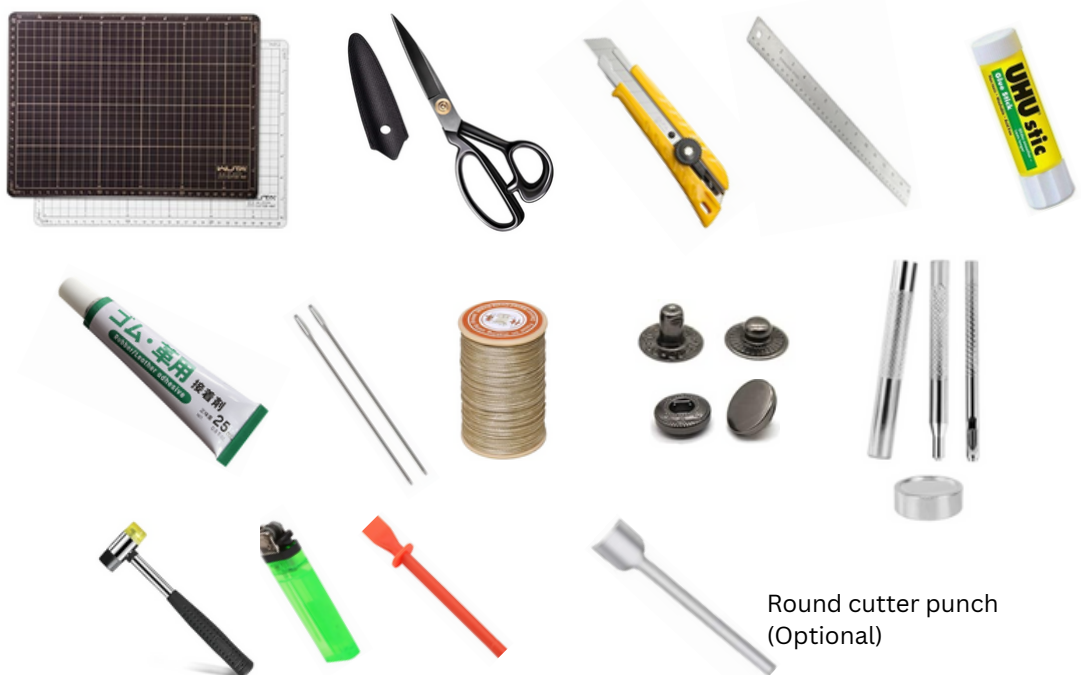

02 Materials & Tools

Main material: One (1) piece of Chrome leather, 17 x25CM
thickness: 1.5mm / 4Oz

One (1) piece of extra soft sheep/goat skin leather,
13 x 9CM
thickness: 0.4mm / 1Oz

Accessories: Self healing cutting map
Scissors, Utility Knife, Metal ruler
A4 Thick Cardstock
Glue
Leather adhesive and Spreader
Waxed Thread (0.5mm), Needle for leathercraft x2
Metal snap button x 1 pair (size: 12mm), and it's
Fasteners Kit
Mallet, Lighter



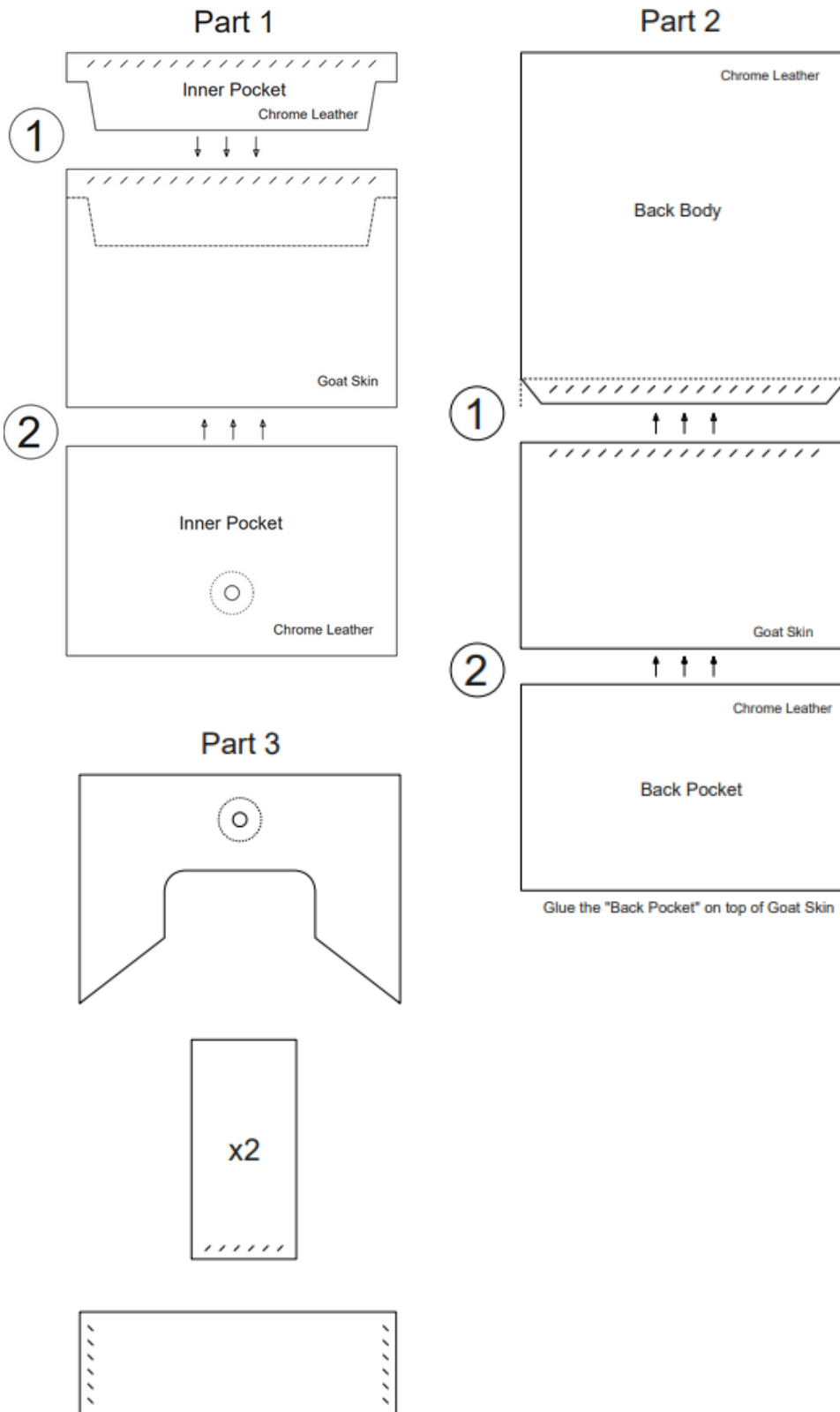
~ Single hole puncher (1.0mm) -for stitching holes
or you can use chisel prong (4mm distance)

4.11 Cut the pattern out using scissors / pen knife on the self healing cutting map.



Paper Patterns on thick cardstock.

