The Essence of Modesty

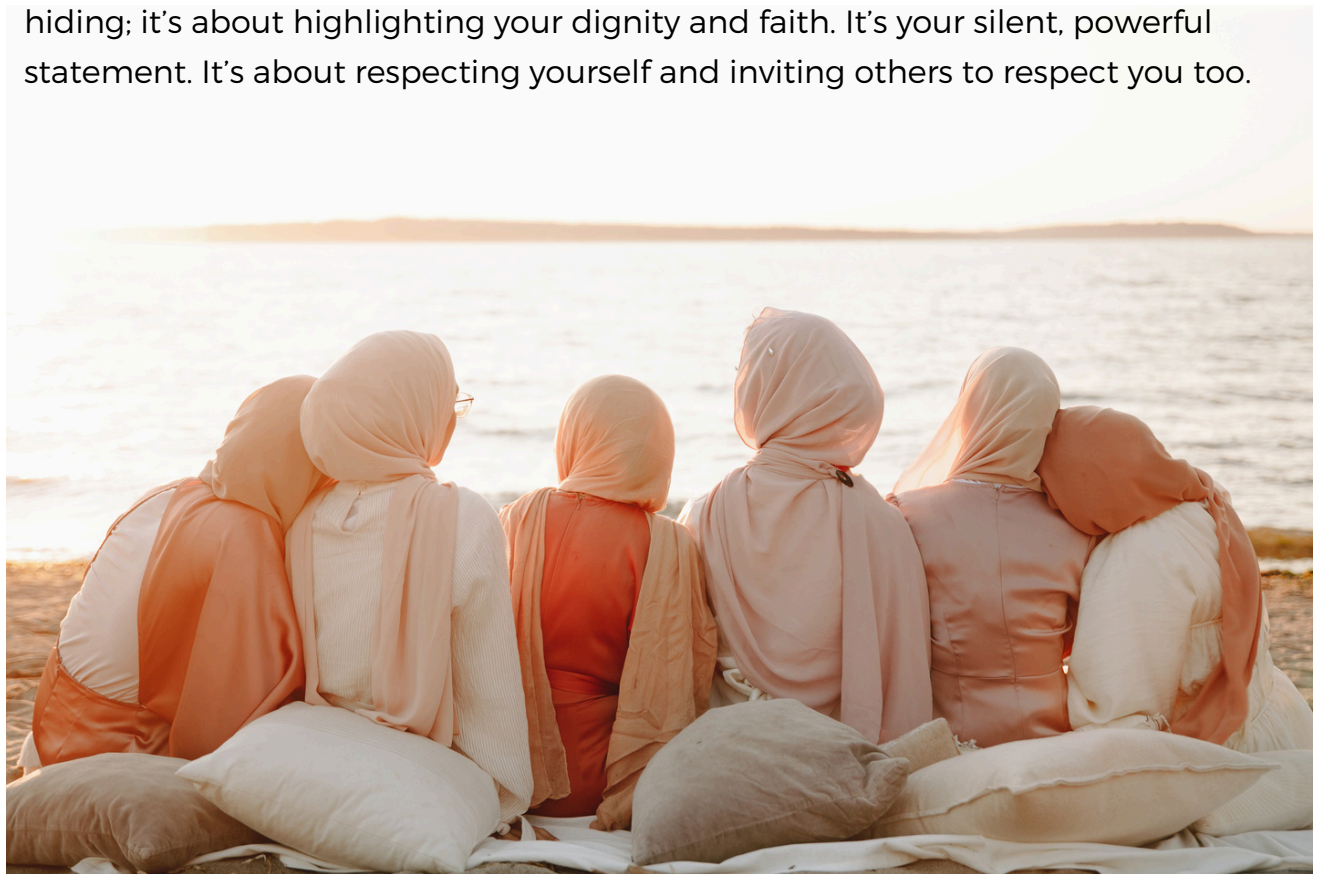
So, what's modesty really about? It's not just about covering up; it's about expressing your inner beauty.
