

The Ultimate Bug-Out Bag Checklist



1. Bag Selection

- ✓ **Backpack (40-60L)**
 - Water-resistant
 - Adjustable straps (shoulder, waist, chest)
 - Multiple compartments for organization
 - Lightweight, durable material (e.g., nylon or canvas)





2. Water and Hydration

- ✓ **Water Bottles (2-3)**
 - Durable, reusable (e.g., stainless steel, BPA-free plastic)
- ✓ **Water Filtration System**
 - LifeStraw or Sawyer Mini Filter
 - Water purification tablets
- ✓ **Hydration Reservoir (Optional)**
 - If your pack allows for it

3. Food and Nutrition

- ✓ **Non-Perishable Food (3-5 days' worth)**
 - Freeze-dried meals
 - MREs (Meals Ready to Eat)
 - Protein/energy bars (e.g., Clif Bars, PowerBars)
 - Trail mix, jerky, and dried fruit
- ✓ **Cooking Gear**
 - Portable stove (e.g., Jetboil, alcohol stove)
 - Small pot or cooking kit (titanium, aluminum)
 - Mess kit with utensils (spork, knife)
- ✓ **Snacks for Quick Energy**
 - Granola bars, nut butter packets, trail mix



4. Shelter and Warmth



✓ **Emergency Shelter**

Lightweight tarp or bivy bag (Mylar or space blanket)

Tent (if space allows)

✓ **Sleeping Gear**

Compact sleeping bag or emergency blanket

Foam sleeping pad or inflatable mattress (optional)

✓ **Fire Starting Kit**

Waterproof matches

Lighter (preferably windproof)

Ferro rod (fire starter)

Tinder (cotton balls soaked in petroleum jelly)

✓ **Clothing Layers**

Base Layer: Moisture-wicking clothing (shirt, socks, underwear)

Mid Layer: Insulating fleece or down jacket

Outer Layer: Waterproof jacket/pants

Extra socks and underwear

Hat, gloves, scarf (weather-dependent)

✓ **Hand Warmers** (if cold weather)

5. First Aid and Medical Supplies



- ✓ **Basic First Aid Kit**
 - Band-aids, gauze, and medical tape
 - Antiseptic wipes and ointments (Neosporin)
 - Tweezers, scissors, and sterile gloves
 - Pain relievers (e.g., ibuprofen, aspirin)
- ✓ **Personal Medications**
 - Prescription meds (enough for 72 hours)
- ✓ **Trauma Supplies (Optional)**
 - Israeli bandage or trauma dressing
 - Tourniquet (if trained to use)
- ✓ **Hygiene Items**
 - Toothbrush, toothpaste, and floss
 - Wet wipes, hand sanitizer
 - Biodegradable soap
 - Feminine hygiene products (tampons/pads)
 - Small towel or washcloth

6. Tools and Gear



✓ Multi-tool or Survival Knife

With blade, pliers, and small tools (e.g., screwdrivers)

✓ Duct Tape

For repairs and improvised uses

✓ Paracord (50–100 feet)

For shelter building, securing items, or creating traps

✓ Flashlight / Headlamp

LED headlamp (with extra batteries)

✓ Battery-Powered or Solar Charger

For charging small devices (phones, radios)

✓ Compass and Map

Local topographic map

Compass for navigation

✓ Notepad and Pen

For writing notes or leaving messages

✓ Emergency Whistle

For signaling for help

7. Personal Protection and Security

- ✓ **Self-Defense Items**
 - Pepper spray, tactical pen, or stun gun (optional)
 - Firearm (if legal in your area) or a compact knife
- ✓ **Face Masks**
 - N95 masks (for smoke, dust, or pathogens)
- ✓ **Gloves**
 - Tactical or utility gloves (for handling debris, fire, or building shelter)
- ✓ **Eye Protection**
 - Safety glasses or goggles (for protection from debris, chemicals)



8. Identification and Important Documents

- ✓ **Copies of Identification**
 - ID, passport, and driver's license copies (stored in waterproof pouch)
- ✓ **Emergency Contacts**
 - List of important phone numbers and addresses
- ✓ **Cash**
 - \$100–\$200 in small denominations (no large bills)
- ✓ **Local Maps**
 - Topographic maps for your area and surrounding regions
- ✓ **Emergency Plan**
 - Pre-established meeting points and evacuation routes for family



9. Communication and Navigation



✓ **Battery-Powered Radio**

For updates during an emergency (hand-crank option is ideal)

✓ **Solar-Powered or Hand-Crank Charger**

For powering your phone or emergency radio

✓ **Phone and Extra Battery**

Fully charged, with an extra portable charger (solar is great)

10. Optional Items for Specific Needs

- **For Parents:**
 - Baby formula, diapers, baby wipes, and baby food
 - Portable baby carrier or stroller
- **For Pets:**
 - Pet food, collapsible bowl, leash, waste bags
- **For Special Needs:**
 - Extra medication or medical devices (hearing aids, insulin, etc.)
- **For Extreme Weather:**
 - Sunscreen, sunglasses, and a wide-brimmed hat (hot climates)
 - Thermal blanket, hand warmers, and snow gear (cold climates)





11. Packing Tips

- **Weight Management**
 - Aim to keep your bag under 25-30% of your body weight
 - Prioritize lightweight, multi-use items
- **Pack by Category**
 - Keep similar items together (first aid, tools, food)
- **Accessibility**
 - Pack essential items (water, snacks, first aid) in top compartments for quick access
- **Routine Check-ins**
 - Review and replace expired items every 6 months