4.12 Prepare Soft chrome-tanned leather 1.5mm / 4 oz and extra soft goatskin leather 0.4mm / 1 oz.

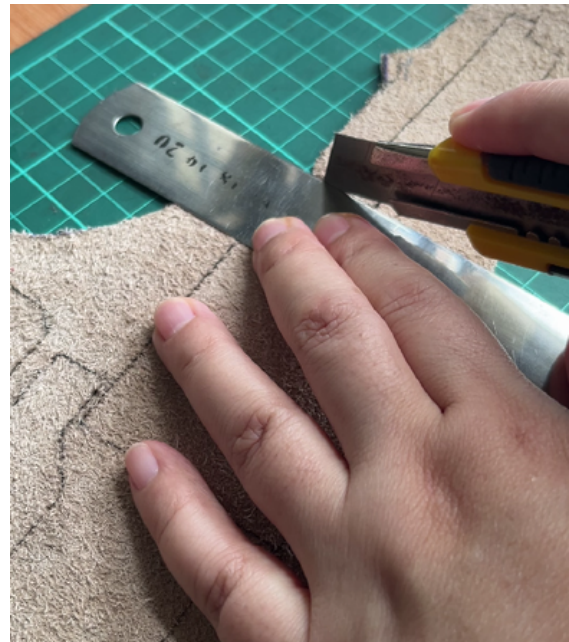


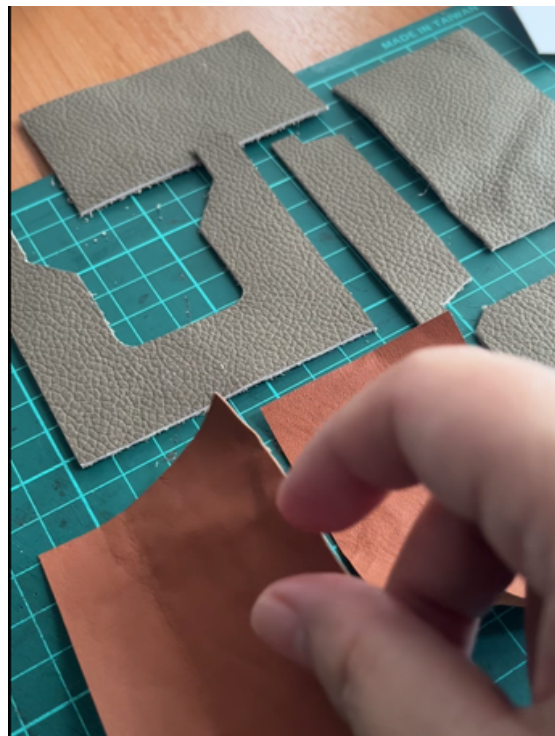

4.13 Flip the chrome leather and paper pattern over, then trace the pattern onto the back of the chrome leather.



4.14 Next, cut the leather along the traced pattern lines using scissors and utility knife.

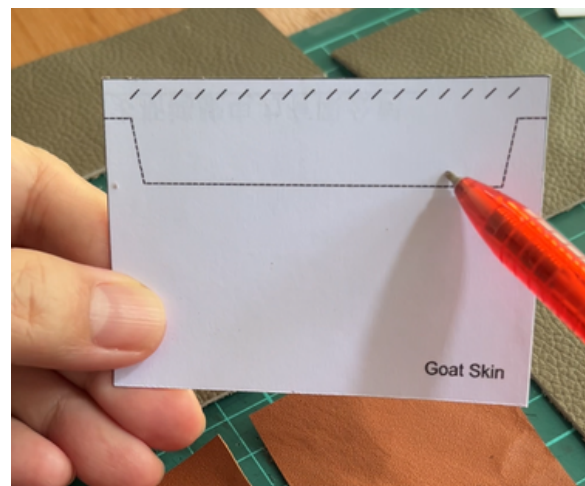
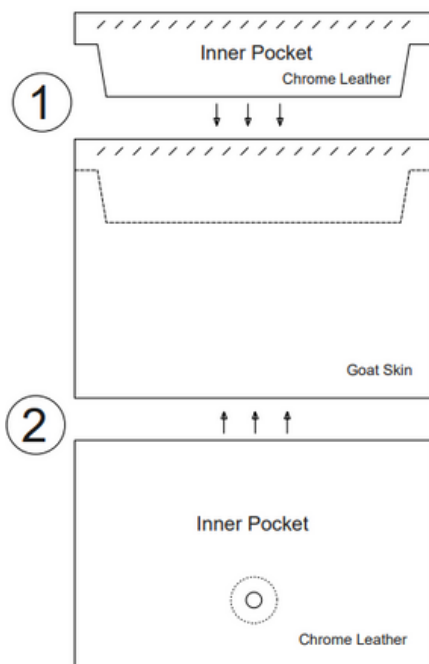


