Lunch with Mark Huth - 22 Nov 2024

What a pleasure it was to sit down with cousin Mark Huth [5] last November in Beverly Hills. I was in LA for a conference, so we got together over lunch near his home. We had a lively, fun, meandering discussion about his parents, their friends, as well as his interesting childhood and life.



Mark's life

Mark went to Beverly High. His mom Lilo went to Hollywood High. Jamie Lee Curtis and Carrie Fisher were fellow students. ("Jamie Lee Curtis is very smart.")

Today, Mark works at a music shop, selling guitars, filling in as a recording session guitarist and periodically teaching guitar. He's met several famous people and performers.

He met Ry Cooder ("He's an amazing musician, kind of like a kid"). Once he came into his music shop and said, "Oh I'm going to learn how to play the banjo", and he did. Ry didn't think his guitar playing was technically very good, but his sound is unique!

Mark talked to Ry Cooder about his trip to Cuba in 1996. He found these 70+ year old amazing musicians and recorded with them. They became the Buena Vista Social Club. The project resulted in the acclaimed album and film of the same name.

At the time, they could have been arrested. After getting them that exposure, he told Mark that "I've accomplished what I want in life..."

Other tidbits:

He sold Red Rhodes a pedal steel guitar. Mickey Dolenz from the Monkees makes great quality guitar stands in his garage. Glen Campbell couldn't read a note. "Lilo took me to his house one night 30 years ago, on Mulholland Dr." Adrian Blue of Genesis is a gentle giant.

Mark has been a studio session guitarist for Jackson Brown ("He's not a very nice guy").

David Lyndley (right hand to Jackson Browne) was an amazing guitarist. Graham Parsons had a family trust, enabling him to hire the best band members, like Chris Hillman of the Byrds. Today, Keith Richards takes some blame for Parson's heroin addiction.

Mark played with Springsteen, who personally praised a guitar lick that Mark performed in the studio. ("Bruce is a great guy").

His Dad

When Mark was young, especially back in the 60's when Bus had his own series, Tate, celebrities and others that wanted to get close to his dad would come around. He liked Paul Newman, who like Bus, played high school football in Ohio.

He spent time with Charles Bronson, Robert Redford, and Mary Tyler Moore. ("MTM had to push to have her single professional woman show approved, and she had many doubts, always questioning herself. ("Dick Van Dyke always talked her up").

Bus was also close to Burt Lancaster and Janet Leigh (Jamie Lee Curtis' mother), Robert Mitchum, Fred McMurray, and Jack Webb. Bus did not really like Tony Curtis.

Bus competed with Chuck Connors for the Rifleman role, and ironically Mark and Lilo became close with Johnny Crawford (who played Mark on Rifleman) when he was in a retirement home. Mark taught him the guitar towards the end of his life.

My dad had an exciting life, but he really didn't like who he used to call the "hanger-onners". When he got his own show, Tate, lots of people tried to get close to him.

What did people call Buster? "They called him David."

Bus was an amazing artist with a pencil. "It was unbelievable what he could draw." Does Mark have that talent? "Just a little bit. Our cousin Freddy Vuillemin has that talent."

"Once Dad was on his hands and knees painting a movie poster. A priest stopped by and said, "I see you're an artist?" Bus said, I'm not an artist, I'm a fuckup trying to paint a sign." Mark has a "book" that Bus made with drawings, poems and posters that we will try to get digitized.

How was Buster as a father? "He was nice. He was a friend in a way, more than a dad. He had such a sense of humor that it would affect your day."

When Mark went to Ohio for 2 family reunions, he noticed how Ted (Uncle Bud) and Bus were alike, and how they enjoyed each other's company.

Buster sometimes got so immersed in his character roles, that when talking to him, you might wonder if he was playing a role. (This is a trait that some attribute to Ronald Reagan.)

He had a short memory for conflict. He could be in and out of conflict with people, and unlike most, he would not let it persist. This was perhaps a family trait - when Bus and his brothers got together, they'd kid each other, provoke each other, and even pound on the table. One might think they'd get into a physical fight, but they wouldn't.

Lilo's Life

Bus was from a working Ohio family, and Lilo was from higher society Vienna.

"It's a funny thing - at first Lilo really didn't like Bus at all. She told me that he walked into the den of her uncle Fritz Altman's house. He looked at her a certain way. She said, "I'd never seen that look before."

She also said he was such a good conversationalist and storyteller that she fell in love with him! When they did agree, they were right for each other. Her personality was so different than his.

Lilo Herlinger came from a fascinating family.

Lilo's mother was born Klara Altmann in 1890 and married Hermann Herlinger. Klara had a brother, opera singer Fredrick "Fritz" Altmann. A few months after Fritz' honeymoon, the 1938 Anschluss incorporated Austria into Nazi Germany. Under the Nazis, Fritz was arrested in Austria and held hostage at the Dachau concentration camp to force his brother Bernhard Altmann, by then safely in England, to transfer his successful Bernhard Altmann textile factory into German hands. Fredrick was released and the couple fled, making a harrowing escape, leaving behind home, loved ones, and property (including art and jewelry that later found its way into the collection of Hermann Göring). Many of their friends and relatives were either killed by the Nazis or committed suicide.

Lilo Altmann and her uncle Fritz settled in Los Angeles with little, despite their high society life in Europe. They learned how to survive and thrive in America. Fritz's wife Maria Altmann successfully sued the Government of Austria to reclaim five family-owned paintings by the artist Gustav Klimt that were stolen by the Nazis during World War II. The 2015 movie *Woman In Gold* tells the story of Fritz Altman's paintings and Maria's efforts to get them back. The suit brought tens of millions of dollars to Mark's cousins, but not Mark. Why not? "Good question!"

Fritz was also the owner of one of the only four Stratovarius cellos ever made. It was also taken from him by Germans, but the cello, which would be priceless today, has never been found.
