**

This works well for beginner tracing books and generally aligns with common KDP pricing strategies.