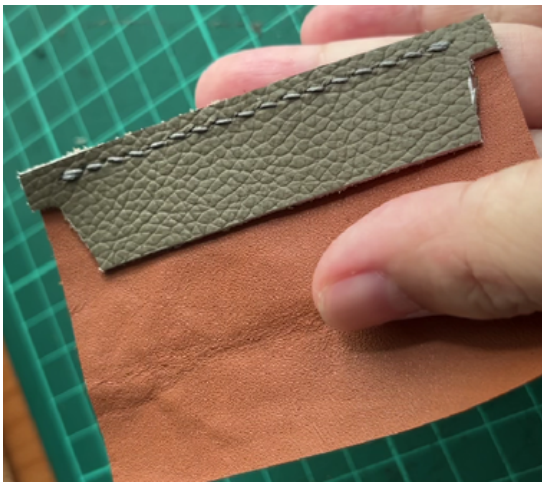
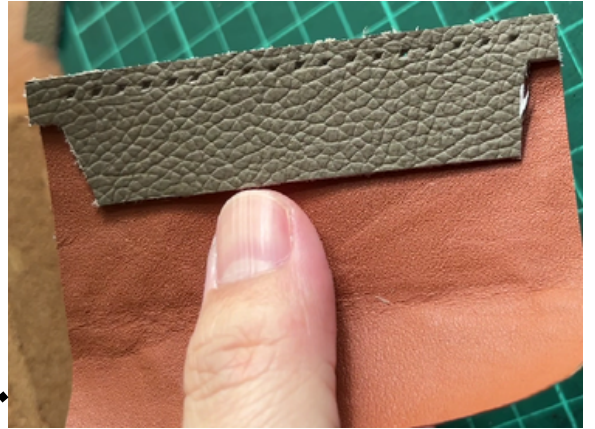
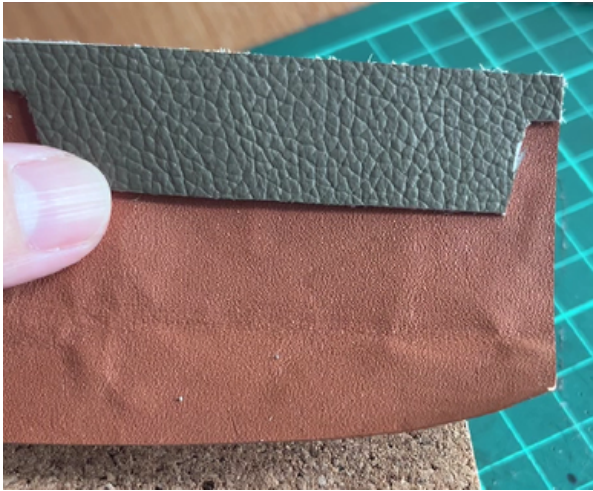
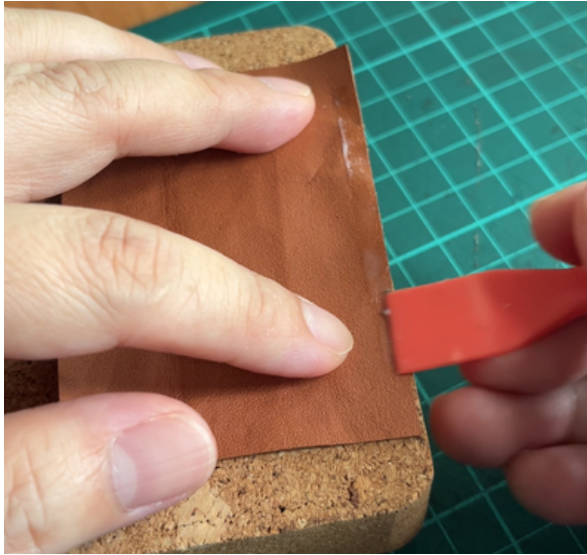

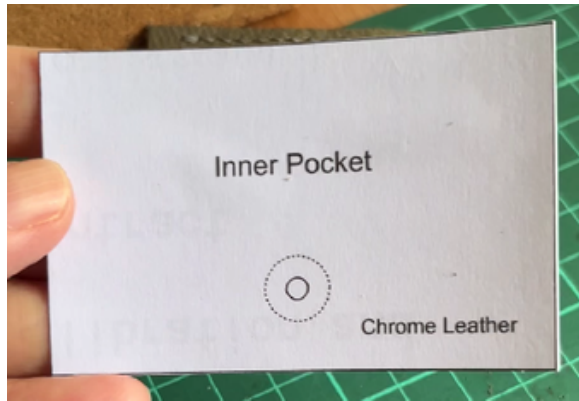
4.14 Next, we will create part 1 of the purse.

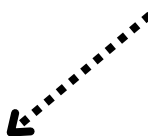
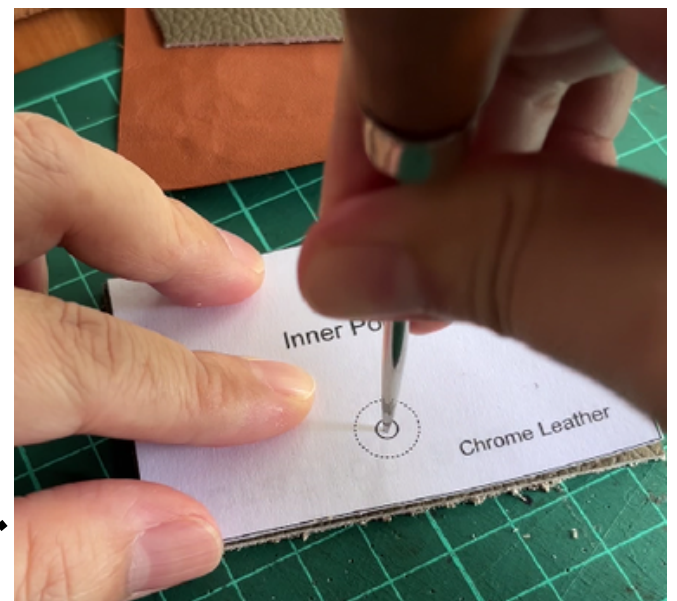




4.15 Next, we will install the snap button on inner pocket.

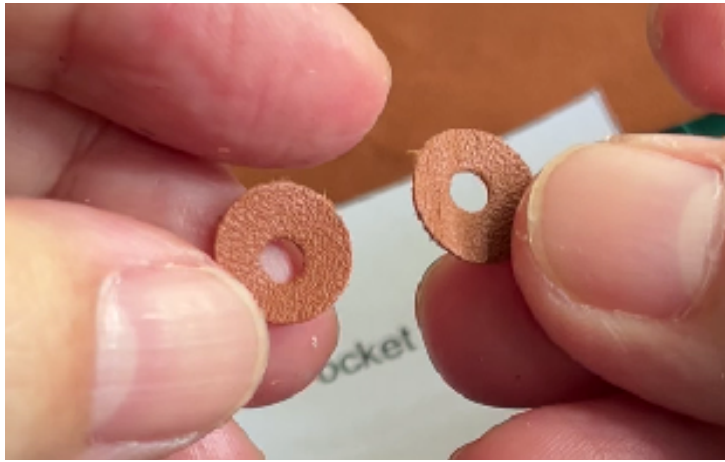


Put the inner pocket pattern on the inner pocket chrome-tanned leather piece to mark the location of snap button.

