

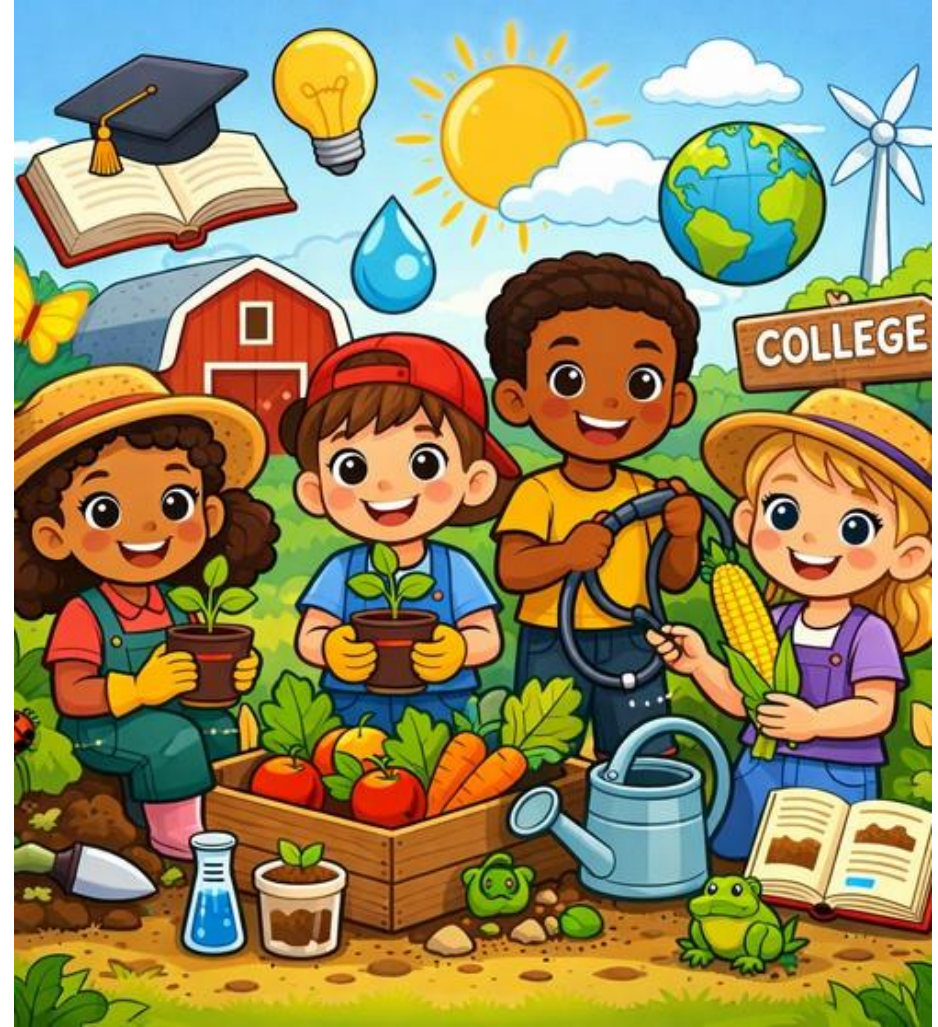

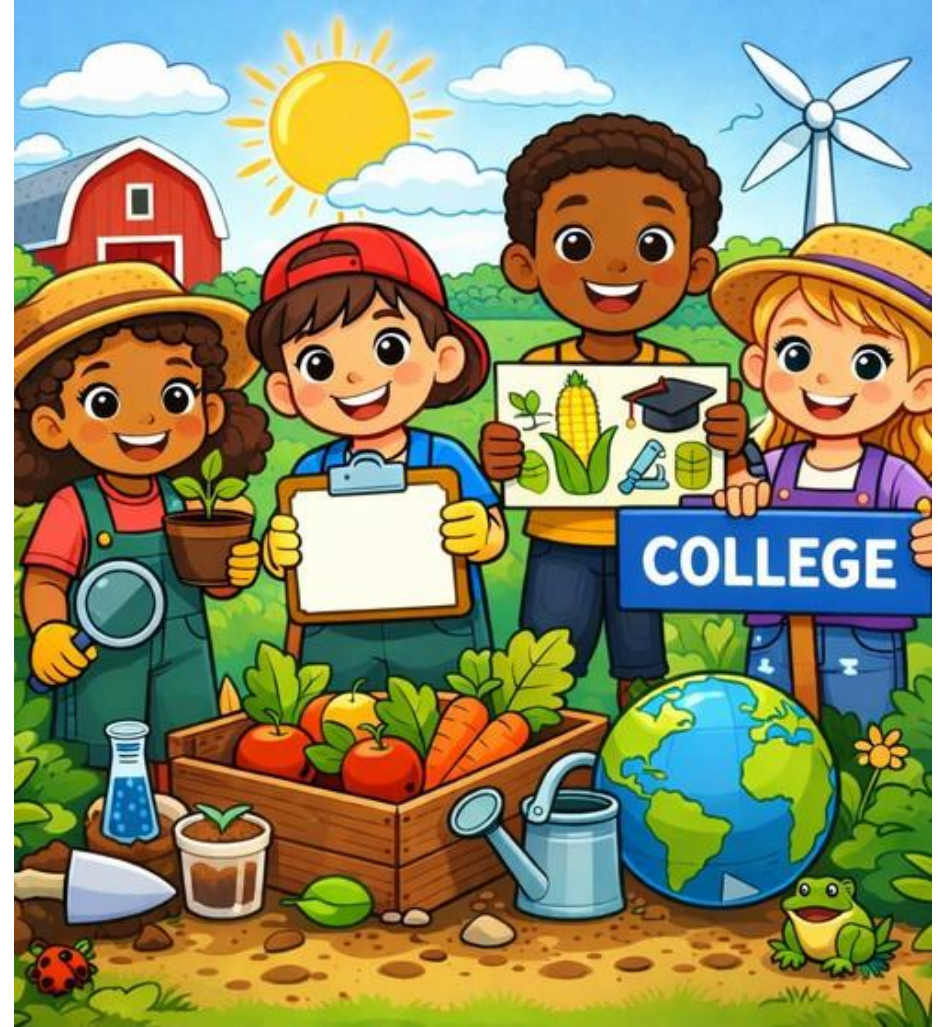

Why Water Matters

Plants need water to:

- Grow strong and tall
- Make food through photosynthesis
- Stay cool in the sun

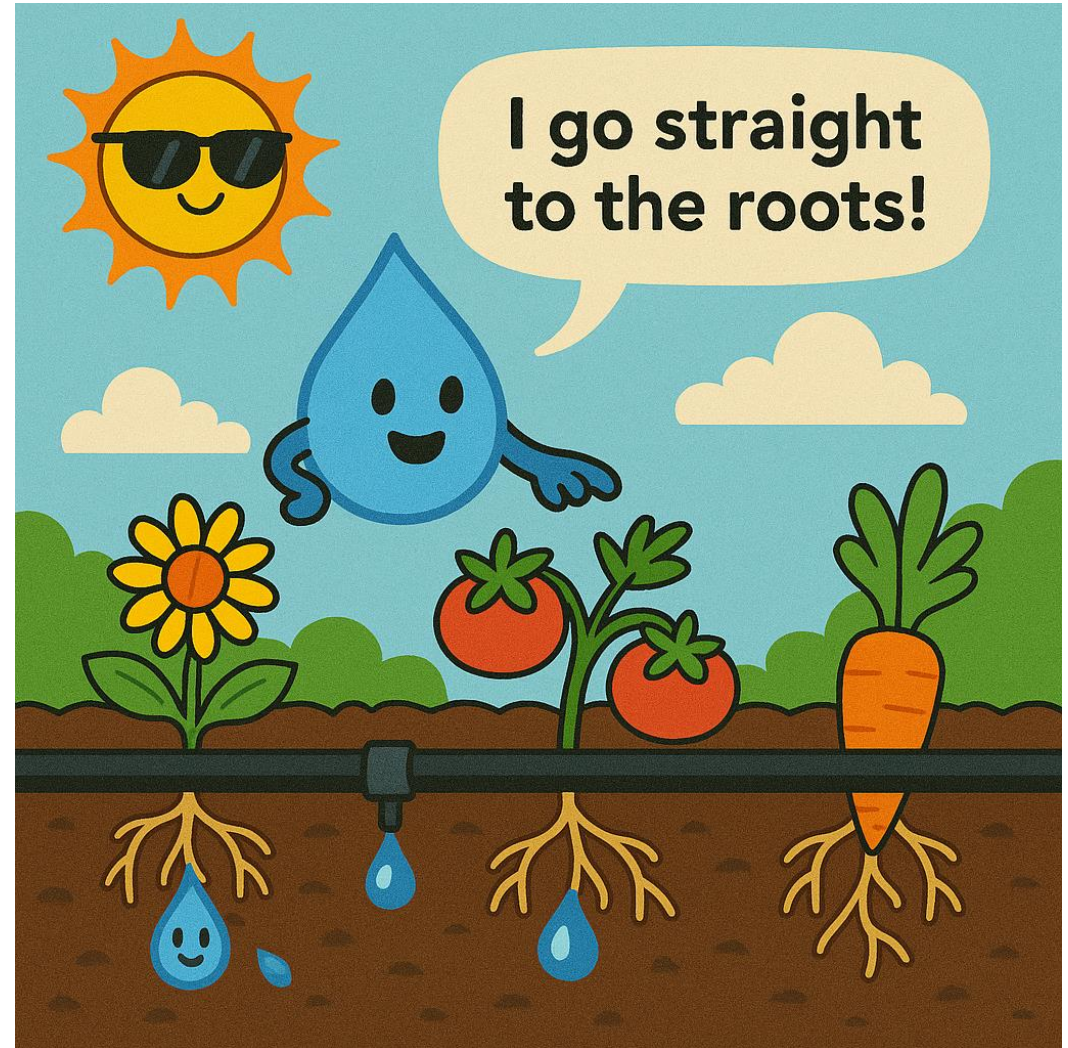


Different Ways to Water Your Garden 🌿

Let's look at four popular watering methods!

Different Watering Methods:

- ☐ Hand Watering
- 💧 Drip Irrigation
- 🌀 Soaker Hose
- ☁ Sprinkler System



☐ Hand Watering

What It Is:

- Using a watering can or hose to water plants directly.

