1. When the traffic light turns yellow, you must stop before the stop line unless you are too close to stop safely.
2. A blue circular sign with a white arrow pointing straight means "One Way."
3. You must always give way to pedestrians crossing at a crosswalk, even when there are no traffic lights.
4. When the traffic light is flashing yellow, you may proceed carefully while paying attention to other traffic.
5. You may park on a bridge if your vehicle does not obstruct traffic.
6. At a railroad crossing, you must always stop before crossing, look both ways, and proceed only when it's safe.
7. It is allowed to overtake another vehicle just before or on a curve if the road is clear.
8. When an emergency vehicle approaches with its siren and flashing lights, you must move to the left side of the road and stop.
9. The maximum speed on most ordinary roads is 60 km/h unless otherwise indicated.
10. When turning right at an intersection, you must yield to oncoming vehicles going straight or turning left.
11. Pedestrians always have the right of way, even when crossing outside a crosswalk.
12. A white broken line in the middle of the road allows overtaking when safe.
13. You may use your horn freely to alert friends or warn of your arrival.
14. It is prohibited to drive under the influence of alcohol, even if it is a small amount.
15. On expressways, the minimum speed is usually 50 km/h unless otherwise indicated.
16. You may stop your car temporarily in front of a fire hydrant as long as you stay inside the vehicle.
17. "No Entry" signs are circular with a red border and a white horizontal bar across a red background.
18. It is legal to pass another car on the left on one-lane roads if there is enough space.
19. You must always carry your driver's license when driving.
20. Drivers must give way to buses leaving bus stops in urban areas.

21. You may make a U-turn anywhere as long as there is no "No U-turn" sign.
22. A flashing red light at an intersection means stop and proceed only when safe.
23. Children under 6 years old must always use a child safety seat.
24. When parking on a slope, you should apply the parking brake and turn the wheels to prevent rolling.
25. It is legal to drive without shoes or in sandals.
26. Motorcycles may use the same lanes as cars.
27. When overtaking, you should always use your turn signal to indicate your intention.
28. If a pedestrian is standing at a crosswalk, you must stop even if they haven't started crossing.
29. Using a mobile phone while driving is prohibited unless it is hands-free.
30. The distance between vehicles must always be enough to stop safely if the car in front stops suddenly.
31. When entering a main road from a smaller one, you must stop and yield to traffic on the main road.
32. Parking is allowed within 5 meters of an intersection.
33. You can turn left at a red light if there is no oncoming traffic.
34. If you get into a minor accident with no injuries, you do not need to report it to the police.
35. The driver is responsible for ensuring all passengers wear seat belts.
36. When reversing, you must check behind you directly and through mirrors before moving.
37. You may not use the expressway if your vehicle cannot reach 50 km/h.
38. It is safer to drive closely behind large trucks to save fuel and avoid wind resistance.
39. A blue rectangular sign usually gives information or directions.
40. At intersections without signals, the vehicle coming from the left has the right of way.
41. When another vehicle is overtaking you, you must not increase your speed.
42. It is allowed to stop temporarily on pedestrian crossings to drop off passengers.
43. When driving in rain, you should reduce speed and increase following distance.

44. Cyclists are considered vehicles under Japanese law and must follow the same traffic rules.
45. If you are tired or sleepy, it is safer to open the window instead of stopping to rest.
46. You may not drive if your driver's license has expired, even by one day.
47. It is safe to drive through deep water if you maintain high speed.
48. On mountain roads, the vehicle going uphill has the right of way when passing.
49. If your car breaks down on an expressway, you should move to a safe place and use an emergency flare or triangle.
50. The driver is responsible for ensuring that the car is in good mechanical condition before driving.
51. When passing near pedestrians, you must either keep a safe distance or slow down significantly.
52. You can overtake a streetcar while passengers are getting on or off as long as you do not touch the curb.
53. Drivers must slow down to avoid splashing pedestrians when there are puddles on the road.
54. You may pass a parked vehicle without caution if there are no pedestrians nearby.
55. You must not interfere with pedestrians crossing the road, even if they are crossing illegally.
56. When approaching a crosswalk, you must always be ready to stop, even if there is no pedestrian visible.
57. You are allowed to overtake another car within 30 meters of a pedestrian crossing.
58. Drivers must stop or slow down for physically challenged people using a wheelchair or a white cane.
59. When passing near schools or playgrounds, it's necessary to reduce speed and watch for children.
60. Elderly pedestrians often walk slower and may have trouble judging vehicle speed, so extra caution is needed.
61. You can drive on "Pedestrians Only" roads if you are using a car with a special permit or garage access.
62. When crossing a sidewalk to enter a building, you do not need to stop for pedestrians if you honk first.