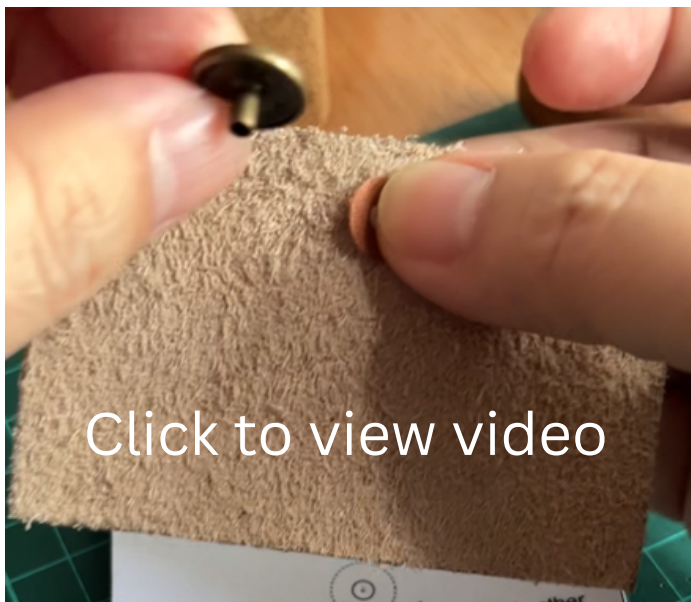


4.16 Next, we install the snap button.

As the chrome-tanned leather is soft, I have prepared these round leather pieces to serve as an enforcement.

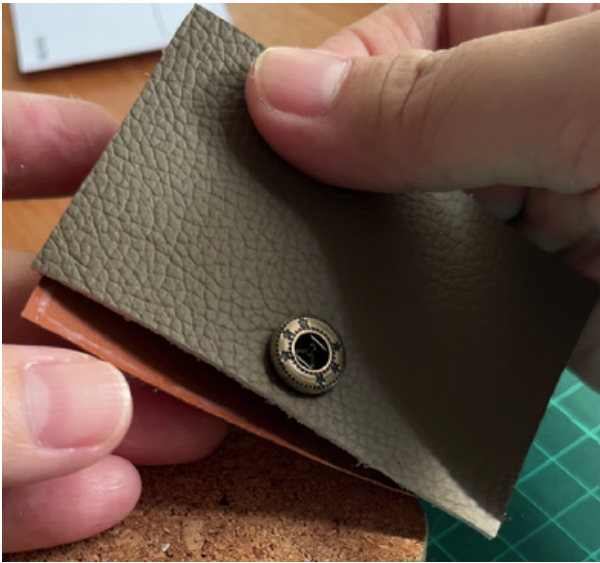
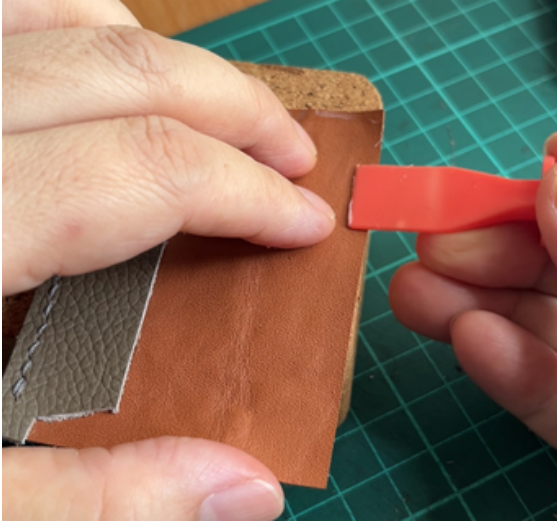

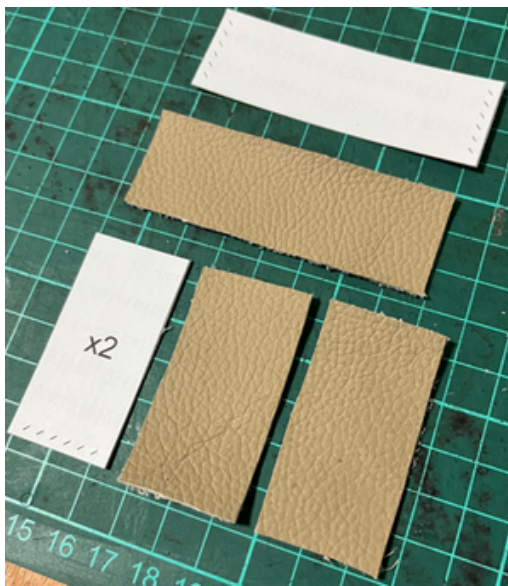
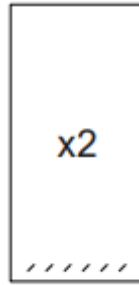


4.16 Next, we glue the inner pocket leather pieces together.





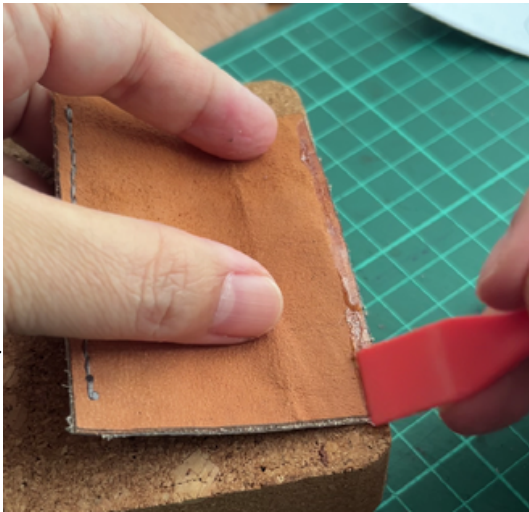
4.17 Next, let's work on the gusset.

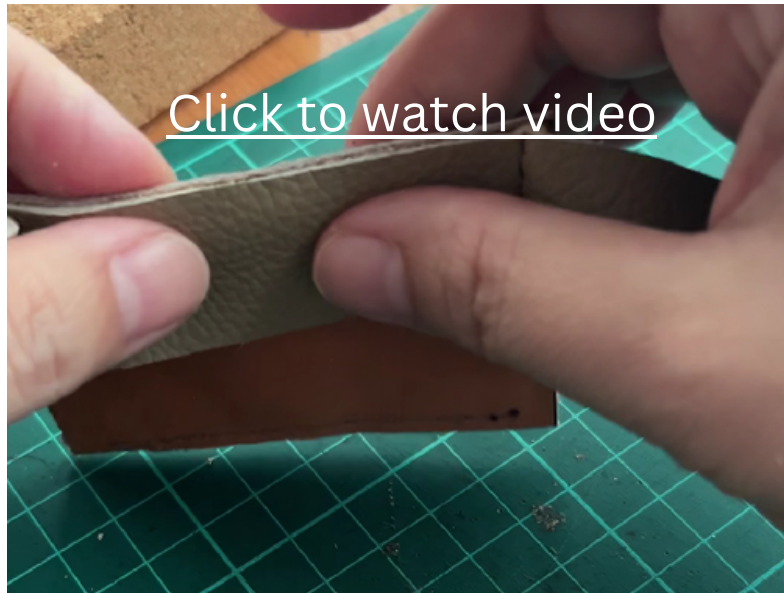


Sew the gusset leather pieces together the same way they look in the photo.



