Chapter 1 – The Invitation

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever felt a nudge to step away from the life you've built... even though it looked fine on the outside?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob receives a mysterious invitation that disrupts his comfort zone. It's a reminder that God's first move is often to awaken us—not to improve our current system, but to call us into a new way of living.

Reflection Prompt:

- What “invitations” has God placed in your path that you've ignored or postponed?
- What fears or excuses have kept you from saying yes?

Scripture Anchor:

“Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men.” — Matthew 4:19

📌 Action Prompt:

Write down one area of life where you sense God inviting you into more. Identify one step you can take toward saying yes this week.

Chapter 2 – The Map You Were Handed

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever realized you've been following a plan for life that someone else gave you—without questioning if it's from God?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob discovers the “map” he’s been using—shaped by culture, religion, and family tradition— isn’t leading him where God wants him to go. Many of us live by inherited expectations rather than God’s blueprint.

Reflection Prompt:

- Who or what has influenced your life map the most?
- How do those directions align with God’s Word?

Scripture Anchor:

“Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.” — Psalm 119:105

✍️ Action Prompt:

Draw two maps: one of your current path and one that represents where you believe God is leading you. What needs to change?

Chapter 3 – The Mountain of Performance

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever worked harder and harder for approval, yet felt emptier and emptier?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob tries to climb the “Mountain of Approval,” thinking more effort will win acceptance. Instead, he finds only exhaustion. True identity and peace aren’t earned—they’re received by grace.

Reflection Prompt:

- Where in your life are you still climbing for worth or validation?
- How would your daily life change if you truly believed you already belong?

Scripture Anchor:

“He has made us accepted in the Beloved.” — Ephesians 1:6

Action Prompt:

List one lie you’ve believed about needing to “earn” your place with God, and write the truth that replaces it. Example:

- Lie: “I have to prove myself to be loved.”
 - Truth: “I’m already loved without conditions.”

Chapter 4 – The Whisperer

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever noticed a quiet inner voice that constantly reminds you of your failures or limitations?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob becomes aware of “The Whisperer”—a voice feeding him lies about who he is and what he’s capable of. It’s the same with us: these whispers often masquerade as our own thoughts but keep us chained to false identity.

Reflection Prompt:

- What are some recurring negative thoughts you’ve battled?
- How do these align—or conflict—with what God says about you?

Scripture Anchor:

“For as he thinks in his heart, so is he.” — Proverbs 23:7

Action Prompt:

Write down two lies you’ve heard from “the whisperer” and next to each one, write a scripture-based truth to replace it.

Chapter 5 – The Wounded Path

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever realized that a past hurt still shapes how you make decisions today?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob’s journey reveals wounds he’s carried for years—wounds that subtly detour him from trusting God fully. Unhealed pain becomes an invisible compass pointing us in the wrong direction.

Reflection Prompt:

- What’s one past hurt that still affects you?
- How might God want to meet you in that wound?

Scripture Anchor:

“He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.” — Psalm 147:3

Action Prompt:

Identify one wound and invite God to bring truth and healing to it this week. Journal what you sense Him saying.

Chapter 6 – The Encounter

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever had a moment when your perception of God was completely transformed?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob meets God in a way that dismantles his view of Him as a distant judge. This encounter shifts everything—his climb, his identity, and his purpose.

Reflection Prompt:

- How has your view of God changed over the years?
- What might He be inviting you to see about His nature today?

Scripture Anchor:

“Anyone who has seen Me has seen the Father.” — John 14:9

Action Prompt:

Spend 10 minutes in prayer, asking God to reveal His heart for you. Write down any impressions or scriptures that come to mind.

Chapter 7 – The Great Exchange

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

What if you could trade every label and limitation you've carried for the identity Jesus gives you?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob experiences a symbolic exchange—laying down the false identity he's carried and receiving Christ's wholeness. This isn't self-improvement; it's complete transformation.

Reflection Prompt:

- What false labels or self-definitions have you carried?
- How would life change if you truly lived from your God-given identity?

Scripture Anchor:

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.” — 2 Corinthians 5:17

✍️ Action Prompt:

Write a declaration beginning with: “In Christ, I am...” Fill it with identity truths from scripture.

Chapter 8 – The Valley of Decision

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever had to choose between what's familiar and what's true?

Key Insight from The Call:

Even after encountering truth, Bob must decide whether to keep living by the old map or step fully into his new identity. Our greatest battles often come after breakthrough.

Reflection Prompt:

- Where in your life are you tempted to return to old patterns?
- What would it take to choose God's truth consistently?

Scripture Anchor:

“Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve.” — Joshua 24:15

Action Prompt:

List one practical step you can take this week to walk in your new identity when pressure comes.

Chapter 9 – The Journey Together

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Who has walked alongside you in your faith journey—and how has that shaped your growth?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob learns that transformation accelerates in community. Isolation slows growth; Kingdom life is meant to be shared.

Reflection Prompt:

- How connected are you to others who can speak truth into your life?
- What would it look like to intentionally walk with someone else this season?

Scripture Anchor:

“As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another.” — Proverbs 27:17

Action Prompt:

Reach out to one person this week to pray with or share what God is doing in your life.

Chapter 10 – The Call Continues

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Do you see God’s call as a one-time moment or an ongoing journey?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob realizes that answering God’s call isn’t the end—it’s the beginning of a lifelong adventure of alignment with His design.

Reflection Prompt:

- Where is God calling you to grow or step out next?
- How can you stay sensitive to His ongoing invitations?

Scripture Anchor:

“The path of the righteous is like the morning sun, shining ever brighter till the full light of day.” — Proverbs 4:18

Action Prompt:

Write down one area where you sense God’s next “call” and one step you will take toward it this month.

