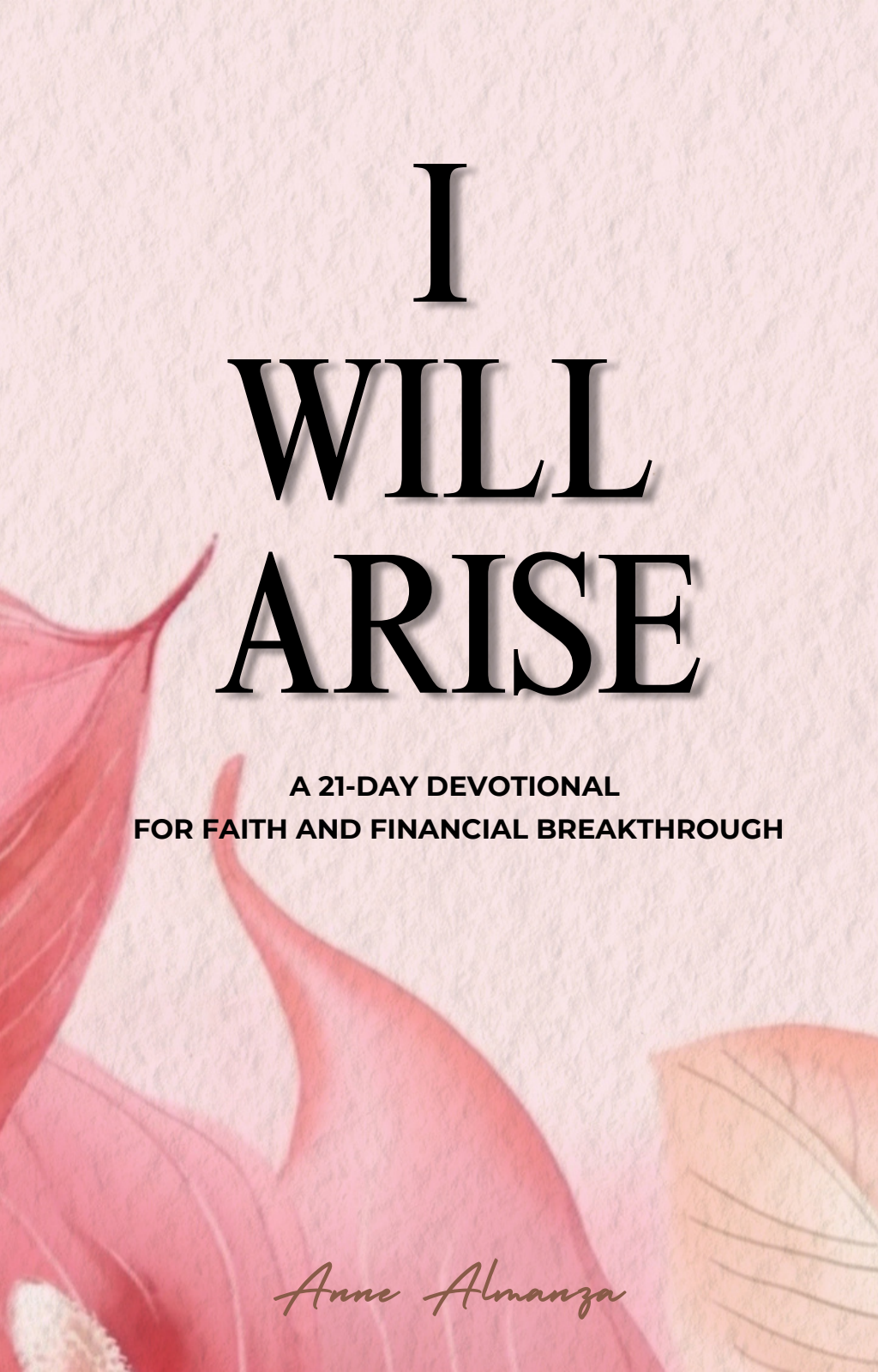

DAY 1: ABIDE



Women are designed to be fruitful. When the fruits of the Holy Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control) are manifested in us, we become fruitful in other areas of our lives, too—be it social, physical, mental, or even financial.

What does it mean to be fruitful? It means bearing something good that others can see, experience, and benefit from. For example, being fruitful in the physical sense means that you are in good health, which enables you to take care of your family, serve them, and help others around you.

I believe that God wants us to be fruitful in all ways, including in our finances. This is not just in terms of the quantity of money, but also in the quality of our lives as we acquire wealth. Being financially fruitful means having more than enough to support our family without sacrificing time for the things that matter most. It also means being able to extend help to others and take part in the Lord's work here on earth. In short, being financially fruitful means having the freedom to serve and live a good life for the glory of God.

