

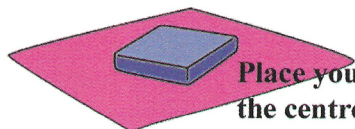

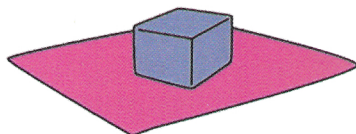
# Basic Box Wrap



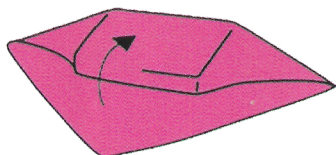
# Four Ties Wrap



Place your box in the centre of the cloth.



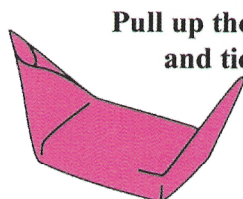
Place the box in the centre of the cloth



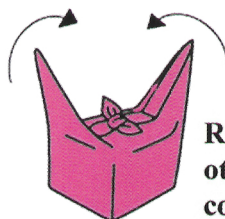
Bring the back point over and tuck under  
Bring the front point up and over.



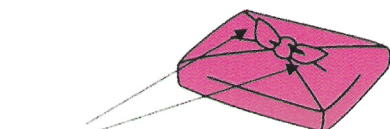
Bring corners together in a square knot



Pull up the sides neatly  
and tie with a square knot.



Repeat with the other two corners.



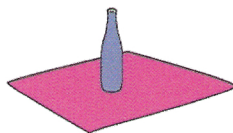
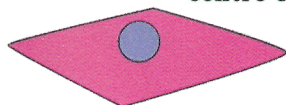
Take the points and tuck under the knot to form a pretty bow.



# Bunny Ears Wrap    Single Bottle Wrap

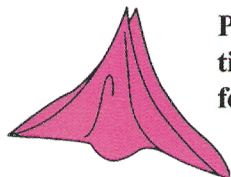


Place your item in the centre of your cloth.

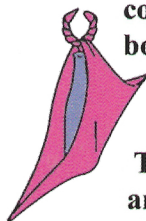


Place the bottle in the centre of the cloth.

Pull two sides up and tie a single knot to form the ears!

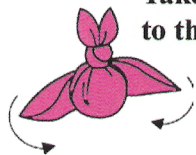


Bring the left and right corners to the top of the bottle,



Tie a single knot and then twist each end and tie in a square knot to form a circle.

Take the other two sides to the back and wrap over.



Take remaining corners around to the back and cross over.



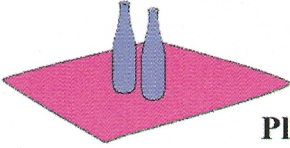
Then bring to front and tie with a square knot.



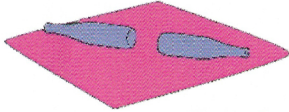
bring back to the front and tie a square knot.



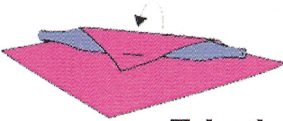
# Two Bottle Wrap



Place bottles in the centre of the cloth

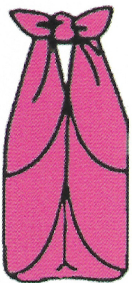


Lay them down leaving a small gap.



Take the top corner and tuck under the bottles.

Roll towards you.

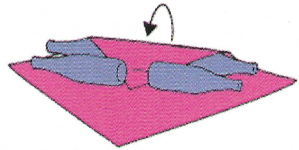
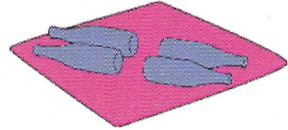
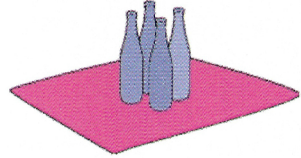


From each side, stand up the bottles and tie in a square knot.

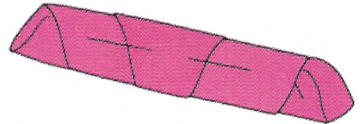
# Four Bottle Wrap

Place all four bottles in the centre of the cloth.

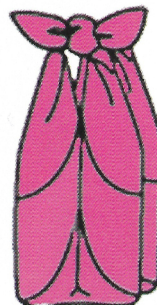
Lay them down with two facing each way. Leave a gap.



Tuck the top corner under the front bottles.



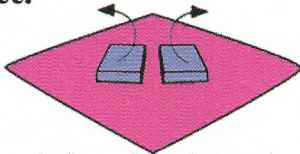
Carefully roll towards you.



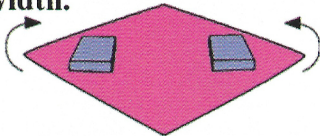
# Two Book Wrap



Place the books in the centre, leave a gap. This is the finished position, as in step three.



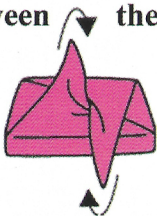
Roll toward the edge, leave just over a book width.



Tuck in the corners under the books.



Take a corners and cross over in the gap between the books.



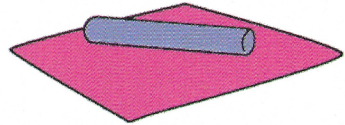
Close the books and tie the two ends.



