

5-Day Islamic Homeschool Kickstart Checklist



Homeschool & Hijrah

Day 1 – Ground Yourself with Intention & Prayer

- Make du‘a for guidance and barakah in your homeschool journey.
- Renew your niyyah: Homeschool to please Allah and protect your children’s deen.
- Read and reflect on Surah Al-‘Alaq (96:1–5) about the importance of knowledge.
- Write down your homeschooling goals: spiritual, academic, and personal.



Day 2 – Set Up the Learning Environment

- Choose a dedicated learning space (a corner, desk, or floor area).
- Gather basic supplies: Qur'an, notebooks, pens, whiteboard, and storage bins.
- Place Islamic reminders (du'a posters, Qur'an verses) in the space.
- Organize a small bookshelf for Islamic and academic resources.



Day 3 – Build Your Core Curriculum Plan

- Select Islamic studies focus: Qur'an memorization, tafsir, aqeedah, and seerah.
- Choose secular subjects: Math, reading, writing, and science.
- Add Arabic; this is the foundational language of Islam.
- Decide on your daily balance: Islamic subjects first, then academics.
- Print or create a simple weekly timetable. (Invest in a laminator. It will save you time & money.)

Day 4 – Create Your Routine & Schedule

- Fix daily Qur'an time (morning is best).
- Plan salah breaks and family circle reminders of hadith/du'a.
- Schedule 2–3 academic blocks with short breaks.
- Add outdoor/nature time for physical activity and reflection.
- Keep it flexible—start with short lessons and grow gradually.



Day 5 – Begin & Stay Consistent

- Start your first official homeschool day with Bismillah.
- Keep lessons short and positive to build confidence.
- Use storytelling and hands-on activities to make learning enjoyable.
- End the day with reflection:
“What did we learn today for Allah’s sake?”
- Stay patient—remember the hadith:



The most beloved deeds to