Best For:

- Small gardens and potted plants.

Fun Tip:

- Talk to your plants while watering—they love encouragement! 😊



💧 Drip Irrigation

What It Is:

- Little tubes drip water right to the roots.

Why It's Cool:

- Saves water and helps big gardens stay happy!





Soaker Hoses

What It Is:

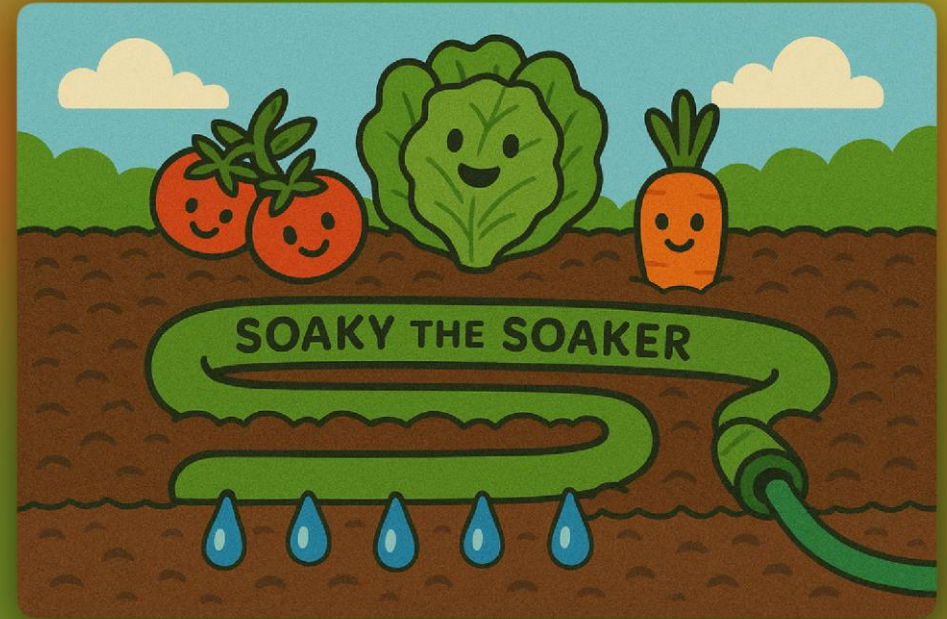
- A long, leaky hose that “sweats” water slowly into the soil.

