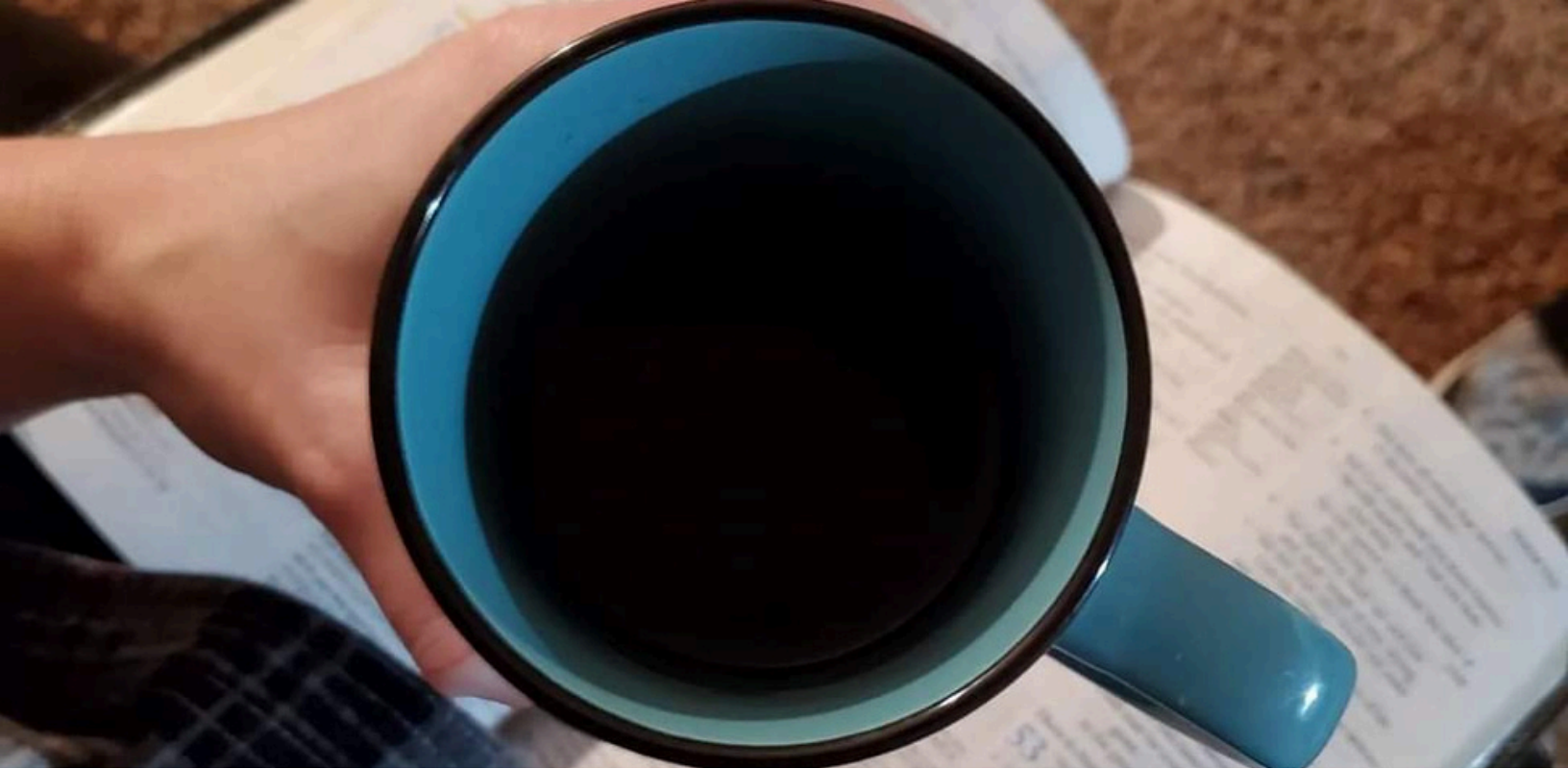

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Before you open your Bible...

Before we open our Bible and get into the practical ways we actually read it, here are some basics we need to understand about reading Scripture we need to address first.

