Understanding What Makes an Essential Oil Reputable What Is a Reputable Essential Oil?

A reputable essential oil is:

- 100% pure no synthetic fillers, fragrances, or adulterants.
- Properly labeled includes the botanical name (e.g., Lavandula angustifolia), plant part used, and country of origin.
- Sustainably sourced harvested in a way that supports the environment and respects plant cycles.
- Tested for quality with GC/MS (Gas Chromatography/Mass Spectrometry) test results available.

What to Watch Out For:

Low-quality oils are often:

- Diluted or mixed with carrier oils or synthetic fragrances.
- Labeled as "therapeutic grade" a marketing term with no regulatory meaning.
- Sold extremely cheap pure oils are concentrated and laborintensive; if the price is too good to be true, it probably is.
- Packaged poorly quality oils should be in dark glass bottles (not plastic or clear glass), ideally with a dropper or orifice reducer.
- Poor quality oils can:
 - Cause skin irritation or allergic reactions
 - Be ineffective therapeutically
 - Contain hidden synthetic chemicals

When you're using essential oils to support your health or home, quality isn't optional, it's essential.
