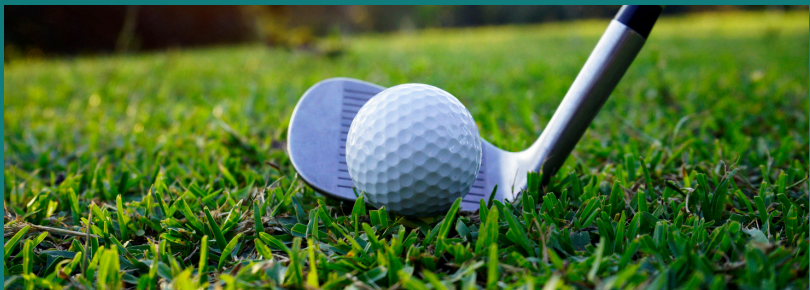

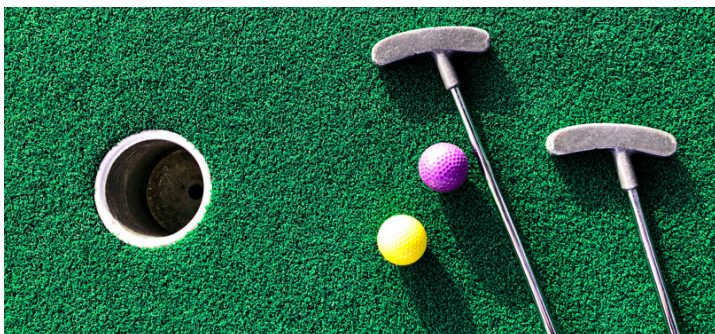

Clearwater Beach is a stunning Gulf Coast destination known for its pristine white sand beaches, crystal-clear waters, and vibrant sunsets. Located in the Tampa Bay area, it offers a range of attractions including the bustling Pier 60, water sports, and marine life encounters at the Clearwater Marine Aquarium, making it a popular spot for families and beachgoers. Approximately 2 hours west of Orlando.

Daytona Beach is located approximately 1 hour northeast of Orlando, it is renowned for its hard-packed sandy beaches, perfect for beach driving experiences. Visitors can explore the iconic Daytona International Speedway, home of the Daytona 500 and the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America. For breathtaking views of the coastline, a climb to the top of the historic Ponce de Leon Inlet Lighthouse is a must-do activity.



Day Trips

The Lightner Museum, housed in the former Alcazar Hotel, offers a glimpse into Victorian-era artifacts and collections. For those seeking a thrilling adventure, ghost tours in St. Augustine provide an intriguing exploration of the city's haunted past, making for an unforgettable night experience.

Mount Dora is a delightful destination offering a mix of charm and scenic beauty located approximately 45 minutes northwest of Orlando. Its charming downtown area is famed for antique shops, boutiques, and cozy cafes, perfect for leisurely strolls and shopping. Visitors can also enjoy the serene Lake Dora with boat tours, fishing opportunities, and picturesque views. Don't miss the vibrant annual festivals such as the Mount Dora Arts Festival and Craft Fair, adding a cultural flair to your visit. Night of a Million Lights:

A dazzling holiday event featuring millions of sparkling lights, immersive displays, and festive entertainment at Island H2O Waterpark.

Universal's Halloween Horror Nights:


Annual Halloween event with haunted houses, scare zones, and live entertainment.

Holidays at Universal Studios:

A festive celebration featuring holiday-themed shows, parades, character meet-and-greets, and stunning decorations throughout the park.

Insider Tips

Plan Your Itinerary in Advance

Book Reservations Early:

Reserve dining, Lightning Lanes (for Disney), and Express Passes (for Universal) as soon as possible to secure spots at popular attractions and restaurants.

Use Official Apps:

Download the official apps for Disney, Universal, SeaWorld, and other attractions for real-time updates, maps, and wait times.

Best Times to Visit

Avoid Peak Seasons:

The best times to visit Orlando are late January to early February, mid-September to early November, and late April to early May when the crowds are thinner, and the weather is more pleasant.

Early or Late Park Visits:

Arrive at parks early in the morning or stay late in the evening to avoid the busiest times of the day.

Weather Preparation

Pack Light Clothing:

Orlando is hot and humid, especially in the summer. Lightweight, breathable clothing is a must.

Stay Hydrated:

Currency and Tipping Guidelines

Currency:

The official currency is the United States Dollar (USD). Major credit cards and debit cards are widely accepted, and ATMs are readily available throughout the city.

Tipping:

Restaurants: Standard tipping is 15-20% of the total bill.

Bars:

\$1-2 per drink or 15-20% of the total bill.

Hotel Staff: \$1-2 per bag for bellhops, \$2-5 per night for housekeeping, and \$1-2 for concierge services.

10-15% of the fare.