However, fruitfulness is only possible if we are connected to the vine, the trunk, the main stem: the Lord Jesus. He is the one who supplies us with everything we need, even with the power to create wealth.

So how do we abide in the Lord? The key is to start with repentance and acceptance. Repentance, or asking for forgiveness, is a crucial step because we have all sinned, and we cannot abide in a holy and perfect God unless we turn away from our sinful lives (Romans 3:23). It is also necessary to accept that we are not the god of our own lives. The Lord Jesus says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." Accepting Him as our personal Lord and Savior means letting go of control and allowing Him to lead the way.

DAY 2: BELIEVE



Many of those who acknowledge God's existence never truly acknowledge the truth of His promises. Believing in God and believing that His Word is true are two different things. This is one of the reasons why many believers continue to live in a cycle of lack and poverty. They pray to God and recognize His existence and power, but they do not fully believe that He intends to bless them.

The Lord made it clear in Jeremiah 29:11 that His plan is for our welfare—to prosper us. If this is the plan, then why do many of us experience otherwise?

The thing is, the Lord will not force us into His plan. He has given us free will, and in order to follow His path, we must align ourselves with His plan. This means that our actions, attitudes, and words must be in sync with God's intentions. This is how we practice our beliefs.

However, many still think, speak, and act as if the Lord does not want to improve their lives. People complain, grumble, or expect the worst. Why? One possible reason is unfamiliarity with His promises. If we do not know His promises, how do we hold on to them? Another reason is the doubt that the enemy feeds us with. The enemy has always been a liar. If the Lord tells us one thing, the enemy tries to convince us of the opposite outcome.

Fortunately, God cannot lie. It is simply not in His nature. Whatever He says He will do, He will surely do. This is why it is very important that we familiarize ourselves with His promises by reading His Word regularly. This also keeps us from being deceived by the enemy. Moreover, we must first believe in order to receive, and for us to believe, we must hear His promises. This is how faith is established.

No matter what your situation is right now, know that God wants to bless you abundantly in the assignment that He has given you. Think, speak, and act as if financial abundance is within your reach—because it is. It is coming. Just believe.

DAY 2: BELIEVE

Dear Father,

DAY 3: WAY MAKER

As a childless wife for more than a year, I remember having a strong desire to be a hands-on mom. My problem was that I couldn't get pregnant. As a Senior Software Engineer, I also wondered how I could take care of my own child when I had to spend my 9-to-5 (and more) in the office, where I was earning quite a substantial salary.

My desire grew stronger until I was just dragging myself to work each day. I started losing my motivation to hold an office job, and I wondered what else I could do. Just leave my job and be broke? Of course not. So I lifted my desires in prayer. That was when the Lord answered.

One day on my way to the office, I noticed a big text written on one of the buildings that I regularly passed by. It said, **"GOD WILL MAKE A WAY."** I instantly knew that God was speaking to me. So every day as I walked past that building, I looked at those words and declared, **"GOD WILL MAKE A WAY."**

True enough, I got pregnant a few months later. I decided to take a rest to ensure a healthy pregnancy. While I was resting for a couple of months, a friend recommended that I offer my skills online because she knew someone who was looking for a writing tutor. At that time, I didn't even know that working from home was possible (this was seven years before the pandemic). But God opened that opportunity for me. Then I started earning more than I did as a Senior Software Engineer. I knew at that moment that God had indeed made a way for me.

DAY 3: WAY MAKER



I left my office job and never looked back. I was able to be a hands-on mom while earning more than I asked for. It has been such a joy to witness every milestone of my child. That was just one of the many doors that He opened for me throughout the years.

Do you need a way out? Lift your desires to the Lord because He hears you. He is the One who parted the Red Sea so His children could pass on dry land. You are His child, too. Our Father is a Way Maker and a Miracle Worker!

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

DAY 4: CLAIM WHAT'S YOURS



The land that God promised to the Israelites had been theirs since the Lord promised it to Abraham in Genesis 12:7. The ownership was given to them even before they set foot on it. Once they entered, God fulfilled His promise by allowing the Israelites to conquer many territories. They fought and defeated many armies to claim their land. However, at one point, you'll notice that their leader, Joshua, asked the Israelites why they weren't taking possession of what the Lord had already given them (Joshua 18:3). Although they had already taken hold of some parts of the land, there were still territories left unclaimed. Joshua noticed that they were delaying action, so he charged them to act with a sense of urgency. How about you? How long will you put off taking possession of God's promise?

