TITRA – Terms of Use & Licensing Agreement (Trauma-Informed Timeline Risk Assessment)

1. Ownership & Intellectual Property

The TITRA framework, methodology, templates, and all associated resources remain the sole intellectual property of Kate Beesley operating under Victim Voice Academy.

TITRA may not be copied, adapted, rebranded, or reproduced in any form without express written permission from Victim Voice Academy.

Say No DAS CIC is authorised to deliver TITRA programmes and resources under licence as an approved delivery partner.

2. Use by Individuals & Survivors

Survivors may use TITRA for personal use only, to record, structure, and present their experiences.

Access to TITRA may be provided by:

- Kate Beesley / Victim Voice Academy
- An approved TITRA Risk Assessor
- Say No DAS CIC or another organisation operating under a valid TITRA licence

Personal use does not grant the right to:

- Train others in TITRA
- Embed TITRA into organisational frameworks
- Share or distribute TITRA resources publicly

3. Use by Certified Professionals

TITRA may only be used professionally by individuals who have:

- Completed accredited training through Victim Voice Academy
- Been certified by Kate Beesley as a TITRA Risk Assessor / Expert Witness

Certified professionals may:

- Use TITRA within their casework
- Prepare expert reports using TITRA methodology
- Provide templates to survivors they are directly supporting

Certified professionals may not:

- Train others in TITRA
- Reproduce or distribute TITRA resources
- Embed TITRA into organisational policy or frameworks without licensing

4. Organisational Use & Licensing

Any organisational use of TITRA requires a formal licence agreement with Victim Voice Academy.

This includes (but is not limited to):

- Police forces
- Local authorities
- NHS organisations
- Universities
- Charities
- Corporate safeguarding programmes

Say No DAS CIC is authorised to deliver TITRA-related training and programmes under licence from Victim Voice Academy.

Licensing agreements ensure the integrity, safe use, and professional credibility of the TITRA framework.

5. Licensing & Professional Renewal

Completion of TITRA training includes a 12-month professional licence.

After this period:

- Professionals may continue using TITRA in their own casework.
- However, to provide survivors with independent access to the digital toolkit and associated resources, an annual licence renewal (£150) is required.

Maintaining an active licence allows professionals to:

- Provide survivors with secure access to TITRA resources
- Access updated tools and framework developments
- Attend annual knowledge and practice updates
- Demonstrate active practitioner status within the recognised TITRA framework.

6. Copyright & Misuse

TITRA is protected under copyright and intellectual property law.

Unauthorised copying, distribution, adaptation, or reproduction of TITRA materials may result in:

- Revocation of access
- Formal takedown notices
- Legal action where necessary to protect intellectual property rights

No organisation or individual may create derivative frameworks, methodologies, training systems, or tools based on TITRA without prior written permission from Victim Voice Academy.

This includes attempting to reproduce or adapt the structure, methodology, or analytical process of TITRA under an alternative name.