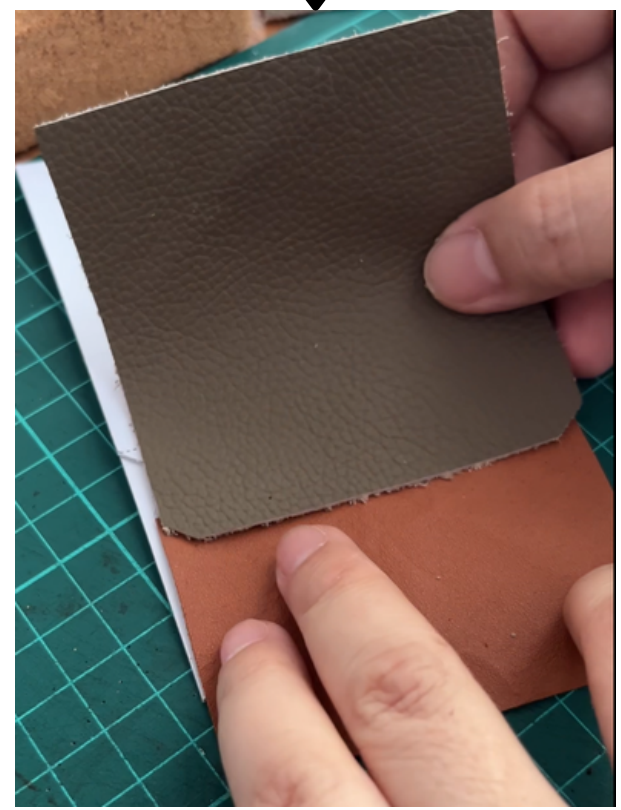
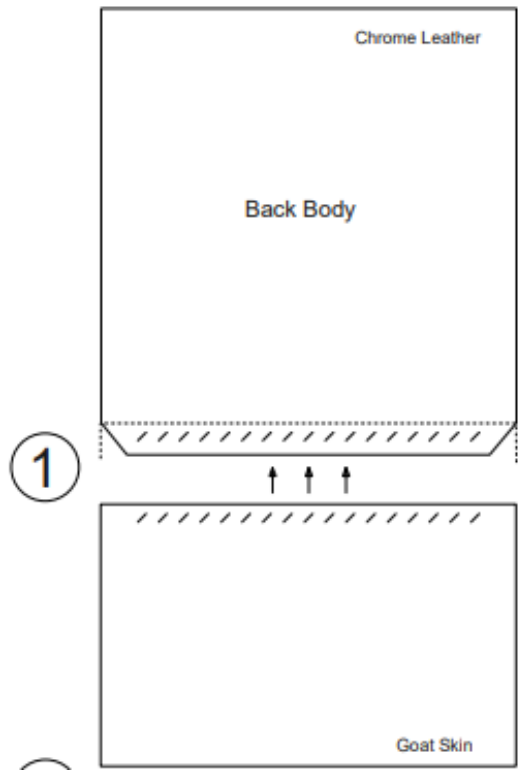
4.18 Next, we will glue the gusset and the inner pocket together.



