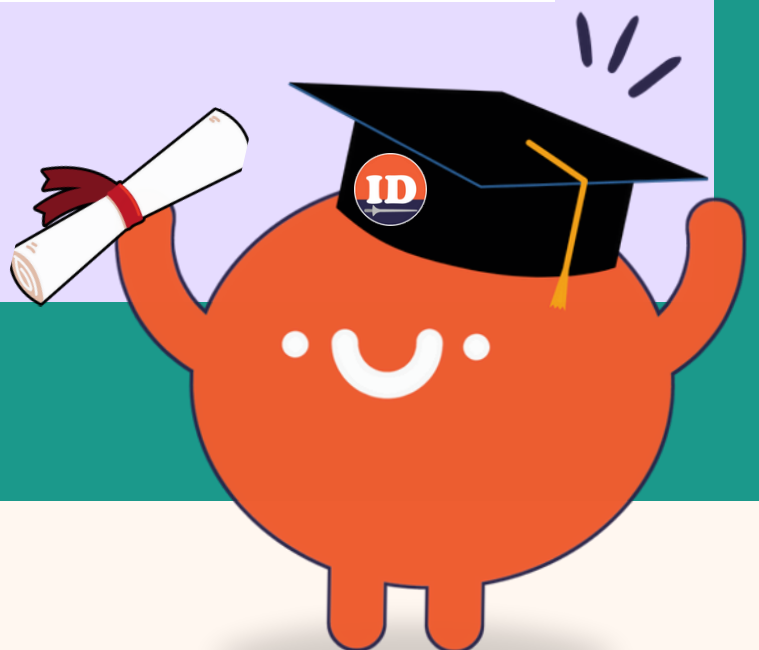


10 Simple Questions

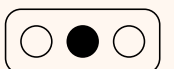