The Lord said that He came so that we may have life and have it in abundance (John 10:10). He also said that His plan is to prosper us. These are the promises of God. Every moment we delay in stepping forward to claim these promises is a loss on our part. This is where intentionality comes in. Instead of letting fears keep you from moving forward in faith, take that first step. Make a strategy to pay off debt. Develop your skill. Offer what you know. Start that business that the Lord is calling you to do. In other words, take action in obedience to the Lord. When you pray for financial breakthrough, you have to own it, act on it, and hold onto it. Don't hold back from claiming the blessings that God has in store for you. Decide that if God has promised it to you, it is yours!

DAY 4: CLAIM WHAT'S YOURS

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Thank You because Your Word is true. You said that You came so that we may live an abundant life. You also said that Your plan is to prosper us, and I believe that I am already living in that promise. I also know that You have given me the power to create wealth, and I pray for Your guidance so that I may use this power to the best of my ability to give You honor and glory. DAY 5: A TIME FOR REST



Imagine running for your life after faithfully serving the Lord and obeying His instructions. People are hunting you, determined to kill you. Exhausted and overwhelmed, you find yourself praying only one thing: “Lord, take away my life.”

This man was Elijah, a prophet. Because of his obedience and reverence for the Lord, he refused to worship false gods. This did not please Jezebel, the queen of Israel and the wife of King Ahab. Out of anger and vengeance, Jezebel vowed to kill Elijah, so he fled to the wilderness. This ordeal was too much for Elijah to bear. He was so exhausted that he just wanted to die. What was God’s response? Simple. He let him sleep and gave him a cake to eat. After that, Elijah was ready for his mission once again.

How many times have you felt so tired thinking that all doors are closing on you? How many times have you felt exhausted trying to make ends meet while also facing the need to work, manage the house, run errands, and take care of everything at home? These may be part of the responsibilities that you know the Lord wants you to take care of, but there are moments when it’s just too much to bear, right? I’ve experienced this countless times before.

I remember one of those days when the burden of not having enough weighed me down. With a toddler to take care of and a house to run, our expected family income for the month had barely reached \$300—not enough to pay bills, amortizations, and meet the basic needs of our family. I was working. My husband was also helping, but our finances were just not doing well. I felt hopeless.

At that point, I felt so tired, and I knew there was nothing I could do but give everything to the Lord. I laid down on the bed and told God how I was feeling—the emotions dragging me down and the frustrations choking me inside. I lifted my burden to the Lord as I lay down, not realizing that I had already dozed off. I slept.

DAY 5: A TIME FOR REST



I woke up two hours later with an energy I couldn't explain. God literally gave me rest. Refreshed, I went about my day, set some things I needed to complete for my work and for the ministry, took care of some chores, and spent some time watching a movie with my husband and child. God had filled me with strength, hope, and peace once again.

Sometimes we stretch ourselves too much worrying about earthly problems that we forget to focus on the fact that the Lord promised to supply all our needs. No matter how hard we try, this happens at times—and the Lord knows it. That is why He told us that whenever we feel a heavy burden, we can come to Him.

Our body, soul, and spirit need rest too, and only in Him can we find that kind of rest beyond what words can explain. Feeling tired lately? Come to the Lord, and He will give you rest as He promised.

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Thank You for always being ready to give me rest whenever I need it. For the times I try to do things on my own and depend on myself, forgetting the truth that You are the One who is in control, please forgive me.

I come to You to lift up all the burdens that I carry. You know exactly what I'm going through, what I need, and what my desires are. I trust that as I rest in Your presence, You are working miracles in my life.

This time, I no longer want to carry the weight of anxiety and doubt. I'm letting it all go into Your hands because I'm certain that You care about me. Thank You so much for giving me rest in my body, soul, and spirit. I shall continue with renewed strength and a refreshed soul because of Your goodness, kindness, and mercy toward me. In Jesus' name, AMEN!

DAY 5: A TIME FOR REST

DAY 6: A LIFE OF FREEDOM



Many of us pray for financial breakthrough, but have you ever wondered why some prayers seem to go unanswered? Does this mean prayers don't work? Of course not!

"I've been praying for so long, but it seems like God doesn't hear me." This is not uncommon, but when we think about this phrase, it sounds as if God is the one who is not acting. It is important to note that Scripture says to pray and believe that you may receive. Could it be that we are the ones who are not doing our part?

Many times, our capacity to receive breakthroughs is limited by our belief, which is often rooted in our misconception of what freedom is. Scripture says, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." This freedom is not confined to spirituality alone. The Lord created us with a body, soul, and spirit, so freedom applies to all three aspects of life.