WHAT IS THE BIBLE?

1

This may sound like a simple question, but let's bring clarity to a familiar phrase. The Bible is God's Word given to us. He could have chosen to speak to us in any way He wanted. He chose to do that by giving us a book filled with His words for us.

WHAT IS THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE BIBLE?

2

First and foremost, the Bible is a book about God. This is important. While we can glean other truths, our primary focus should be reading the Scripture with the goal of seeing who God is.

CONTEXT. CONTEXT. CONTEXT.

3

You'll hear me say this over and over. Context matters. I talk about this in my guide, but it is so vital. Before we jump to application, we must read the text for what it says. The Bible cannot mean for us what it didn't mean to the original audience.

STAGES OF READING

Comprehension: This is the first thing we are to do with all literature, but also with the Bible. When reading, we must first ask the question, "**What does this text say?**" This is simply summarizing or stating basic facts about what we read.

Interpretation: After we read and understand what the text says, then we can ask, "**What does it mean?**" Notice I didn't say What does it mean to me? The original author (indwelt with the Holy Spirit) had an original meaning. *We do NOT assign meaning, we merely study to find out the meaning that has already been given.*

Application: Only once you've done the first two steps, can you get to the true application of the text by asking, "**How does this change me?**" This tends to be the step we jump when in reality, it should come last.

DON'T READ ALONE

5

Let me explain. Yes, you should be able to read Scripture on your own and study it deeply. But let's not confuse that with the "lone ranger" mentality. We are to be reading and discussing WITHIN community! Read and discuss with other believers! This is where your knowledge of Scripture will take root!

How to Read the Bible

Beginner's Guide

Follow these 5 simple steps for a "rinse & repeat" method for reading any book of the Bible.

1

PRAY

Before you dive into Scripture, you need to pray, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal the Word to you. God's Word is living and active - it is not simply a textbook with facts. We need the Holy Spirit to disclose Truth to us through the Word.

2

PICK ONE BOOK

Pick ONE book and stick to it from beginning to end. Context gives us a HUGE insight to the author's purpose and meaning as a whole. **Read it from start to finish repeatedly.** This is the most under-utilized tool for comprehension.

3

STUDY SLOWLY

As you're reading it often (or even listening to it) from beginning to end, you need to study slowly. Remember, this is a marathon, not a sprint. Everyone reads at their own pace. Don't get caught up in "getting behind" - there is no such thing.

4

ASK QUESTIONS: BEFORE & AFTER

BEFORE:

- Who wrote it?
- To whom was it written?
- When was it written?
- What literary genre is it written? (letter, law, poetry, etc.)
- What is its purpose?

AFTER: Rewrite what you read in your own words and answer following questions.

- What does this passage teach me about God?
- What does this passage say about humankind (me)?
- What do I need to do in response to these questions? (repent/forgives, etc.)

MEDITATE ON WHAT YOU READ

After you have read and journaled, close your time in the Word by meditating on what you read. Pray through it. Ask the Holy Spirit to continue to reveal the Word to you throughout the day so your life will be transformed by the renewal of your mind as you learn God's Word.

1 PRAY

Before you dive into Scripture, you need to pray, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal the Word to you. God's Word is living and active - it is not simply a textbook with facts. We need the Holy Spirit to disclose Truth to us through the Word.

Prayer is simply you communicating with God. If you are a Christian, then the Holy Spirit lived in you. Scripture tells us that the Holy Spirit intercedes for us and prays where we don't have the words. How amazing is that?

While you're praying, Jesus, the Author and Perfector of your faith is interceding to the Father on your behalf. The book of Hebrews tells us that Jesus is the perfect high priest because He was tempted in every way are, yet is without sin. What does that mean? It means He can sympathize with your weakness, HE UNDERSTANDS! What a joy!!!

The Father is hearing all of your prayers. He is a good Father. He doesn't care about your words, He cares about your heart, so just be honest. Ask Him for help. He already knows what's going on in your thoughts anyway.

"Pray what you got." You will grow in your prayer life. But never stop. Give thanks, repent of your sins, ask forgiveness and pray for the Holy Spirit to grow you as you read the Scripture today.

