This workbook is designed to guide you through the process, step-by-step, so you can create a ceremony that truly reflects your life and honours your wishes.

Inside, you'll find information to explore your preferences, from the kind of service you envision to the music and readings that hold special meaning.

By taking the time to plan ahead, you can ensure your loved ones are relieved of unnecessary burden during a difficult time. More importantly, you'll have peace of mind knowing your life will be celebrated in a way that feels authentic and personal.

02 THE DETAILS

First things first - what sort of funeral do you want?
Yep - we really are jumping straight in.

Traditionally in Australia, the internment of your body is either by burial in a casket or cremation. When it comes to the service, ceremony or celebration, more options are available.

- Burial: public cemetery, private land or burial at sea
- Cremation

The style of ceremony you choose has greater scope for personalisation and creativity:

- No fuss funerals - stripped back to the bare essentials, with or without a ceremony and mourners. Also called "Direct Cremation"
- Non-religious funerals:
 - Atheist / secular: no reference to the afterlife
 - Humanist: non-religious, and non-spiritual focusing on the life you led, your relationships and your legacy
 - Family-led: A more personal experience than someone who didn't know you but emotionally, may be difficult
- Spiritual funerals: based on your own beliefs
- Religious funerals: following traditional religious customs and practises
- Private funerals: by invitation only.

These decisions can be difficult for your loved ones to make if they have never been discussed. They have the potential to cause added stress and disagreement during a difficult time. So, even if this is all you do - it will undoubtedly be helpful.

Australian Law:

There are differences across the Australian states regarding local requirements, and laws regarding properly interring the deceased are very strict.

Check your state's regulations to determine what's allowed in your area.

Burial at sea or on private land has specific legal requirements.

Your Choices:

This is either the hardest or easiest part - depending on how you feel about it. This is the moment to put on your practical pants and outline the logistical components of your funeral.

03 SET THE SCENE

TO NE OF VOICE

Find Your Voice: Set the tone for your farewell

Planning your funeral is about creating an event that reflects your unique spirit. And just like your personality, your "farewell voice" can have a distinct tone. This section will help you define that tone, making it easier for those sharing stories and crafting your eulogy to capture your essence.

Consider these aspects:

- **Formal or informal:** Do you prefer a more traditional and dignified atmosphere, or something lighthearted and celebratory?
- **Humorous or reflective:** Would you like your service to have moments of laughter and joy, or a more contemplative and introspective feel?
- **Personal or universal:** Do you want the focus to be on your life story and experiences; or would you prefer readings and messages with a broader, more universal theme?

By defining your tone, you create a roadmap for others to follow. This ensures your farewell resonates not just with the stories shared, but also with the overall atmosphere – a true reflection of the unique person you are.