Can we still call ourselves free when we are in financial bondage? Are we free when we cannot choose to live a life of comfort because we are tied to endless bills and debt? Can we call ourselves free when we cannot spend quality time in prayer because we are always in a hurry, always rushing so we won't be late for work, only to come home exhausted at night—again having no time to pray and read God's Word? If we are drowning in debt, is our soul really free from worries and anxiety?

When we limit our perspective of the freedom given to us, we also limit our faith in what God can do in our lives. Think about the Israelites—if God only cared about their spiritual condition, why didn't He simply command Moses to introduce Him as God so they would repent and have spiritual freedom? Why did He command Moses to lead them out of slavery, which also included freedom in the economic sense?

DAY 6: A LIFE OF FREEDOM



Let's not overlook the fact that the Lord prepared a place for them—an actual dwelling place described as a land flowing with milk and honey, a physically abundant place where His people could have rest and live well.

I believe that the freedom the Lord desires for us covers all areas of our lives, including our finances. Understanding this breaks the mental wall that keeps us from operating from a financially liberated standpoint. It helps us pray in faith, knowing that when we ask Him for freedom from financial bondage, He will provide it according to His grace.

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Thank You for Your Word that brings me liberty! Remind me of Your heart that longs to give me freedom in all areas of my life. Break any limiting beliefs I may have so that I will not be kept in bondage by my own limited thinking. Guide me so that I may walk in the freedom that You have already given me. Help me live freely—body, soul, and spirit—to worship You, serve You, and honor You with all that I am.

DAY 7: BOLD AS A LION



When faced with uncertainties, whether it's finances or other challenges in life, do you still stand boldly in faith? Scripture says that the righteous are as bold as a lion (Proverbs 28:1). But what exactly does it mean to be bold?

The word bold means being fearless or daring. As a child of God who has been made righteous through faith in Christ, you are called to be bold. Praying with boldness shows that you completely trust God's ability to give what you are asking for, even if it seems impossible.

There are many examples in the Bible that show how boldness leads to great outcomes. Take, for example, the story of Achsah, the daughter of Caleb (Judges 1:14–15). She boldly asked her father, saying, "Give me a blessing." It was a strategic request because she knew that her family needed access to water in order to sustain the land that her father had initially given her. During those days, women had very limited rights, and yet she did not hesitate to ask for a blessing for the sake of her family. Caleb, in turn, granted his daughter's bold request.

Interestingly, her father also demonstrated bold faith when he said, "Give me this mountain," as he asked Joshua to give him Mount Hebron as an inheritance for his family (Joshua 14:12–14). It was the boldness and faith of Caleb and his daughter Achsah that secured the blessings they asked for.

Now, if you truly know that God is willing to give you what you are asking for, what requests will you make today? Go ahead and ask. Be bold as a lion.

DAY 7: BOLD AS A LION



BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Thank You for giving me the opportunity to come to You with boldness. I know that You own everything in this world. Everything is from You, through You, and for You. Therefore, I believe that I can ask anything according to Your will, and I trust that it will be given to me, as You have promised. Father, align my heart and desires with what pleases You. I ask for financial breakthrough for my family, Your church, and Your people. I want to be a channel of blessing to them. As You pour out Your provision upon me, purify my heart so that I may always remember to walk in Your ways and not be tempted to entertain desires that are not pleasing to You. Please prepare me and my family for the financial breakthrough You are giving us. In Jesus name, AMEN!

DAY 8: KEYS TO VICTORY

One of the cities conquered by the Israelites during the leadership of Joshua was the city of Ai. When you read the story, you'll see that before this victory, God commanded Joshua to stretch out his spear first—but why (Joshua 8:18)? If God is so powerful, why didn't He simply hand the city of Ai to the Israelites? The answer to this question highlights two keys essential for achieving breakthrough.

First, He gave Joshua the power to achieve great results. Stretching out the spear represents the power to act. Second, He gave him a resource—the javelin—to accomplish the task. When both the action and the resource are combined and submitted in obedience to the Lord, Joshua received God's promise. This demonstrates the importance of actively participating in God's plan. We cannot experience breakthroughs by remaining passive.

I believe the same principle applies to us today. God has promised us an abundant and prosperous life, but we must apply the two keys demonstrated by Joshua. The Lord has given us the power to create wealth, and we must use this power by acting on it. Moreover, we have been given a spear in the form of the knowledge, skills, passion, energy, and time the Lord has gifted us. All of these are given for a reason—to serve as a stream of blessings not just for our benefit but for others, too.

Just like Joshua, you are called to stretch out and use the spear in your hand. In other words, use your God-given passion, knowledge, and skills to obey what God is asking you to do. Use these gifts to serve and add value to others, and surely you will see your divine breakthrough!

