Timeline and Legal Requirements

01

Mandatory Waiting Period

Florida law requires a minimum 48-hour waiting period from the time of death before cremation can take place. This timeframe protects families and ensures proper procedures are followed.

03

Medical Examiner Approval

The Medical Examiner in whose jurisdiction the death occurred must review and approve the documentation. This ensures that any questions about the cause of death have been adequately answered before cremation proceeds.

02

Death Certificate Completion

The Death Certificate must be completed and signed by the certifying physician. This official documentation is a crucial step in the legal process.

04

Cremation Authorization

Once all legal requirements are met and proper authorization is obtained, the cremation process can begin. These safeguards protect everyone involved and provide peace of mind to families.

Practical Questions About the Cremation Process

Casket Requirements

You are not required to purchase a casket for cremation. Our reasonably priced services include a combustible, rigid, covered container that ensures dignified and safe handling of your loved one throughout the process.

Embalming Considerations

Embalming is not required for cremation. However, if you choose a Life Celebration that includes public viewing of your deceased loved one, embalming may be necessary to ensure a dignified presentation during the service.

Special Preparation Needs

Certain medical devices must be removed before cremation. Pacemakers, devices with batteries, and certain radioactive isotopes can rupture under high temperatures, creating hazards for staff and equipment. All jewelry and special mementos should also be removed, as they will be destroyed during cremation.

Initial Identification

1

When our staff arrives to bring your loved one into our care, an initial identification band is immediately attached around the ankle. This band includes the deceased's name, location, and all information required by state law.

Metal Disc Tracking

3

A numbered metal disc is assigned and placed with the body. This disc accompanies your loved one throughout the entire cremation process and remains with the ashes when they are placed in the temporary container.

2

Secondary Verification

Upon completion of vital information and cremation authorization, a second identification band is attached. This redundant system provides an additional layer of security and verification.

4

Witnessing Option

Families may witness the placement of the cremation container into the crematory. We must be informed in advance so we can arrange a mutually convenient time for this meaningful moment.

Scattering Ashes and Dividing Remains



Scattering Legality

All states allow ash scattering, but state laws prohibit scattering on private property without the owner's consent. National and state parks often have permit requirements and designated areas. For ocean scattering, the US Government permits burial in ocean waters at least three miles from land, with reporting requirements to the Regional Administration.



Multiple Locations

Dividing ashes among multiple locations has become increasingly common. This practice allows each family member to retain a small portion of your loved one's ashes or place them in a location meaningful to their relationship.