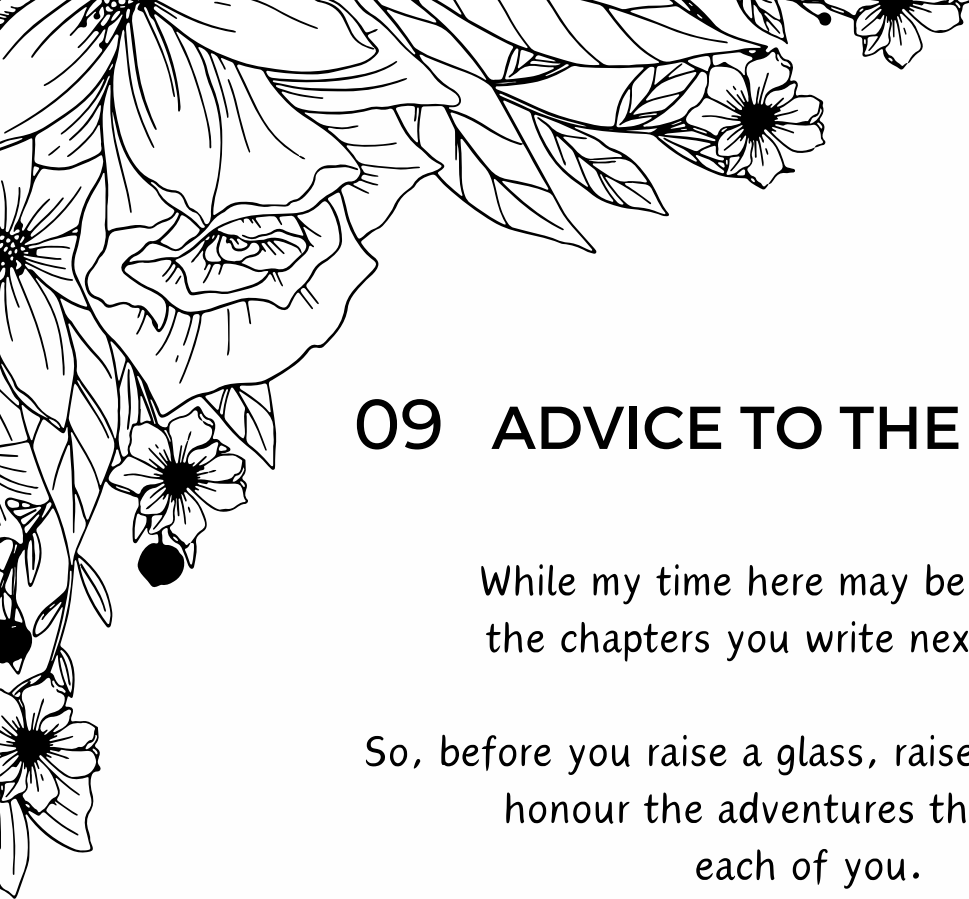

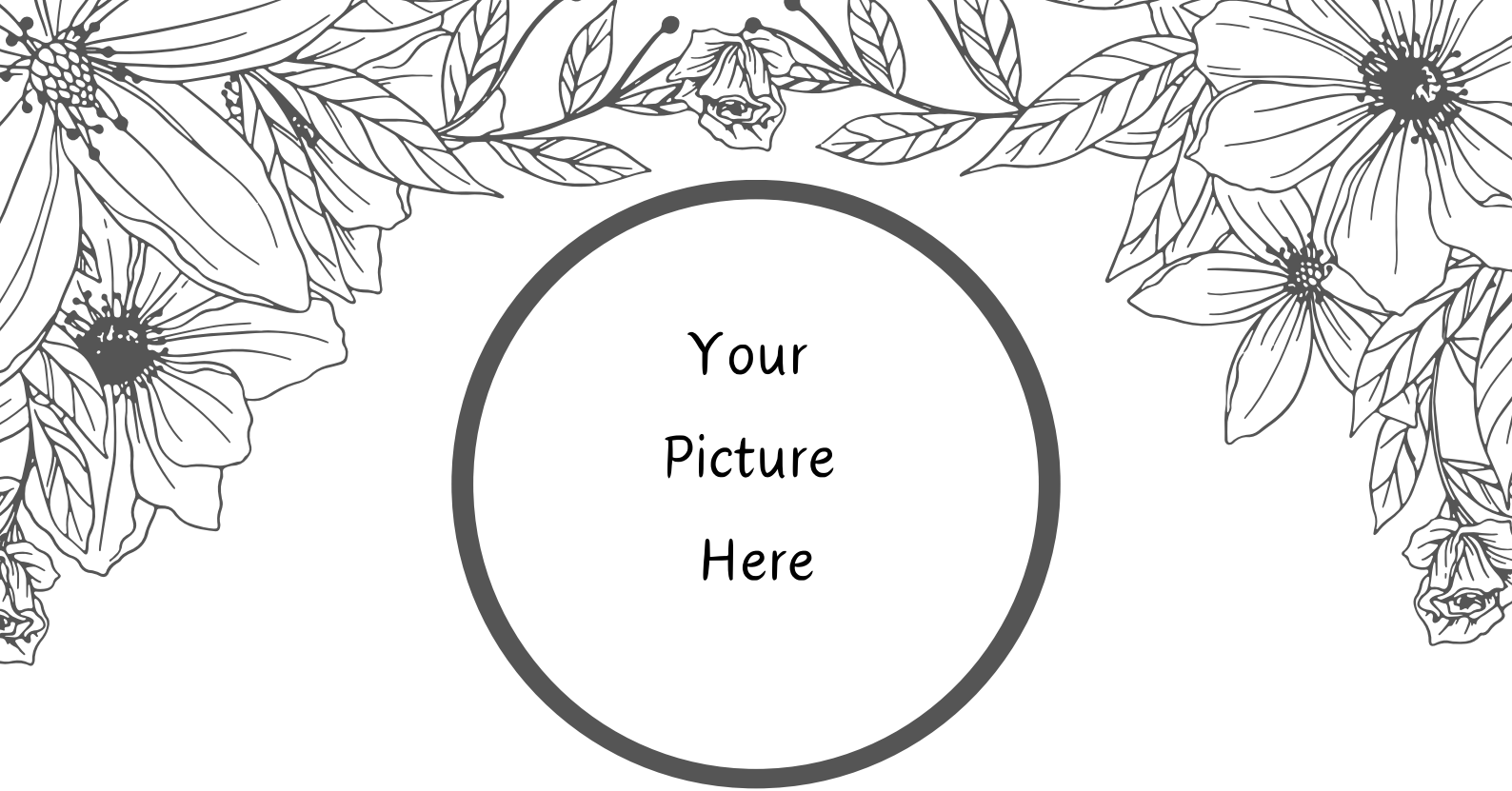

As the saying goes, “it’s your funeral”.