DON'T SKIP THIS STEP.

2 PICK ONE BOOK

Pick ONE book and stick to it from beginning to end.

The Bible includes 66 'books' and two parts. The Old Testament has 39 books. This tells us about creation and the history of God and His chosen people, the Israelites. All of the Old Testament points to our future, perfect Savior - Christ Jesus.

The New Testament includes the remaining 27 books. These tell the history of God, the Son, coming to earth incarnate and enduring crucifixion to death and then raising from the dead - defeating death and sin!

The remainder of the New Testament tells of the Holy Spirit indwelling Believers and the Bride of Christ - the Church - coming on the scene being the light to a dark world.

So choose a book - I suggest one of the Gospels from the New Testament - Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John.

Read it from start to finish repeatedly. If it's a shorter book from the New Testament like James, 1 John, or Colossians, read it all the way through for 30 days. You will be surprised how quickly you'll retain knowledge of reading this way.

This is the most under-utilized tool for comprehension.

3 STUDY SLOWLY

To add on to point 2, remember this is not a race.

As you're reading it often (or even listening to it) from beginning to end, you need to study slowly.

Remember, this is a marathon, not a sprint.

Everyone reads at their own pace. Don't get caught up in "getting behind" - there is no such thing.

As you're reading it through each day for comprehension, you can also take time to study it slowly.

What do I mean by that?

Go back to the beginning of the book and study each verse slowly. Write down questions you have, take notes of things that stand out to you, or look into definitions of words so you have a deeper understanding of what the author is saying.

For example, if you were reading the epistle (letter) of 1 John, you'd read all 5 chapters every day for a month. Along with that, each day you will look closely at the verses.

Studying 1 John 1:1-4 would help me realize John is writing specifically about Jesus - note all the things He says about Jesus. What does this say about His character? What does He do for us? Why is John writing this letter?

And simply continue this process throughout the book.

4 ASK QUESTIONS: BEFORE & AFTER

To continue with step 3, I will use 1 John as an example as we ask questions BEFORE we read and AFTER we read.

BEFORE:

Who wrote it?

Apostle John

To whom was it written?

To Believers in the first century

When was it written?

90-95 AD

What literary genre is it written? (letter, law, poetry, etc.) letter

What is its purpose?

To remind Believers of the basics of Christianity

AFTER:

Rewrite what you read in your own words (simply summarize in 2-3 sentences) and answer following questions.

What does this passage teach me about God?

God has been from the beginning. John saw Jesus in physical form - he touched, saw, and heard Him.

What does this passage say about humankind (me)?

As a Christian, I also have fellowship with God.

What do I need to do in response to these questions?

(repent/forgives, etc.)

Praise God and thank Him for sending Jesus to be sacrifice for my sin and redeeming me so that I can have fellowship with Him!

5

MEDITATE ON WHAT YOU READ

After you have prayed, read and journaled, close your time in the Word by meditating on what you read.

This doesn't have to be fancy or take a lot of time. But we don't want to just close our Bibles and forget everything we read.

So pray through what you read. Ask the Holy Spirit to continue to reveal the Word to you throughout the day so your life will be transformed by the renewal of your mind as you learn God's Word.

Praise Him for what you learned about Him today.

Ask Him to forgive you of sin you've committed against Him and then rejoice that Christ paid for the penalty of that sin.

After I pray and meditate for a couple of minutes after studying, I set the timer on my phone for 5 minutes (then turn it over and push it to the side so I am not distracted) and just sit in the quiet thinking on what I've learned.

This isn't necessarily time to pray (although that's fine too) but it is just sitting in the quiet with the Lord. He is where the joy is, so we want to enjoy His presence!

Bonus Tip:

Throughout the day if you will talk about what you read that day, it will help sink in too! This can be with your spouse, kids, or friends!

You never know who needs to hear what the Lord revealed to you today!



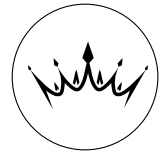

Where to Start

Here are some of my suggestions on which book to start reading in.

If you're new to reading the Bible...

I would start in one of the Gospels in the New Testament. These four books are going to cover Jesus's ministry and death and resurrection. Specifically the Gospel of John.