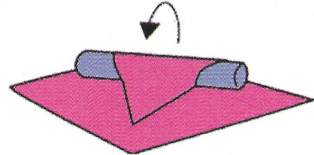
# Long Gift Wrap



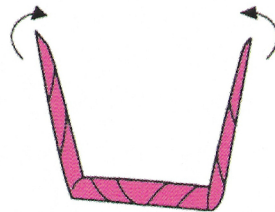
Place the gift close to the top corner. Go over the gift and tuck in



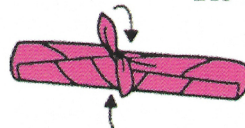
Roll the item to the front.



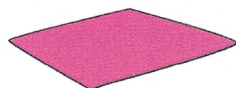
Twist both sides.



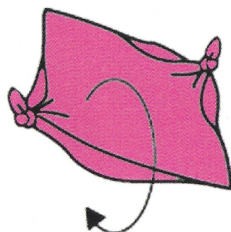
Tie together.



# Basic Fold Bag

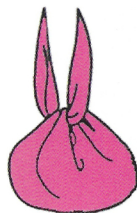
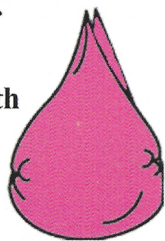


Lay your cloth flat.



Take two corners to form a circle and tie with a square knot.

Turn your cloth inside out.

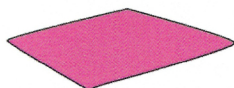


Tie a single knot near the base.

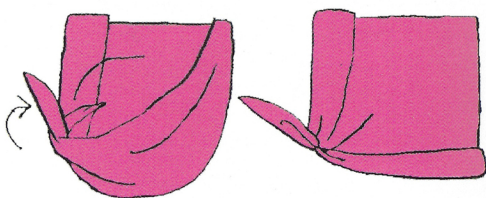
Tie the points and tie to form a handle.



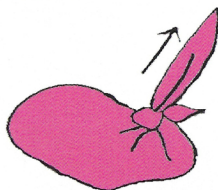
# Large Bag



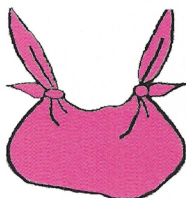
Lay your cloth flat.



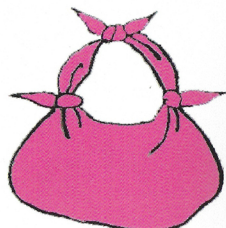
Take two corners to form a circle and tie with a roll knot.

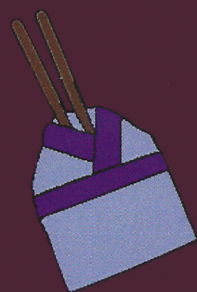
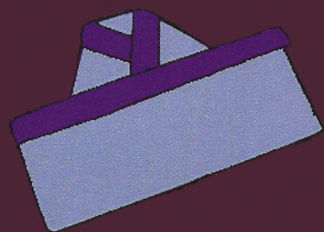
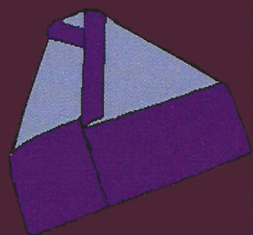
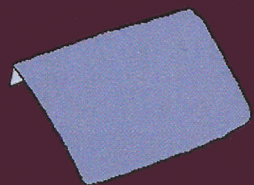
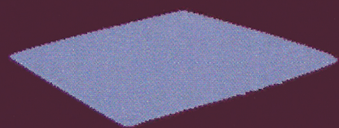
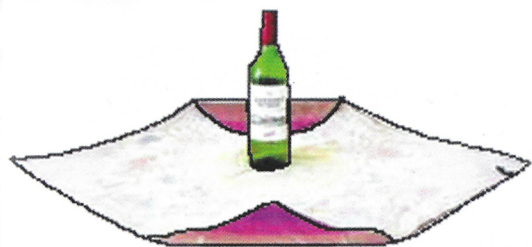


Repeat with the other two corners.



Tie the points and tie to form a handle.

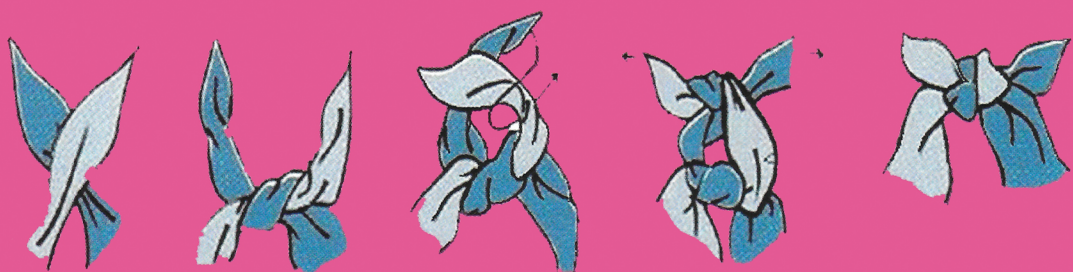




## ROLL KNOT

## SIZES REQUIRED

45 cm ----- for small things or as Fukusa (wrapping money)

50 cm ----- for Lunch box or luncheon mat

68 / 70 cm -----for Gifts or wrapping wine bottles and so on

90 / 105 cm -----for bigger bottles or an eco bag

118 cm -----for Interior cloth and so on

130 cm -----for as a big bag or Table cloth, a cushion or pillow cover

175 cm -----for carrying a big box or thing, for example Frame and so on

200 cm -----for Bed cover or wrapping one set of Futon

230 cm -----for moving and so on
