- Thanking the Brownie for helping

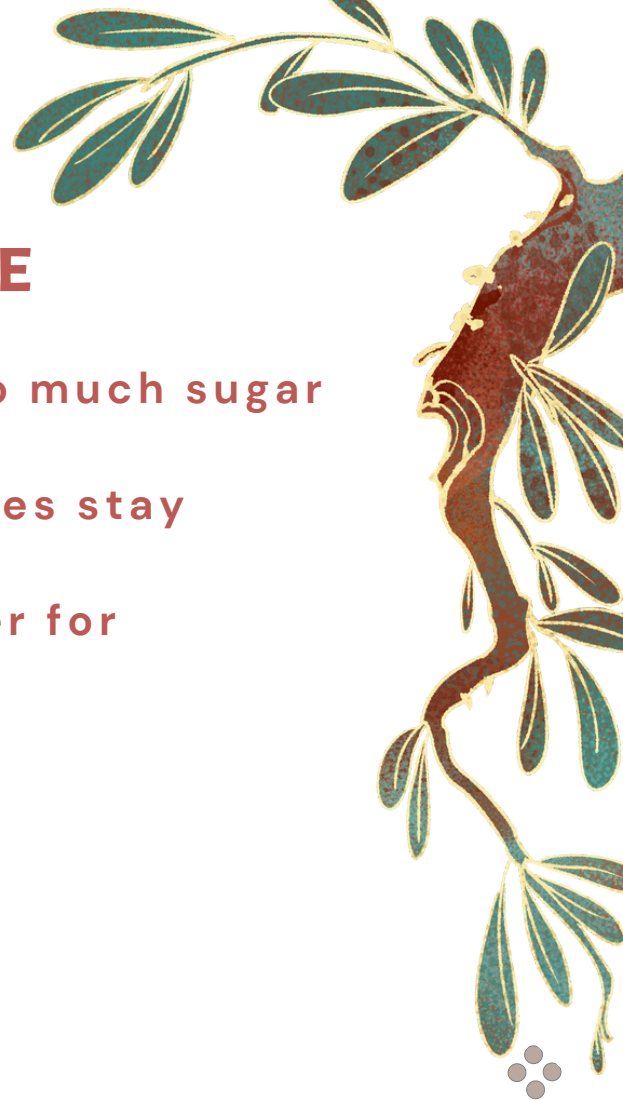