If you're familiar with Jesus and the Gospel..

You can start reading in Acts. This tells us how the Christian Church came to be and how the Holy Spirit saved people. You can also read any other epistle in the New Testament. Most of them name the author and who they are writing to which makes it easier to understand as well.

If you need some encouragement...

Psalms is full of prayers and songs from different authors (mostly King David). They are raw and honest prayers of praise, frustration, and confusion. This is an amazing place to start practicing praying as well!

If you need a good but quick read...

Proverbs and Ecclesiastes are books of wisdom. These are great starting places if you are looking for something simple to read and immediately apply. A lot of people read a Proverbs a day since there are 31 chapters. This would be a good add on to your daily reading plan.


If you're ready to go deeper..

Maybe you're familiar with everything I have mentioned but you realize you only have a Sunday School grasp on most Bible stories. Genesis is a great place to start in the Old Testament. You will get the full scope of the Creation, Fall, & Redemption story. If you can, this will give you an amazing overview and all of those familiar stories will start to make sense!

As we are going through and covering different translations, my hope is that this information will give you a better understanding of the different translations - how we got them and which one works best for you.

This section isn't for me to tell what to read, but instead to give you the information so that YOU can make that decision for yourself.

Of course discernment comes through not only information but make sure you are praying and asking the Holy Spirit to lead you to make the right decision as well.



WHICH TRANSLATION SHOULD I BE READING?



What's your purpose?

If you're looking to do an in-depth study of God's Word your best option is going to be the translation that is closest to original language, so choose a more word-for word translation.

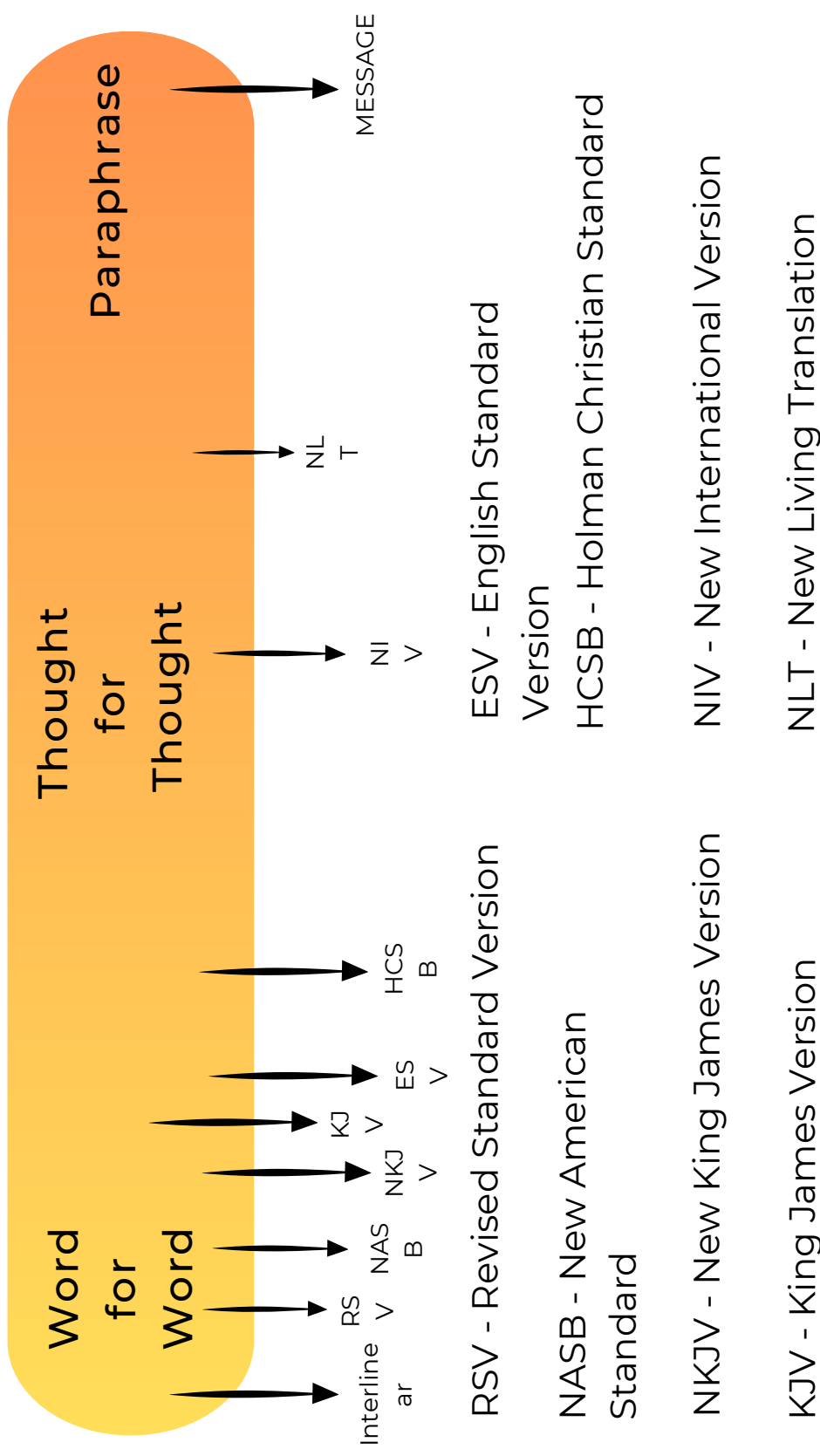
If you're reading casually or want other verbiage to look at scripture then a phrase-by-phrase is good too.