DAY 8: KEYS TO VICTORY



BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Thank You for Your abundant love, which flows within me. It is Your love and faithfulness that assure me You want nothing but the best for my life. I believe that You created me to thrive, and therefore, You are opening opportunities for me to do so. Thank You, Father, for I know that You have placed in my hands all that I need to succeed, and that You will continue to provide the skills, abilities, and resources I need as I walk in obedience to You. Empower me so that I may stretch out my hand and not draw it back until I have experienced Your divine breakthrough in my life. I pray that only Your name may be exalted in all of these things. In Jesus' name, AMEN!

DAY 9: DO NOT BE TROUBLED



Messy tabletops, unfolded laundry, school activities, family gatherings to attend, and children's needs to take care of—most of us women barely get to slow down because of our seemingly endless to-do lists. We wear many hats, and these hats don't always make life glamorous.

Being a mom alone comes with many roles and responsibilities, such as being a caregiver, teacher, counselor, nurse, and even entertainer for our kids—whatever our family needs at the moment. On top of that, we are also someone's wife, daughter, friend, and sister. But I realized that what makes all these roles overwhelming is that most women don't have the financial capacity to take a break and slow down when needed because beyond all these responsibilities, we also have bills to pay and basic needs to provide for. No wonder many of us feel anxious and overwhelmed as soon as we wake up.

I remember days when all I wanted was some quiet time. I would think to myself, "Wouldn't it be nice to have the financial capacity to slow down, take a break, and focus on what matters most?" Despite the exhaustion of the day-to-day grind, I would question whether I was doing enough, and dwelling on that thought over and over again was draining.

Since I didn't have the financial freedom to take a break, I chose to focus even more on my responsibilities and tried to be productive all the time. I kept working and working. I believed it would bring in more money, but I still felt stuck. I thought it was because I wasn't doing enough, so I pushed myself even harder—and in the process, I forgot how to simply live and enjoy life. But then I was reminded of what the Lord says, "Let not your heart be troubled." Applying this truth made all the difference in my life. It helped lift the heavy burden I had placed on myself.

Instead of constantly thinking about what you still need to do, also consider how much you've already done. As you pray and wait for a financial breakthrough, don't forget to live in the moment. Let the house be messy on some days if it means you get to spend time playing with your kids. The laundry can wait from time to time if it means you get to visit your parents and make memories as they grow older. On other days, it's okay to skip overtime work—never mind the extra pay—if it means you get to sit down with your spouse and talk about anything under the sun.

Sometimes, you just have to let the worries of life be and choose to be still, breathe, and appreciate how wonderful life is. This is exactly the freedom that comes with breakthroughs. Live as if you already have that freedom.

Practice living in the moment so that when your financial breakthrough comes, you're ready for it. You already know how to seize it. Take one step at a time and enjoy the life that Jesus, our Lord, died for. As long as you have faith and are acting on it one step at a time, know that you are doing well. Let not your heart be troubled.

DAY 9: DO NOT BE TROUBLED



BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Teach me to enjoy the life You have given me each day. Help me focus on Your wonderful promises so that I may overcome troubled thoughts. Fill me with the peace of Your presence when times feel overwhelming.

And if the key to Abraham and Sarah's breakthrough was unwavering faith, could it be the same key that unlocks your financial breakthrough? I am fully convinced that it is.

In the midst of my financial struggles, this is the truth I held on to. This is what kept me going. Whenever I felt tired and discouraged, wondering if our debts and bills would ever end, I would go back and reflect on Abraham's faith. And sure enough, God made a way for our family. Little by little, He began to show us the breakthrough we had been praying for—until all our debts were paid, and we were able to live comfortably enough to help and support others.

Regardless of your current financial capacity, circumstances, or obligations, God's promise remains true. When He says that He will never leave you nor forsake you, He means it. When He says that you can call on Him and He will answer, He will do it.

Do not let unbelief take a seat at your table. Instead, be strengthened in faith, knowing that one day—no matter how long it takes—you will see the breakthrough you have been praying for.

DAY 10: UNWAVERING FAITH



BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

DAY 11: JUST ASK

Poverty is painful to bear, but so is living with just enough. At least, this is how I once felt. Simply having enough meant I could only support my own family. But what do I do when I see my parents growing older without experiencing even the simple luxuries in life? What do I do when a friend comes to me asking for help because they have no one else to turn to? What do I do when I feel the desire to fund a ministry but there's just nothing else I can offer?

For a while, I settled for “enough,” especially when the Lord began making a way for us to pay off our debts. I didn't want to ask God for more financial blessings because Scripture says, “Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, ‘Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you’” (Hebrews 13:5). Yes, I was content. However, that contentment kept me from extending help to others. It also kept me from living a life of freedom, because having just enough meant we were merely getting by.