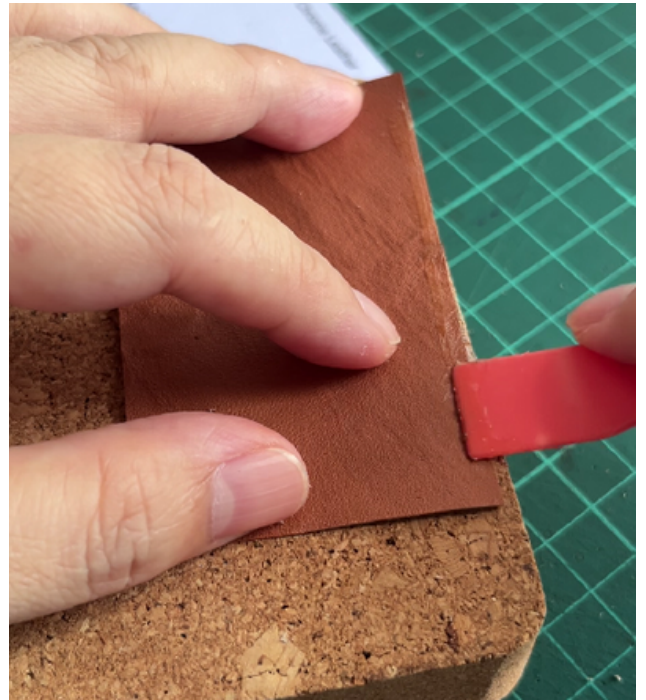


4.19 Next, we will process Part 2.

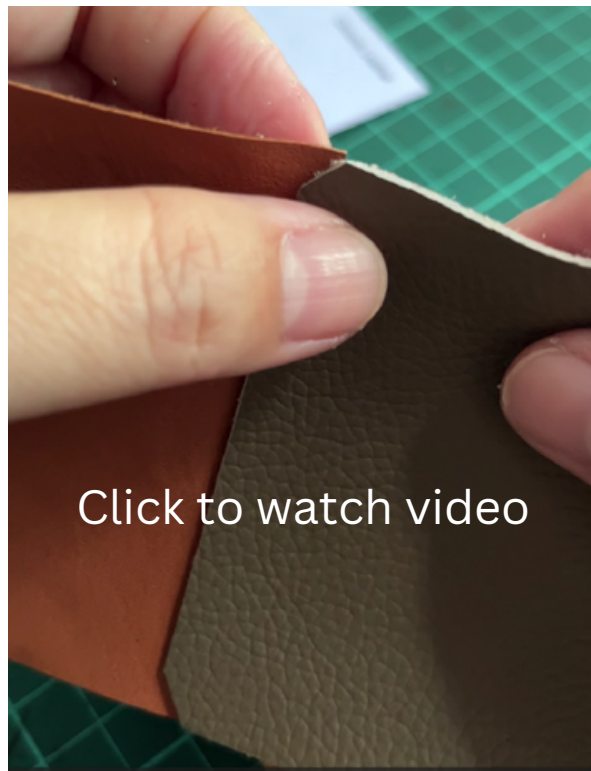

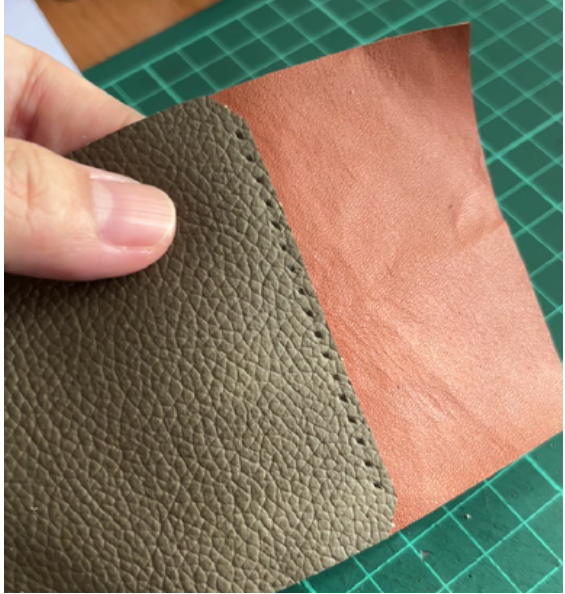
4.20 Apply glue on the back of "back body", also on the goat skin.



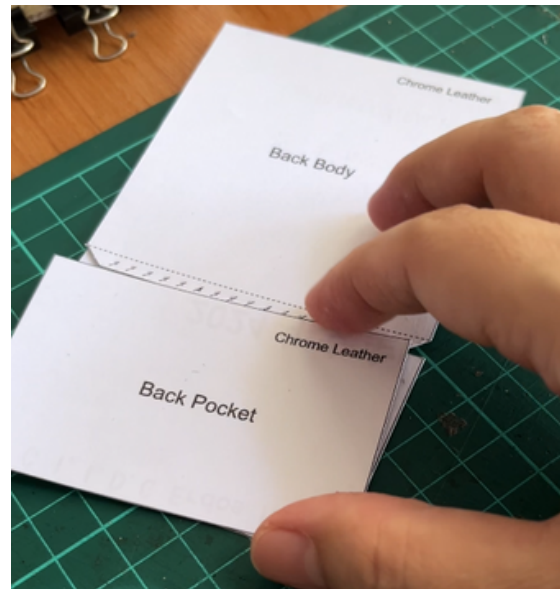
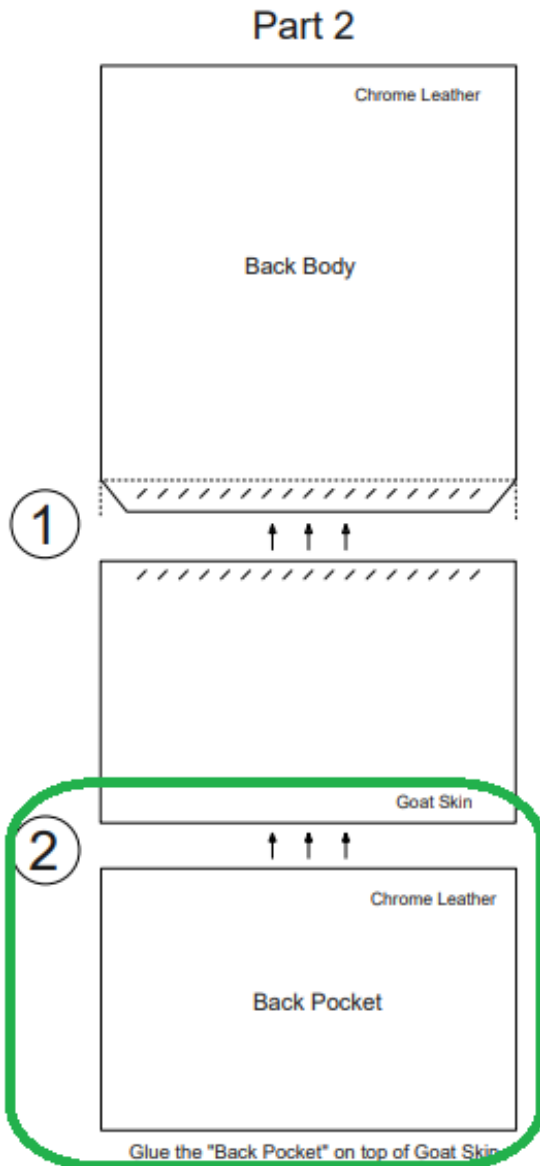

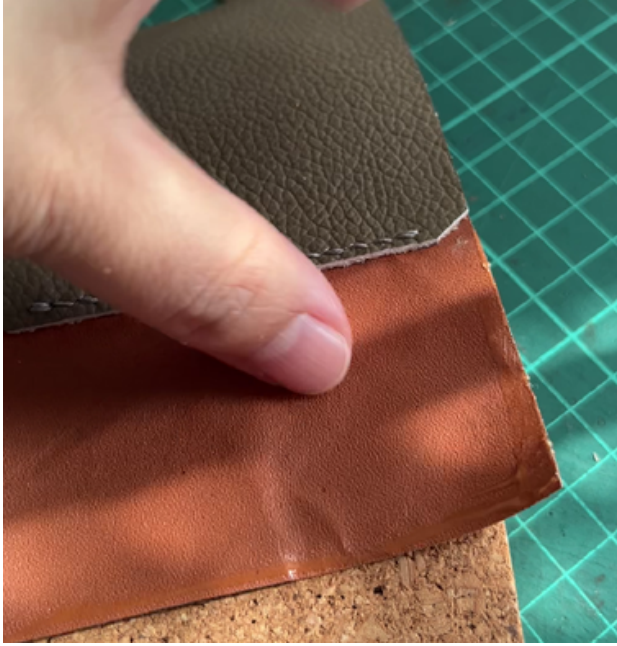
4.22 next, mark and make stitch holes.