What is your goal of reading God's Word?

If we are reading God's Word to grow in our knowledge, it makes sense that we would want to stick as close to the originals as possible.

With that being said, my personal opinion is to stay away from the paraphrases. They should not be viewed with same authority as scripture.

Types of Bible Translations



Translation Comparisons

Matthew 5:13

You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt has become tasteless, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by people.
-NASB

You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. - ESV

You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. - NIV

Let me tell you why you are here. You're here to be salt-seasoning that brings out the God-flavors of this earth. If you lose your saltiness, how will people taste godliness? You've lost your usefulness and will end up in the garbage. -MSG

Translation Comparisons

Proverbs 1:17

Indeed, it is useless to spread the baited net In the sight of any bird; -NASB

For in vain is a net spread in the sight of any bird,- ESV

How useless to spread a net where every bird can see it! - NIV

Nobody robs a bank with everyone watching, Yet that's what these people are doing— they're doing themselves in. When you grab all you can get, that's what happens: the more you get, the less you are. -MSG

Translation Comparisons

Psalm 1:1

Blessed is the person who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, Nor sit in the seat of scoffers!
-NASB

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;- ESV

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers,- NIV

How well God must like you— you don't walk in the ruts of those blind-as-bats, you don't stand with the good-for-nothings, you don't take your seat among the know-it-alls. -MSG

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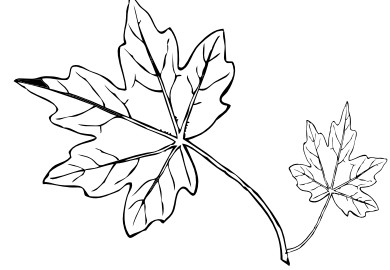

05 / DAILY RHYTHMS TRACKER



Daily rhythms are so important for us in our Christian walk. We must learn to orient our lives around Christ in every aspect of our day.

While there's not 'one size fits all' checklist since we're all in different seasons of life, there are some basic things I've learned over the years that have helped me be intentional with my day that I think everyone can benefit from.

In my list, I have attached my daily routine that I do every morning and evening that have helped me set up my day to be more intentional.

The attached tracker covers an entire week. You can print this out or use it digitally to track your rhythms each day.

These don't need to be done in a specific order. They're just my top things I do every morning and every evening. No matter when you wake up or go to bed, you can implement these in your daily routine!

I am the queen of coming up with a plan, sticking to plan for a total of two days and then wallowing in a bottomless pit of despair because I can't stick to plan.

