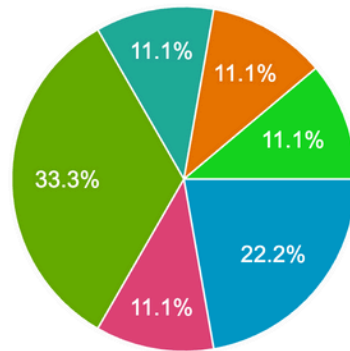

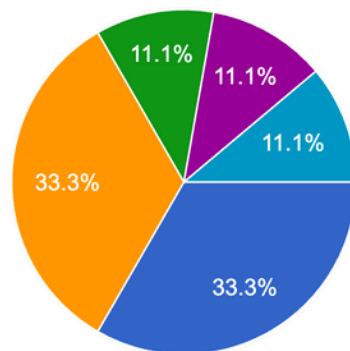


What industry are you in?



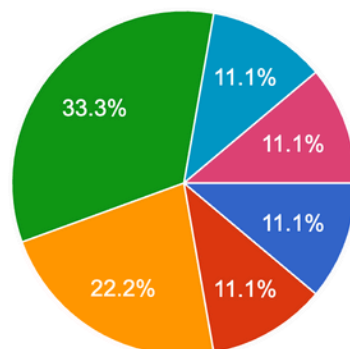
- Media/Entertainment

When are you most likely to look for instructional design support?



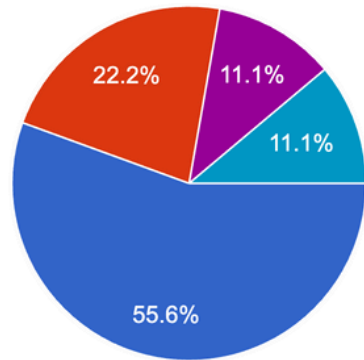
- January (Start of the year, planning for the year ahead)
