They can also be highly convenient because they are quick cash jobs and often happen locally.

However, while these jobs can be useful, they are usually not the highest-paying jobs in the industry.

That's important to understand.

The goal is not to become trapped chasing small jobs all day long.

The goal is to focus on the jobs with the highest value.

2: Duplicating or Cloning Car Keys

This is when a customer already has a working key but wants an additional spare.

For example:

- a husband and wife may both want keys
- a business may need extra vehicle keys
- or somebody simply wants a backup key “just in case”

In many of these situations, the process can be surprisingly simple using modern cloning equipment.

Some high street key cutting shops now offer basic cloning services.

The reason for this is simple:

If the customer already has a working key, the machine can often read information from the original key and duplicate it onto another compatible key.

While this can still generate income, it is usually not where the biggest opportunity exists for mobile roadside specialists.

Why?
