“Wolf’s Delivery Service – now helping grandmas everywhere!”



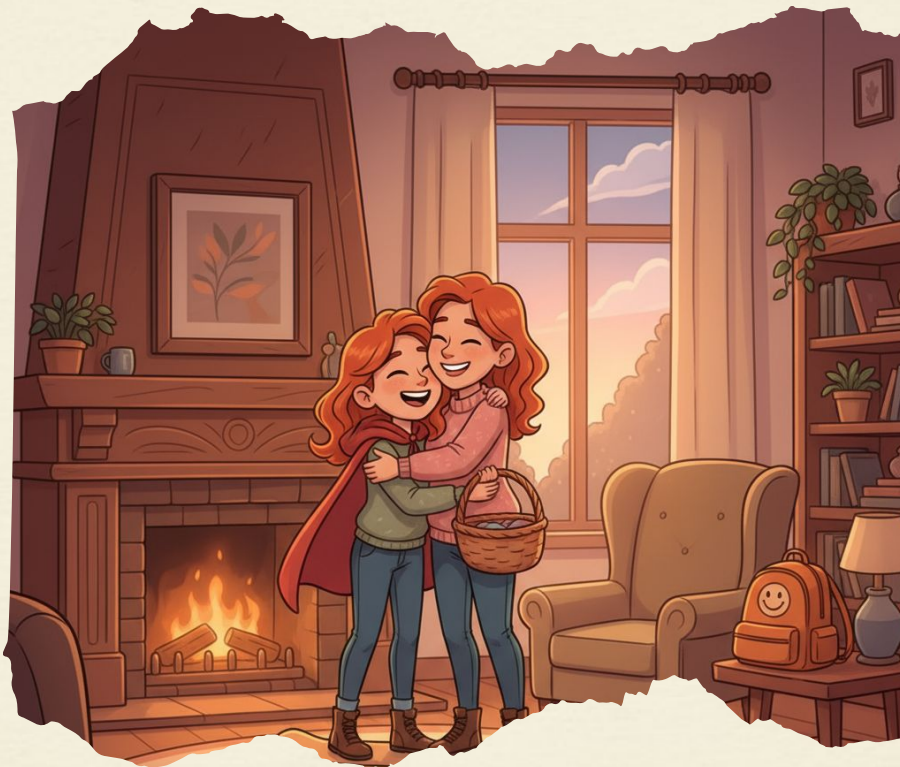
Red and Grandma cheered. “He really did it!”
