#1	Passover	² This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell all the congregation of Israel ... every man shall take a lamb ... ⁶ and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight ... ¹¹ In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover. ¹² For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt ... And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you ... ²⁵ And when you come to the land that the LORD will give you, as he has promised, you shall keep this service. ²⁶ And when your children say to you, 'What do you mean by this service?' ²⁷ you shall say, 'It is the sacrifice of the LORD's Passover, for he passed over the houses of the people of Israel in Egypt, when he struck the Egyptians but spared our houses' ... ⁴² It was a night of watching by the LORD, to bring them out of the land of Egypt; so this same night is a night of watching kept to the LORD by all the people of Israel throughout their generations. 		¹⁵ You shall keep the Feast of Unleavened Bread ... at the appointed time in the month of Abib, for in it you came out of Egypt.	Exod. 23:15

#3	Firstfruits	⁹ And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, ¹⁰ “Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, When you come into the land that I give you and reap its harvest, you shall bring the sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest to the priest, ¹¹ and he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, so that you may be accepted ... ¹⁴ And you shall eat neither bread nor grain parched or fresh until this same day, until you have brought the offering of your God: it is a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings.”	Lev. 23:9-14

#4	Weeks / Pentecost	¹⁵ You shall count seven full weeks from the day after the Sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering. ¹⁶ You shall count fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath. Then you shall present a grain offering of new grain to the LORD. ¹⁷ You shall bring from your dwelling places two loaves of bread to be waved ... ²⁰ And the priest shall wave them with the bread of the firstfruits as a wave offering before the LORD	Lev. 23:15-22
		²² You shall observe the Feast of Weeks , the firstfruits of wheat harvest	Exod. 34:22a
		²⁶ On the day of the firstfruits, when you offer a grain offering of new grain to the Lord at your Feast of Weeks , you shall have a holy convocation.	Num. 28:26-31
		¹⁰ Then you shall keep the Feast of Weeks to the LORD ... ¹¹ And you shall rejoice before the LORD your God, you and your son and your daughter, your male servant and your female servant, the Levite who is within your towns, the sojourner, the fatherless, and the widow who are among you, at the place that the LORD your God will choose, to make his name dwell there. ¹² You shall remember that you were a slave in Egypt	Deut. 16:9-12
#5	Trumpets	In the seventh month ... you shall observe a day of solemn rest, a memorial proclaimed with blast of trumpets, a holy convocation.	Lev. 23:23-25
		¹ On the first day of the seventh month you shall have a holy convocation. You shall not do any ordinary work. It is a day for you to blow the trumpets	Num. 29:1-6
#6	Day of Atonement	¹⁵ Then he shall kill the goat of the sin offering that is for the people and bring its blood inside the veil and do with its blood as he did with the blood of the bull, sprinkling it over the mercy seat and in front of the mercy seat. ¹⁶ Thus he shall make atonement for the Holy Place, because of the uncleannesses of the people of Israel and because of their transgressions, all their sins ... ²¹ And Aaron shall lay both his hands on the head of the live goat, and confess over it all the iniquities of the people of Israel, and all their transgressions, all their sins. And he shall put them on the head of the goat and send it away into the wilderness ... ²² The goat shall bear all their iniquities on itself to a remote area ... ³⁰ For on this day shall atonement be made for you to cleanse you. 	On the fifteenth day of this seventh month and for seven days is the Feast of Booths to the Lord ... ³⁹ On the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the produce of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the LORD seven days ... ⁴⁰ And you shall take on the first day the fruit of splendid trees, branches of palm trees and boughs of leafy trees and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God seven days ... ⁴² You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All native Israelites shall dwell in booths, ⁴³ that your generations may know that I made the people of Israel dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt	Lev. 23:33-43