63. Cyclists are considered vehicles and must use vehicular roads.
64. When overtaking a bicycle, maintain a safe distance and slow down if needed.
65. You may open your car door suddenly as long as there are no cars coming.
66. When turning at intersections, always check for bicycles approaching from your left.
67. You should never drive too close to vehicles displaying a beginner, senior, or challenged driver's mark.
68. It's safe to follow closely behind a car with a beginner's mark to protect them from other drivers.
69. When driving near a vehicle displaying a "Physically Challenged Driver" mark, you must take extra care.
70. A driver must never zigzag between vehicles, even when driving in a group.
71. Accelerating suddenly is allowed if you are trying to merge quickly into traffic.
72. You must not exceed the maximum speed limit shown by road signs or markings.
73. On ordinary roads with no signs, the maximum speed limit is 60 km/h.
74. The maximum speed for mopeds is 30 km/h unless otherwise indicated.
75. You should always keep a safe following distance that allows you to stop if the car ahead stops suddenly.
76. On wet or icy roads, braking distance becomes shorter than on dry roads.
77. When driving a heavy vehicle, you should maintain a longer following distance.
78. Drivers seated lower may underestimate the actual distance to the car in front.
79. When braking, lightly step on the pedal first, then press gradually.
80. Sudden braking should be avoided unless necessary to prevent danger.
81. Drivers should reduce speed when passing "Drive Slow" zones.
82. Before changing lanes or making a turn, check mirrors and signal early.
83. You must signal at least 30 meters before turning or changing lanes.
84. You can signal after you start turning if traffic is light.
85. When changing lanes, you must check the rearview mirror and ensure it's safe.

86. Crossing a solid yellow line to overtake is prohibited.
87. You may cross a solid yellow line to turn into a driveway if it's safe.
88. You can overtake near the top of a hill as long as there's no oncoming traffic.
89. Overtaking within 30 meters of an intersection is prohibited.
90. When overtaking, you should pass on the right side of the vehicle ahead.
91. It's allowed to return to the left lane immediately after overtaking, even if you are very close.
92. You must not cut in front of a vehicle that has slowed down at a railroad crossing.
93. When facing oncoming traffic, you should keep a safe distance and slow down if necessary.
94. At intersections, always confirm safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and oncoming vehicles before turning.
95. When turning right at a one-way road, stay near the left side of the lane.
96. You can enter an intersection even if traffic congestion might cause you to stop inside it.
97. "Stopping Prohibited" zones are usually marked near police stations, fire stations, or crossings.
98. You may park within 5 meters of a crosswalk if there are no pedestrians.
99. Parking on bridges, tunnels, or within 10 meters of an intersection is prohibited.
100. When leaving your vehicle, you must apply the parking brake and remove the key from the ignition.
101. When starting uphill, it's safer to rely only on the clutch without using the handbrake.
102. Overtaking is prohibited on steep downhill roads.
103. Vehicles driving downhill must give way to vehicles driving uphill.
104. When approaching a blind curve, you should honk lightly to warn other drivers.
105. You may park near the edge of a cliff as long as you engage the handbrake.
106. On mountain roads, it's safer to drive close to the edge to allow other cars to pass.
107. Drivers should reduce speed before entering corners or curves.

108. High-speed turns on curves are dangerous and may cause skidding.
109. When turning a curve, the rear wheels follow a smaller turning radius than the front wheels.
110. Overtaking on a curve is allowed if the road is wide and clear.
111. It is more difficult to judge distance and speed at night, so you must drive more carefully.
112. When driving at night, headlights, taillights, and marker lamps must be on.
113. You should always use high beams in the city to increase visibility.
114. When another vehicle approaches, switch from high to low beams.
115. Interior lights can be used while driving at night if they don't distract the driver.
116. When parking or stopping on an expressway at night, you must turn on your emergency flashing lights.
117. Driving too close to a mountain edge during rain is safe if you drive slowly.
118. Slippery surfaces are especially dangerous when rain first begins.
119. Muddy water can enter the brakes, causing them to malfunction.
120. Studded tires are recommended for both snowy and dry roads.
121. When driving in snow, it is best to accelerate quickly to prevent getting stuck.
122. You must not drive a vehicle fitted with tire chains on roads that prohibit them.
123. Fog reduces visibility, so use fog lights or low beams when driving.
124. When driving in fog, honking occasionally is recommended to warn others.
125. If your car stalls on a railroad crossing, immediately restart the engine in low gear.
126. When your car is stuck in mud, you can place a blanket or gravel under the wheels to help traction.
127. You may stay inside your car if it breaks down on the expressway.
128. If your car has a flat tire, turn the steering wheel firmly to prevent drifting.
129. When you risk a head-on collision, steer to the right to avoid impact.
130. Before entering the expressway, check fuel, oil, tires, and emergency equipment.