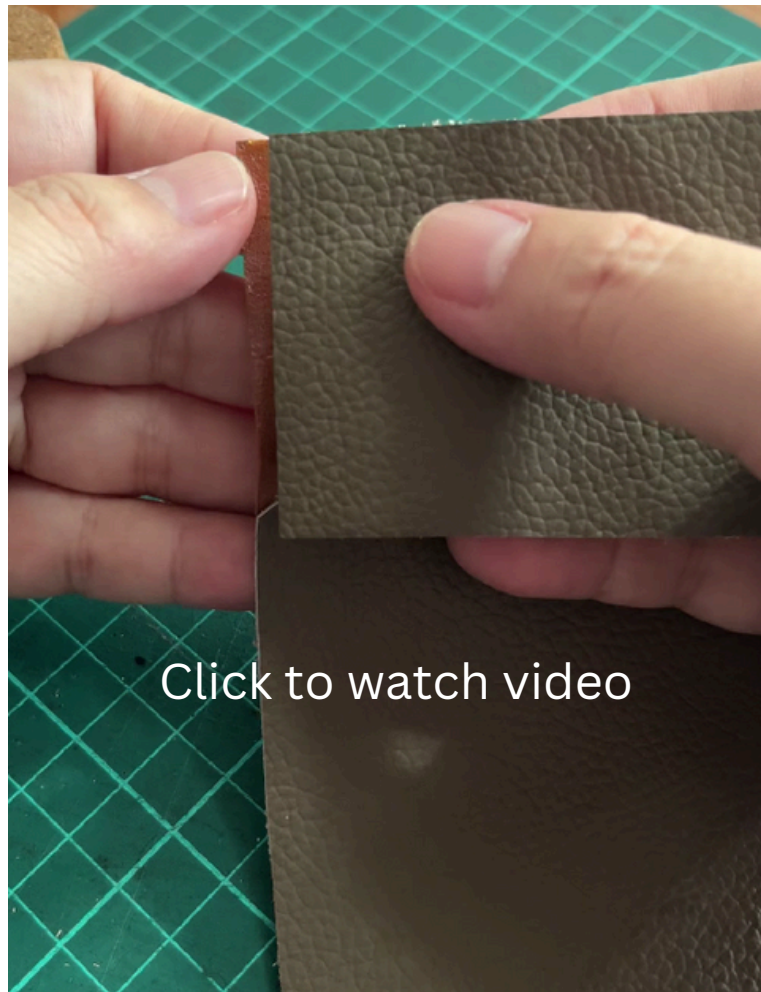
4.23 Now, we will process Part2. Install Back Pocket.



4.24 Apply glue – Back pocket and goat skin.

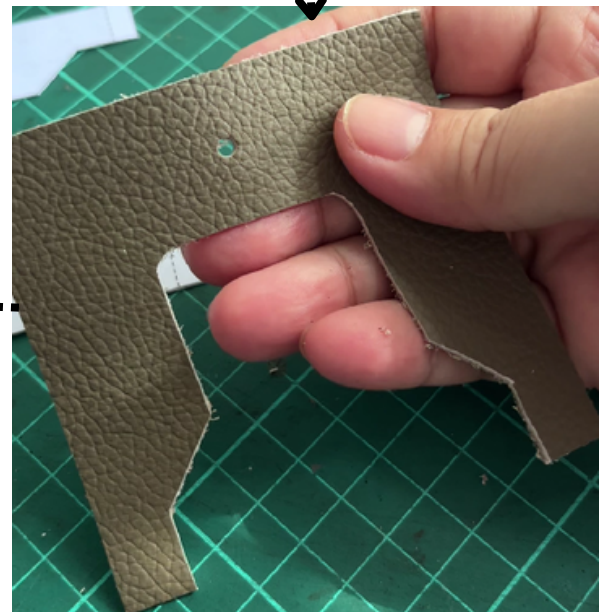
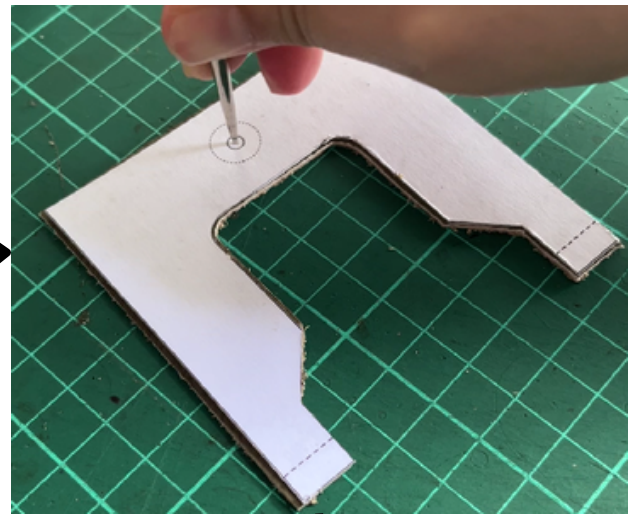
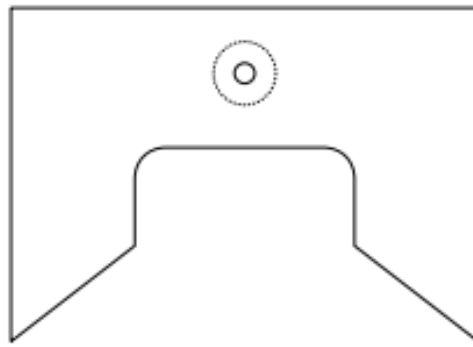

4.27 Next, we will make corner for purse and mark stitching line, make stitching holes and stitch one side of the gusset.



I will also create rounded corners using a round cutter punch. If you don't have one, you can carefully use a utility knife to shape the corners of the purse.



Since this is chrome-tanned leather, it can be hard to mark a line unless you heat your tool a bit.

- Stitch line is 3mm from the edge.

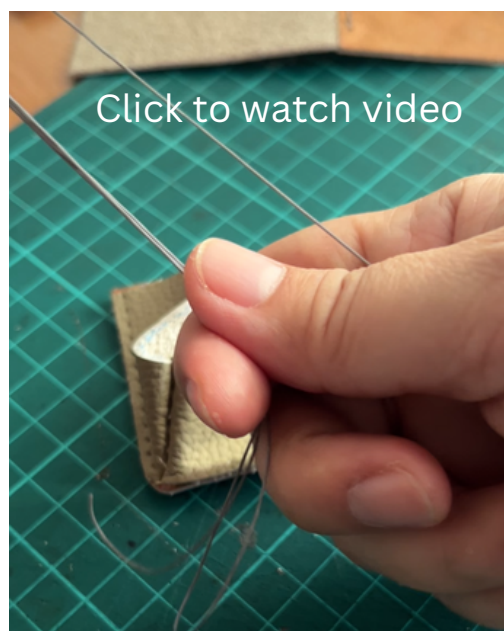
4.28 Now, we make stitching holes and stitch one side of the gusset.