As I learned how the Lord blessed Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and the Israelites—and how He provided more than enough for the people He encountered in the New Testament—I began to realize that something wasn't right. So I revisited passages like 1 Timothy 6:10 and recognized what I had been missing. Money itself isn't the issue; it is the love of money that we are warned about. In fact, money is simply a tool and a magnifier. It can be used either to express love or to express greed. It also magnifies our intentions—whether good or bad. Because of my wrong perspective, I missed the opportunity to apply one of the biblical principles for financial breakthrough: to ask.

I thought I was being content, but I realized I was actually being complacent. These are two very different things. Being content means having peace, joy, and gratitude for what we have in the present, while trusting in the abundance of the Lord's provision. On the other hand, being complacent means settling for less than what God desires for us. When we refuse to ask God, we become complacent—and complacency can hinder us from fulfilling our calling and purpose.

DAY 11: JUST ASK



As women, we are designed to be a fountain of blessing to our families and to those around us. This becomes easier when we have the financial capacity to live freely and serve others. We can be content and still ask—from a place of gratitude. Because as the Lord says in His Word, we do not have because we do not ask. Remember, You are His child. You are free to ask.

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

I am grateful for whatever You are giving me at this moment. My heart is content, knowing that You understand all that I need and that I will never lack again. I know that You are the God of more than enough, so I ask that You allow me and my family to experience Your abundant generosity, so that we may also become a storehouse of blessing for others.

I ask that You open the windows of heaven and bless us abundantly. As You do, create a clean heart in me, so that I may not be swayed by temptations or sin against You. Help me to steward all that You are giving according to Your will and purpose.

Prepare me to receive the abundance I am praying for, and may everything You entrust to me and my family be used for Your Kingdom, honor, and glory. In Jesus' name, AMEN!

DAY 12: BE STILL



What if the battle you're exhausting yourself fighting was never yours to begin with? Imagine going up against an enemy, putting your life on the line just to earn a reward—only to find out later that the very same rewards could have been handed to you without breaking a sweat. That would be a waste of time and energy, right? That was exactly what happened to me before I learned there was an easier way to achieve financial breakthrough. I used to believe that working hard and hustling all the time was the key to financial success. I would come to work early in the morning and go home late at night. Overtime and weekend work became my normal. When I transitioned to working from home, I carried the same habits. In fact, it got even worse. In the beginning, I struggled to set boundaries with my time because I could work anytime from home.

But as my relationship with the Lord grew deeper, I began to understand that He gives specific strategies so that we won't have to struggle endlessly. His blessings abound when we follow His direction, while acknowledging that it is He who sustains us—not ourselves.

Take a look at the story of King Jehoshaphat in 2 Chronicles 20. When he found out that surrounding nations were about to attack, he cried out to the Lord. And the Lord answered, "You will not need to fight in this battle. Position yourselves, stand still and see the salvation of the Lord." God gave him and all of Judah a divine strategy. They were told exactly where to go—and when they arrived the next day, the battle was already over. What did they see? The dead bodies of their enemies and an abundance of valuables left behind as spoil. There were so many blessings that it took them three days to gather everything. Talk about not breaking a sweat. He won the war without fighting because it was never his to fight in the first place.

DAY 12: BE STILL



Are you still grinding all day just to make ends meet? Are you exhausting yourself trying to figure out how to have more than enough so you can help others? These battles are not yours to fight. This doesn't mean you'll just sit back and wait lazily for blessings to fall from heaven. Instead, it means that you'll learn to incline your ears to what the Lord is telling you to do. It's about working as faithful stewards of what He has given you —without wearing yourselves out.

When we listen to the Lord's leading and follow His instructions, He brings us to the place of victory. This may look like open opportunities, strong connections, surprising offers, deals we know we couldn't have secured on our own, unexpected clients, and many other possibilities. When we realize that striving isn't the way, that's when we begin to see with our own eyes that the battle has already been won.

It's time to stand still. Position yourself. And gather the blessings He has already prepared for you. The fight is over.

DAY 12: BE STILL

Dear Lord,

Thank You for helping me understand that the battle I've been fighting all along was never mine. Thank You for saving me from endless struggles. I now understand that the only way to a peaceful and lasting financial breakthrough is by surrendering the battle into Your hands.

DAY 13: GET EXCITED



The host of the event was very tense. It was an occasion attended by thousands of people who gathered for hours, even skipping meals just to be there—but the problem was, the host had failed to prepare any food.

This is what happened at the Mount of Beatitudes. The Lord asked the disciples to feed more than 5,000 people, but as we know, what they had in hand wasn't enough. Even more than half a year's wages, which was 200 denarii at that time, wouldn't be enough (Mark 6:37, NIV). Though they found a boy with five loaves of bread and two fish, it was obviously not enough for that crowd. I imagine they must have been puzzled and a little worried about obeying the Lord without seeing a way to do it.