Chapter 11 – The Crossroads

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever faced a decision that you knew would change your life forever?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob comes to a fork in the road where he must choose between the narrow way of trust or the wide road of self-reliance. Following God’s path often means letting go of control.

Reflection Prompt:

- What “crossroads” moments have you faced recently?
- How can you discern God’s path when both options seem reasonable?

Scripture Anchor:

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding.” — Proverbs 3:5

Action Prompt:

Write down an area where you’re wrestling with a decision. Pray over it daily this week, asking God for clarity and courage.

Chapter 12 – The Breaking Point

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever reached a point where you couldn't keep going the way you were?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob hits emotional and spiritual exhaustion—realizing that sometimes God allows us to come to the end of ourselves so He can be our true strength.

Reflection Prompt:

- When have you experienced a personal “breaking point”?
- How did God meet you there?

Scripture Anchor:

“My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness.” — 2 Corinthians 12:9

Action Prompt:

List one area where you feel weak or drained. Ask God to show you how His strength can carry you through it.

Chapter 13 – The Voice of Truth

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

How do you know when it's God's voice and not just your own thoughts or emotions?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob learns to distinguish the life-giving, freeing voice of God from the condemning whispers of fear and shame. Truth always aligns with God's Word and character.

Reflection Prompt:

- What helps you recognize God's voice?
- What voices do you need to tune out in this season?

Scripture Anchor:

“My sheep listen to My voice; I know them, and they follow Me.” — John 10:27

✍️ Action Prompt:

Set aside 10 minutes each day this week to be still and listen for God's direction. Write down what you sense.

Chapter 14 – The Release

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

What’s the hardest thing God has ever asked you to let go of?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob surrenders the last remnants of his self-directed life. Release isn’t loss—it’s the doorway to freedom and Kingdom abundance.

Reflection Prompt:

- What are you holding onto that’s keeping you from moving forward?
- How could letting go open the door to something better?

Scripture Anchor:

“Whoever loses their life for Me will find it.” — Matthew 16:25

Action Prompt:

Write down one thing you sense God asking you to release. Commit to an act of surrender this week.

Chapter 15 – The Gift of Rest

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Do you find it easier to work for God than to rest with Him?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob discovers that Kingdom living flows from rest, not striving. Rest is trust in action—it's believing that God is working even when you aren't.

Reflection Prompt:

- What keeps you from resting in God's presence?
- How might embracing rest actually increase your fruitfulness?

Scripture Anchor:

“Be still, and know that I am God.” — Psalm 46:10

📌 Action Prompt:

Block off one hour this week to spend with God with no agenda—just being present with Him.

Chapter 16 – The Open Door

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever sensed God opening a door you didn't expect?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob encounters an opportunity that perfectly aligns with his new identity. God's open doors often require courage to walk through.

Reflection Prompt:

- What doors might God be opening in your life right now?
- How can you prepare yourself to step through them in faith?

Scripture Anchor:

“I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut.” — Revelation 3:8

Action Prompt:

Identify one “open door” opportunity and take one faith step toward it this week.

Chapter 17 – The Resistance

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever stepped out in faith only to face immediate pushback?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob learns that resistance often confirms he's on the right path. Opposition can be a sign that the enemy fears your progress.

Reflection Prompt:

- What resistance are you facing in your walk right now?
- How can you respond without losing heart?

Scripture Anchor:

“Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.” — James 4:7

Action Prompt:

Write down one area of resistance and three practical ways to stand firm in God's truth.

Chapter 18 – The Breakthrough

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

When was the last time you experienced a sudden, God-orchestrated breakthrough?

Key Insight from The Call:

After seasons of preparation and surrender, Bob sees tangible fruit and freedom. Breakthrough is rarely instant—it’s the visible tipping point of hidden faithfulness.

Reflection Prompt:

- What long-standing prayer or struggle are you trusting God to break through?
- How can you celebrate small victories along the way?

Scripture Anchor:

“Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit.” — Zechariah 4:6

Action Prompt:

List one breakthrough you’re praying for. Find a verse to declare over it daily this week.

Chapter 19 – The Return

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Have you ever been sent back to a place or people from your past with a new perspective?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob returns to familiar surroundings, but this time with a transformed heart. Sometimes God sends us back, not to resume old patterns, but to bring light into them.

Reflection Prompt:

- Where might God be sending you back with a renewed mission?
- How will you guard your new identity in an old environment?

Scripture Anchor:

“You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden.” — Matthew 5:14

Action Prompt:

Write down one way you can bring Kingdom light into a familiar place this week.

Chapter 20 – The Commission

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

What would it look like if you fully stepped into the mission God has for you?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob is commissioned to carry the message forward. Every believer is called to reflect Christ in their sphere of influence.

Reflection Prompt:

- Who in your life needs the hope and truth you carry?
- How can you share it in a way that's natural and Spirit-led?

Scripture Anchor:

“Go and make disciples of all nations...” — Matthew 28:19

Action Prompt:

Choose one person to encourage or share your testimony with this week.

Chapter 21 – The Call Continues (Finale)

Opening Question (Group or Personal):

Do you see your calling as something you “finish” or something you live out daily?

Key Insight from The Call:

Bob realizes the journey is ongoing—every day brings fresh opportunities to live from identity and invite others into the same freedom.

Reflection Prompt:

- What does it mean to you to “live called” every day?
- How can you remain sensitive to God’s voice going forward?

Scripture Anchor:

“I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.” —
Philippians 3:14

Action Prompt:

Write a personal mission statement summarizing how you will live out your calling in this season.