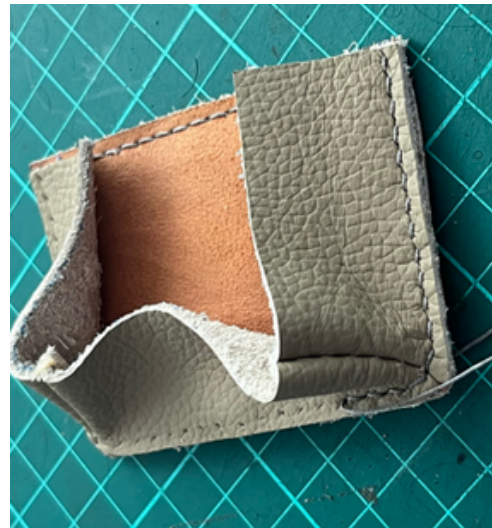
I am using chisel 5 and 2 prong. Where 2 prong is used to make holes at the corner.

- It's recommended to start making holes from the corner using a 2-prong punch. It's also a good idea to do a demo first before making the actual punch on the leather.

4.29 Prepare waxed thread that is four times the length of the area you want to sew.



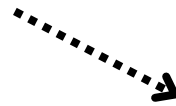
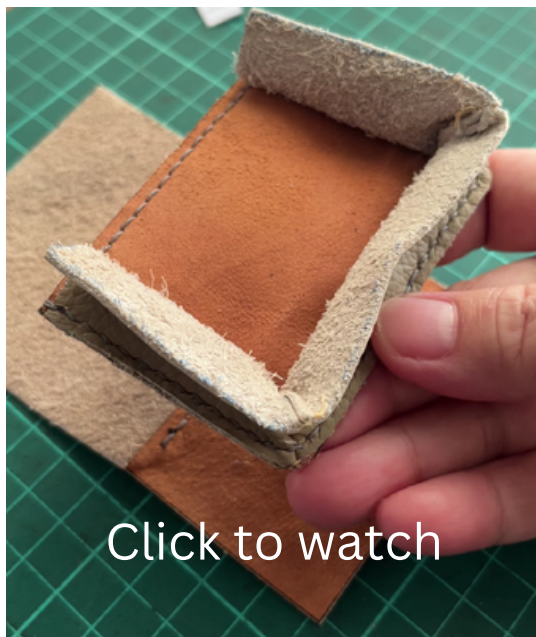

4.31 Adjusting the gusset



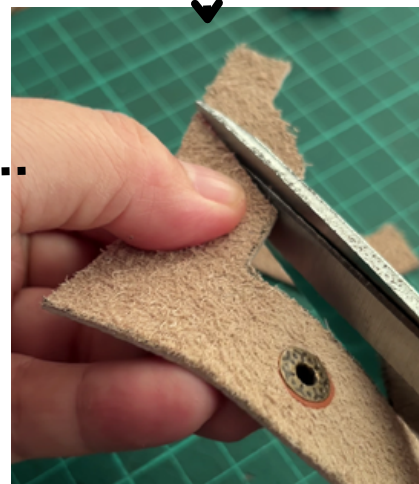
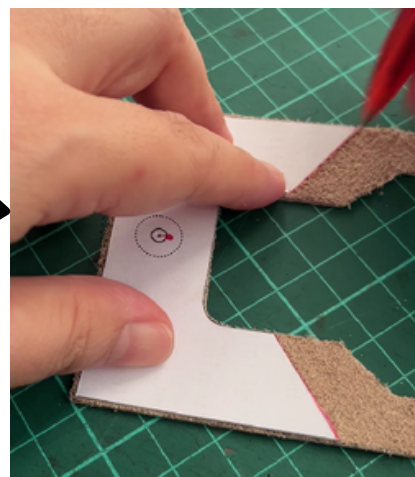
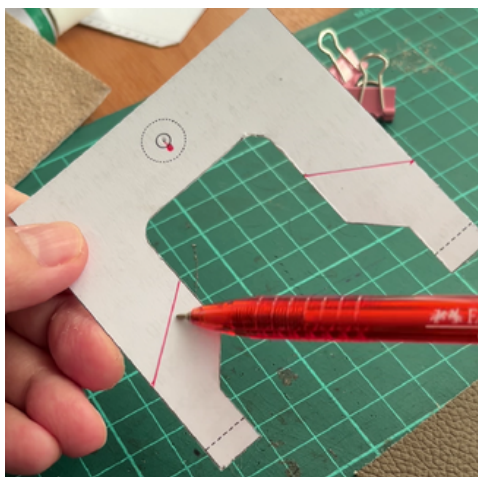
4.31 Glue the gusset to Back Body.



4.32 Trim both the corners with round cutter punch.



4.33 Because of the purse closure issue, I've adjusted the pattern by shortening the length of the cover.



4.34 Glue the cover.



Be sure to mark the stitch line around the purse.

- 3mm from the edge.

4.35 Next, make stitching holes around the purse following the stitch line we marked.

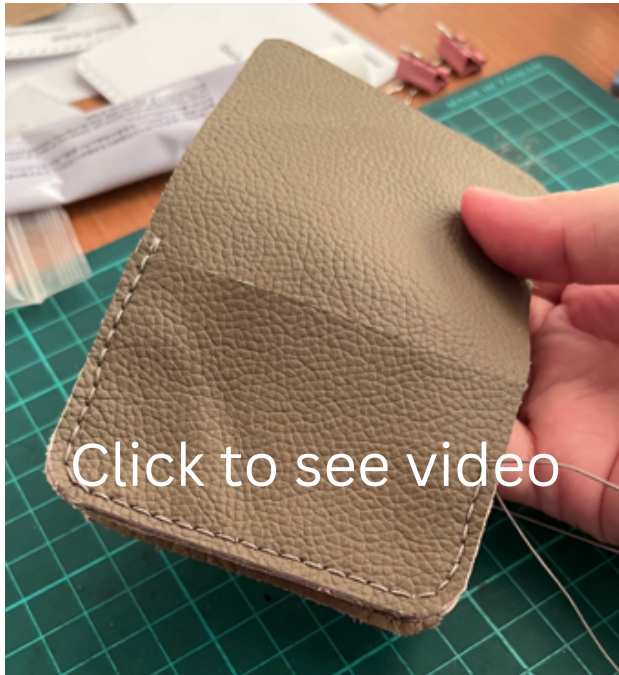


4.35 Prepare waxed thread that is four times the length of the area you want to sew. (around the purse)



4.36 Sewing





4.37 Finish sewing with lighter.



4.38 If you'd like, you can apply leather edge paint or coat to the edges to give it a more professional look.

4.39 You can also add an eyelet, so that you can attach an O-ring just like in the photo below.