But what if the disciples had known that the Lord would multiply the food right before their eyes? Would they still hesitate, or would they be excited to see how He would do it? I'm pretty sure it would have been the latter. With this story in mind, I made a decision one day to be excited when all hope seems lost.

When we first got our family car, our finances were stable. But a couple of years later, after a failed business and unstable income, we found ourselves struggling to keep up with the monthly payments. On one particular day of payment, we had nothing to pay. We had exhausted our funds for necessary expenses. Worse, we didn't have anyone else to turn to, as we had already borrowed money from a few people who were close to us. It felt like we had reached the end of the road. We wanted to pay so much, but what else could we do? Instead of stressing out, I decided to choose to be excited. Why? Because I realized that having access to the Father through the Lord Jesus Christ is something worth being excited about.

Instead of worrying, I simply prayed to God. I told Him that we needed money that day—something we couldn't provide on our own. With all my heart, I believed that God had already made a way, and even more than what we asked for.

DAY 13: GET EXCITED



True enough, I received an unexpected payment from a client, and we were able to pay for our car. No delay. No interest incurred. God made a way. This was just one of the many times He miraculously provided for our family in times of need.

There are so many things we can be excited about if we stop fixing our eyes on our financial struggles or on things that don't seem to be working. You may be unemployed right now, your income may not be enough, or your business may seem like it's failing—but as long as you cling to Jesus, you have everything you need and more.

Get excited for the good things that are coming.

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

You are our Jehovah Jireh, our Great Provider. I believe that You will not allow us to suffer lack, because even if we cannot see Your provision right away, it does not mean it isn't there.

Help us to see through the eyes of faith, that wherever You lead us and whatever You ask us to do, Your abundant provision will follow and sustain us.

I am excited because I know that You have so much in store for us, as long as we cling to Your presence and depend on You for our every need.

DAY 14: WHAT'S IN YOUR HANDS?

In this passage, a widow was struggling during a famine. The Lord told Elijah that He had commanded a widow to provide for him. So Elijah went to Zarephath, only to find that the widow seemingly had nothing to offer—or so she thought.

The widow said to Elijah, “As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked—only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. I am now gathering a couple of sticks so I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.”

As illogical as it may have sounded, Elijah replied, “Do not fear. Go and do as you have said. But first make me a small cake and bring it to me, and afterward make something for yourself and your son.”

Because Elijah believed in God's Word regardless of how the situation looked, he knew that whatever the widow had would be more than enough for all of them. The widow obeyed, and the result was remarkable. Scripture tells us that the flour and oil did not run out. In fact, they sustained them for many days.

When yielded to the Lord, what seems limited in our hands becomes limitless. The widow's simple resources became the key to their breakthrough during the famine. She didn't realize she already had what she needed to create something valuable because she lacked vision at the beginning.

The vision was first given to Elijah when the Lord said, “SEE, I have commanded a widow there to feed you.” Elijah saw the truth and later shared that vision with the widow when he instructed her to make him a small cake. The vision became reality when the widow chose to trust and obey what the Lord had asked her to do.

DAY 14: WHAT'S IN YOUR HANDS?



Unless you understand that the Lord will not leave you empty-handed, you may continue living in a place of lack and “just enough.” But there is a place of breakthrough waiting for you.

It's time to pray for vision—to see the skills and resources you can surrender in obedience to the Lord. What's in your hand? What keys might you have been holding all along?

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

Just like the widow in the Bible, I know that You have given me the skills and resources that I can yield to You, so that I may become a fountain of blessing to my family, Your ministry, and those around me.

Help me to see through the eyes of faith so that I may recognize what You have placed in my hands and understand how to use it for Your divine purpose. Give me vision to discern my next steps and to understand how I can align myself with Your will.

Thank You, for I am certain that Your power is limitless. You are our Jehovah Jireh, and in every season, I trust that You will abundantly provide for all our needs. In Jesus' name, AMEN!

With this in mind, shouldn't we be mindful of the words the Lord hears from us? Do we express confidence that He will provide for all our needs, or do we diminish His power through words filled with doubt, hopelessness, and complaint?

As children of God, we have been given the authority to carry out His will here on earth. In fact, Jesus says that whatever we bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever we loose on earth will be loosed in heaven (Matthew 18:18). This authority is exercised as we speak faith-filled declarations that align with His character and promises. The words we speak shape our environment, influence our thoughts and actions, and affect not only our own lives but also the lives of those around us.