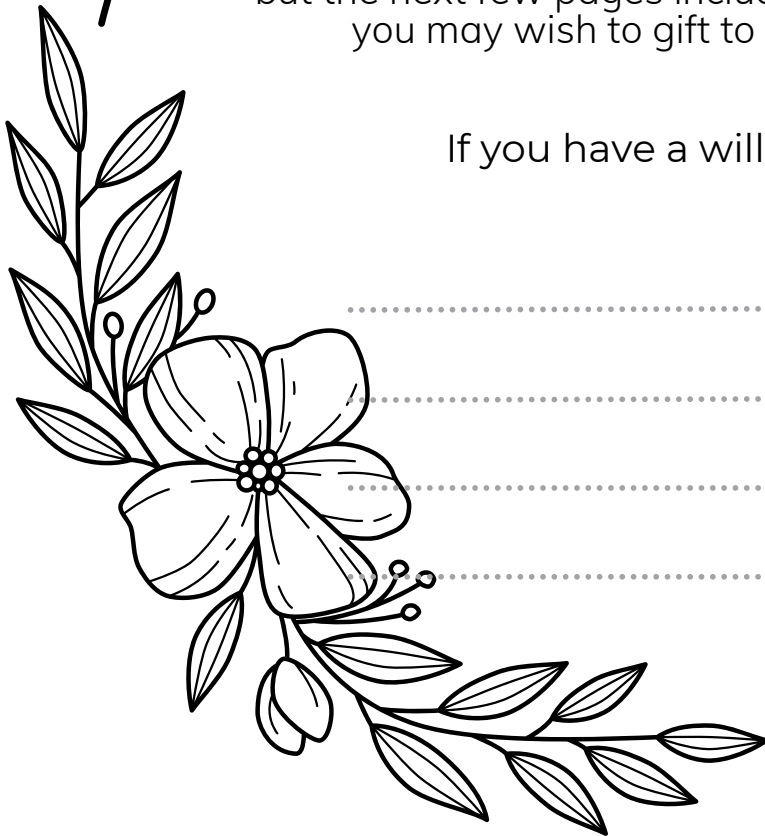

12 SOCIAL MEDIA

Whether you've been a frequent poster or a long-time lurker, decide what to do with your accounts.

The first decision is, do you want your accounts:

- Memorialised
- Deleted
- Left
- Don't care

Consider the security of your info - simply leaving accounts may be risky. If the account is to be deleted, check to allow for downloads/backups.

FACEBOOK

Settings & Privacy - allows you to download/transfer a copy of your information.

Nominate a legacy under: Profiles/personal details /account ownership and control/memorialisation or deactivation.

INSTAGRAM

Similar to Facebook, Instagram accounts can also be memorialised. If you don't want to share your login details, someone must contact IG with proof of your passing and request what they want to happen with the account.

LINKEDIN

LinkedIn accounts can also be memorialised. You can nominate authority to someone or, anyone can report your passing by providing specific documentation to memorialise the profile.

TIKTOK

TikTok does not offer a memorial option for a deceased user's account and only the account user can request it be deleted.

Snapchat will delete your account if they are provided a copy of your death certificate. Someone will need to submit a "contact us" form to request it.

At this time, Twitter only allows for deactivation/deletion of accounts. Similar to LinkedIn, anyone can request deactivation of the account with appropriate documents.

Best practice will be to provide a link to a Dropbox, Google drive or similar

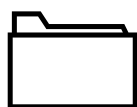
Label the Folder **"My Funeral Images"**

Pro tip: family and friends can access this to put together a collage of memories - saving them hours of hunting.

