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| 1:10—4:21 | <i>Divisions</i>         | <sup>11</sup> For it has been <b>reported</b> to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers ... each one of you says, "I follow Paul," or "I follow Apollos," or "I follow Cephas," or "I follow Christ." (1:11-12)                                                                                                        |
| 5:1-13    | <i>Sexual Immorality</i> | It is actually <b>reported</b> that there is sexual immorality among you, and of a kind that is not tolerated even among pagans, for a man has his father's wife. (5:1)                                                                                                                                                                              |
| 6:1-8     | <i>Lawsuits</i>          | When one of you has a grievance against another, does he dare go to law before the unrighteous instead of the saints? (6:1)                                                                                                                                                                                                                          |
| 6:9-20    | <i>Sexual Immorality</i> | <sup>12</sup> "All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be dominated by anything. <sup>13</sup> "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food" and "God will destroy both one and the other." The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord (6:12-13) |

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| 7:1-40     | <i>Marriage</i>                 | <sup>1</sup> Now <b>concerning</b> the matters about which you wrote: "It is good for a man not to have sexual relations with a woman" ... <sup>25</sup> Now <b>concerning</b> the betrothed... (7:1, 25)                                                        |
| 8:1—10:33  | <i>Food Sacrificed to Idols</i> | Now <b>concerning</b> food offered to idols... | 11:2-16    | <i>Head Coverings</i>           | Now I commend you because you remember me in everything and maintain the traditions even as I delivered them to you. | 11:17-34   | <i>Lord's Supper</i>            | <sup>17</sup> But in the following instructions I do not commend you, because when you come together ... <b>I hear that</b> ... it is not the Lord's supper that you eat. <sup>21</sup> For in eating ...