Moreover, speaking blessings is not just about saying the right words—it is about declaring God's promises with a heart fully convinced that they will come to pass. It means holding on to His truth regardless of our circumstances. When we face difficulties, declaring His promises reminds us that deliverance and victory are already ours in Him. Walking by faith demonstrates our trust in His goodness and His power to move in our situations. It goes beyond merely hoping for change; it is a confident expectation that God will fulfill what He has spoken in our lives.

DAY 17: OBEY & SERVE



If the Lord's will, as stated in Jeremiah 29:11, is to prosper us and not harm us, why do so many people suffer from financial bondage? I used to ask this question, and I've heard many others ask the same thing. When we think about it, it can be puzzling to see hardworking, generous, and kind individuals constantly struggling to make ends meet—as if it were their fate to endure financial hardship their whole lives. Living paycheck to paycheck seems to be the norm for many of us. So where does this gap between the Lord's promise and the reality we see come from?

If we reflect on it, the Lord never told us to simply work harder and grind all day. In fact, His guidance doesn't point us toward striving in our own strength at all. Job 36:11 highlights a key biblical principle related to this. It reveals the connection between obedience to God and the blessings that follow. In this passage, the speaker—most likely Elihu, Job's friend—suggests that living in alignment with God's will leads to a life marked by fulfillment and well-being. In other words, obedience and service together become the pathway to prosperity and contentment. The phrase “if they obey and serve Him” reminds us that faith is not passive; it requires intentional action in the form of obedience and service.

When we listen to what God is saying, He gives us specific directions for how to prosper in a way that doesn't rely on hustle culture. He reveals the skills and passions we can use to serve and add value to others' lives. For example, someone who enjoys baking may begin by sharing homemade goods with neighbors, eventually turning it into a business that blesses others while providing income. Another person who is naturally organized might start by helping friends declutter their homes or plan events, bringing peace and order into their lives. Even a stay-at-home mom who loves teaching her children may discover a calling in tutoring or creating online content that supports other families.

DAY 17: OBEY & SERVE



God has intentionally placed within us specific abilities, knowledge, and experiences. When we follow His leading in how to use them, we begin to see transformation even in our financial lives. As we genuinely serve others with what we have, we start to notice doors opening—opportunities we didn’t force but were led into. This is deeply reassuring. When we rely on Him to meet our needs, remain attentive to His voice, and faithfully serve, we can expect to see both prosperity and joy unfold before our eyes.

BREAKTHROUGH PRAYER

Dear Father,

I am grateful that Your plans are always for our good. I believe that You always look after our best interests and that Your desire is to prosper us, not to harm us. Teach me to obey Your Word and to trust in Your perfect plan. Empower me to use my skills, passions, and knowledge to serve others in a way that brings You honor and glory. Help me keep my intentions pure so that my service would not come from a desire for personal gain, but from a heart that seeks to be a faithful steward of all You have entrusted to me.

DAY 18: THE JOY OF HITTING ROCK BOTTOM



One thing about faith is that it can make us look a little “crazy” in the eyes of those who don’t truly understand it. Think about how people in the past must have seen Noah as he built a massive ark on dry land. Imagine how David’s brothers—mighty soldiers—must have reacted when their young, seemingly unqualified brother suddenly chose to face Goliath, whom they themselves were afraid to fight. And let’s not forget the servants at the wedding in Cana. They were tasked with serving wine, yet they followed what seemed like an absurd instruction to fill jars with water—something that made no logical sense until that water was turned into wine.

These accounts remind me why I believe there is joy even in hitting rock bottom. It is often in our most desperate moments that God’s miracles are revealed. Hitting rock bottom leaves us with no other direction but upward. Scripture says that those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength and soar on wings like eagles. If we don’t choose to rise, we risk staying stuck—trapped in regret, guilt, shame, and disappointment. But being stuck is a choice. There is always another option: to rise.

Just like Noah, who rose in obedience, David, who rose in courage, and the servants at the wedding, who rose in service, we rise from the pits we find ourselves in through faith. Hope becomes our fuel and our direction—the assurance that something good is still ahead.

There is little value in dwelling on what we could have done differently to avoid financial struggles. While reflection can teach us, remaining in regret will not move us forward. The better choice is to look up and trust that the Lord has good plans for our future. He will lift you up as you allow Him to, and what lies ahead is a journey filled with purpose, wonder, and grace. His mercies and miracles await.

When the deal was closed, we received a six-digit down payment—the largest sum of money we had ever held at that time. Our bills were paid, our monthly obligations were settled, and our basic necessities were purchased. Remarkably, on the very month I missed my salary for the first time, we were able to give the largest tithe of our journey—a major plot twist indeed!