So, instead of orienting my life around a schedule based on lists and times, I find it a lot easier to keep daily rhythms at the front of my mind. So whether I actually get up when my alarm goes off or I sleep later because we got in bed late or one of my boys was sick, I still have rhythms to fall into and my whole day isn't 'ruined' because I didn't stick to a 'time'.

These daily rhythms I have attached aren't special in and of themselves but they are what has helped me especially as I transitioned from a full time teacher to a stay at home homeschool mom. Keep in mind these can be as rigid or as loose as you need them to be. Prepping dinner could be as simple as laying meat out to thaw in the sink first thing.

My hope is for you to see how easy it is to establish disciplines for your daily life. You can orient your morning

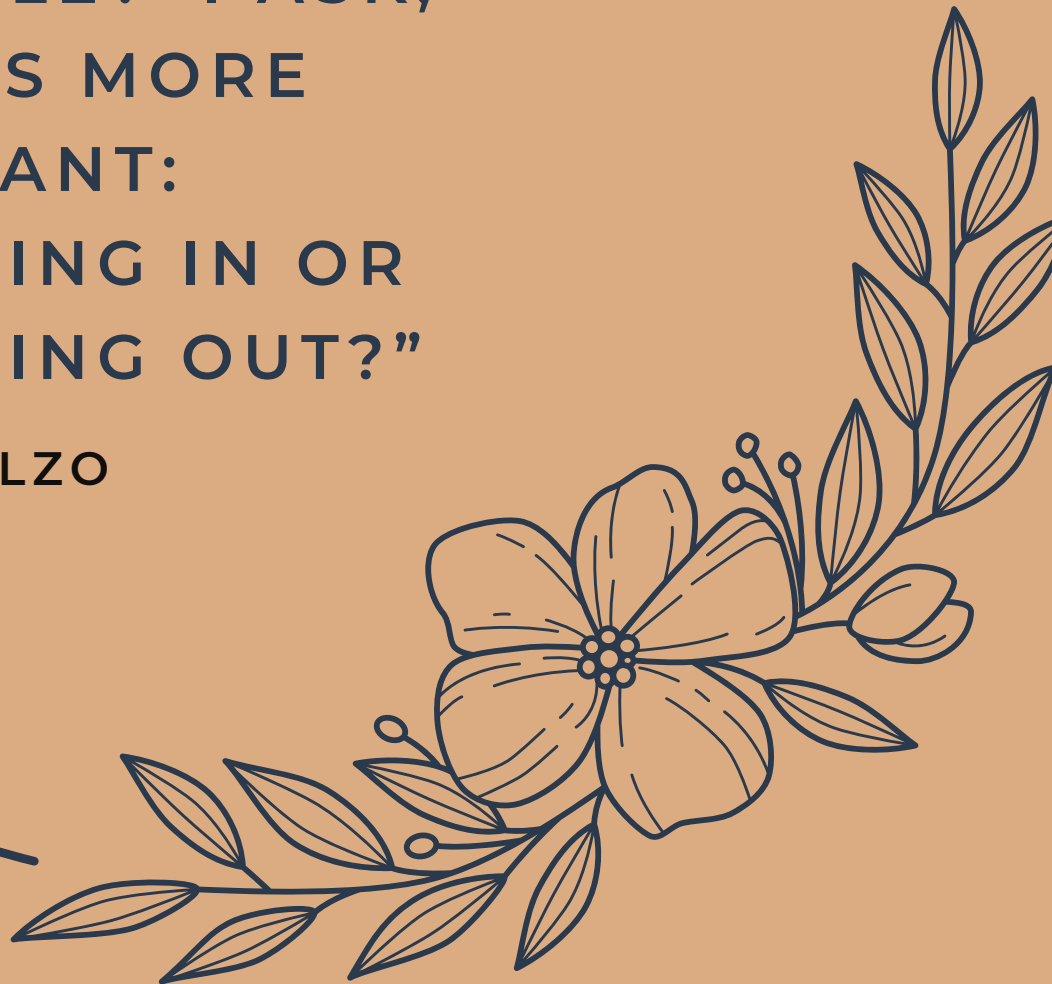
Your prayers reach the ears of Christ who is sitting at the right hand of the Father and HE is interceding to the Father on your behalf!
