- ✓ Your messaging feels vague or generic
- ✓ You're unsure how your audience describes their problem

- ✓ Review the translated audience language

Launching does not mean:

- ✓ having everything figured out
- ✓ building a complex funnel
- ✓ being visible everywhere

Launching does mean:

- ✓ letting your idea exist outside your head
- ✓ sharing something simple
- ✓ getting feedback and learning as you go

At this stage, a launch can be:

- ✓ a single post
- ✓ a small test
- ✓ a quiet offer shared with a few people

Your first offer is a starting point - not a lifetime commitment.

Once you've shaped your message and offer, your next step is sharing it and learning from real-world feedback.

Some people are comfortable doing that on their own. Others prefer structure, accountability, or guidance as they move forward.