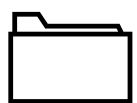

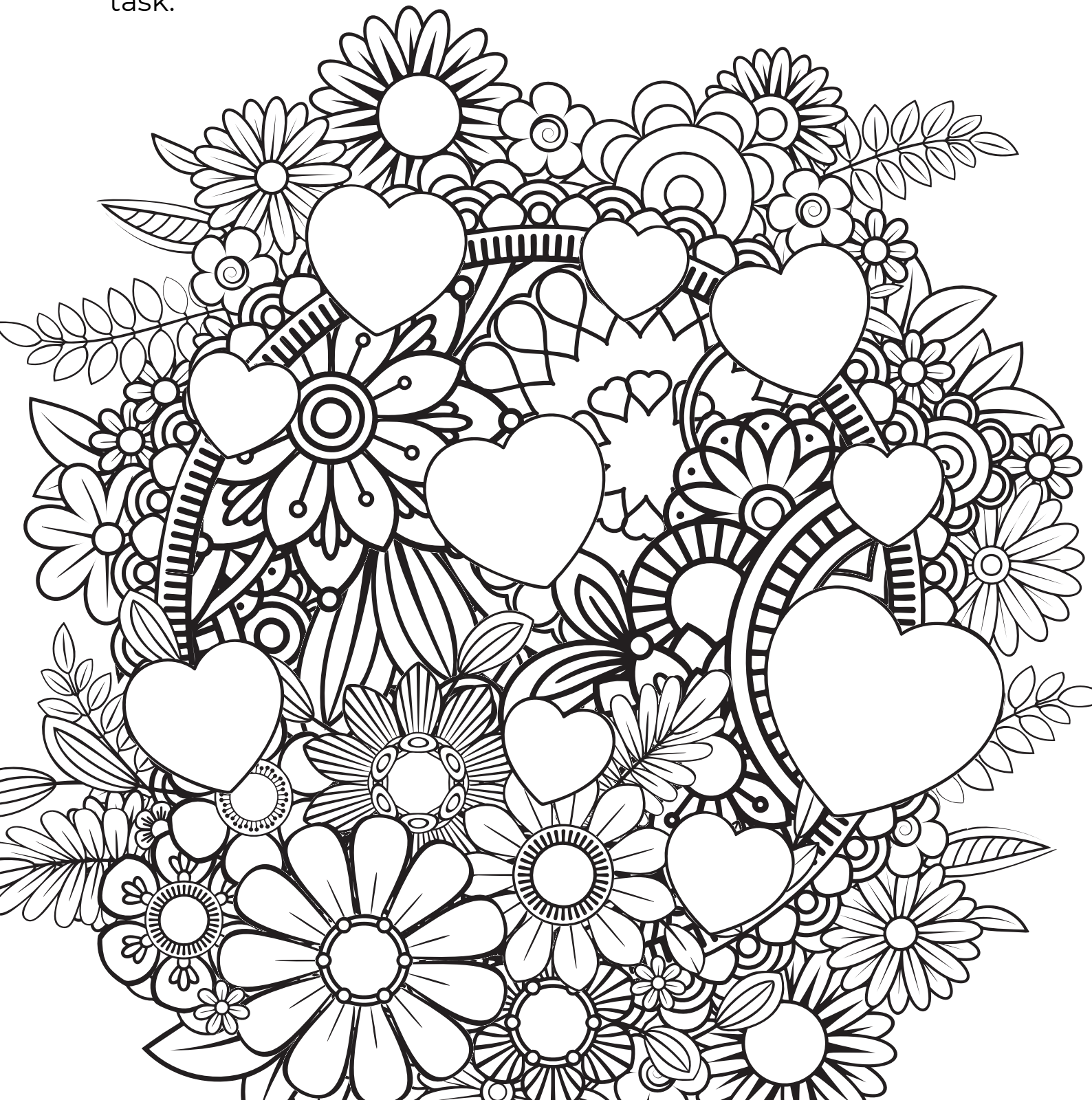


17 MINDFULNESS

For some people, completing this workbook will be a highly emotional process requiring deep thinking.

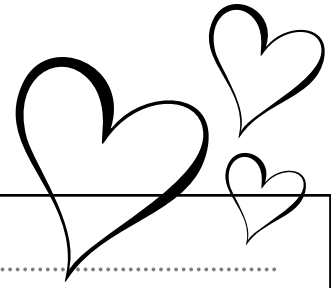
Colouring can help promote mindfulness and reduce anxiety helping you to focus on the present moment and task.

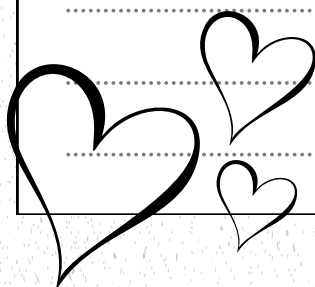