131. You may drive on an expressway for as long as you like without resting.
132. The minimum expressway speed is generally 50 km/h.
133. Vehicles towing trailers must not exceed 80 km/h on expressways.
134. The maximum speed for ordinary vehicles on expressways is 100 km/h.
135. You may drive on the shoulder of the expressway if traffic is heavy.
136. You should use the acceleration lane to gain speed before merging into the main lane.
137. Trucks and slow vehicles should use the slow lane.
138. You may reverse or make U-turns on expressways in emergencies.
139. When overtaking, signal early and return to the left lane only after confirming safety.
140. Parking on expressways is allowed only when unavoidable, such as breakdowns.
141. It is dangerous to stay inside a stopped vehicle on the expressway while waiting for help.
142. After exiting an expressway, drivers tend to underestimate speed, so extra caution is needed.
143. Riders of motorcycles must wear a crash helmet that meets safety standards.
144. It is acceptable to wear a construction-type helmet when riding a motorcycle.
145. Riders must wear clothing that covers their body and is easily seen at night.
146. Double riding on a large motorcycle is allowed for riders with less than one year of experience.
147. Mopeds must make a two-step right turn at intersections with traffic lights.
148. When braking on a slippery road, more pressure should be applied to the rear brake.
149. A modified muffler or handlebar that causes noise is illegal.
150. When pushing a motorcycle on foot, the rider is considered a pedestrian.
151. During a major earthquake, you should steer sharply to the left to avoid hazards.
152. If an earthquake occurs while driving, stop safely on the left side and turn on the radio for information.

153. You should leave your vehicle in the middle of the road if you need to evacuate quickly.
154. If you must leave your vehicle after a quake, leave your engine running and windows closed.
155. Drivers should not attempt to use their vehicles to evacuate unless absolutely necessary.
156. When traffic restrictions are enforced under the Disaster Measures Basic Law, ordinary vehicles may continue driving as usual.
157. During disaster restrictions, vehicles must move outside or off restricted roads when ordered.
158. Police officers can direct drivers to move vehicles blocking emergency routes.
159. Under the Law Concerning Measures for Protection of Civilians, normal vehicles may be restricted during armed attacks.
160. You must follow the same rules under the Disaster Measures Basic Law when traffic is restricted for national defense.
161. Every vehicle owner in Japan must secure a legal storage space before registration.
162. The automobile storage location must be within 2 km of your address.
163. All vehicles must display a valid Automobile Storage Sticker on the rear window.
164. Vehicles must be registered and display license plates at all times.
165. Regular vehicle inspection is required and indicated by an inspection sticker on the windshield.
166. Mopeds do not require vehicle inspection or insurance.
167. Third-party liability insurance is mandatory for all vehicles.
168. Voluntary insurance is optional but highly recommended.
169. Letting an unlicensed or intoxicated person drive your car is prohibited.
170. Vehicle owners must keep keys in a safe place to prevent unauthorized use.
171. Users operating commercial fleets must ensure all drivers follow traffic rules.
172. Safe Driving Supervisors must be assigned to fleets with a total capacity of 10 vehicles or more.

173. Safe Driving Supervisors are responsible for providing driver safety education.
174. A Safe Driving Supervisor must check drivers' health and vehicle conditions before operation.
175. Users must not allow driving without a valid license or under suspension.
176. Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs is strictly prohibited.
177. A Safe Driving Supervisor can encourage rest breaks during long trips.
178. Substitute driving service companies are allowed to let unlicensed drivers operate vehicles in emergencies.
179. Business operators must take corrective action when drivers repeatedly violate rules.
180. Driving an overloaded vehicle can result in suspension or penalties.
181. Police hand signals with arms extended horizontally indicate a stop signal.
182. A police officer waving a flashlight horizontally means "stop."