Best For:

- Raised beds or rows of vegetables.

Fun Fact:

*You can hide it under mulch to keep your garden looking neat!



Sprinkler Systems

What It Is:

- Sprays water like rain over a large area.

Watch Out!

- Water early or late so it doesn't all evaporate in the hot sun.

Challenge Question:

- “What time of day should you NOT water?”

Saving Water While Gardening 🌍

Tips for Smart Gardeners:

- 🕒 Water early in the Morning or Evening
- 🌿 Use Mulch to keep soil moist
- ☔ Try Rainwater Harvesting
- 🌵 Grow Drought-Tolerant Plants

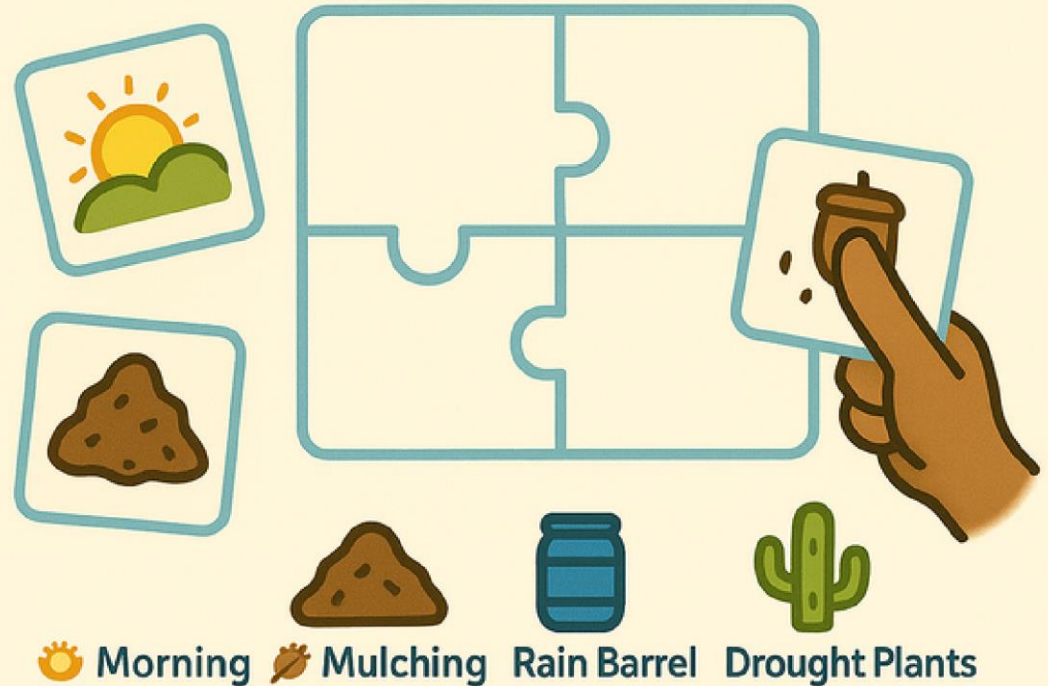

Watering Different Plants

-  Vegetables → Need steady moisture
-  Flowers → Need regular watering
-  Trees → Need deep but less often
-  Pots → Need water more often



Troubleshooting Water Problems

“What’s Wrong With My Plants?”

Problem	Signs	Fix
Too Much Water	Yellow leaves	Water less often
Too Little Water	Dry soil, brown edges	Water more deeply
Uneven Watering	Some plants droop	Move hose/sprinkler
Windy	Dry fast	Add barriers



Sustainable Watering

Smart gardeners take care of the planet while watering!

-  Use Greywater (reused water)
-  Try Xeriscaping (dry gardens)
-  Build a Rain Garden
-  Add Mulch for extra moisture



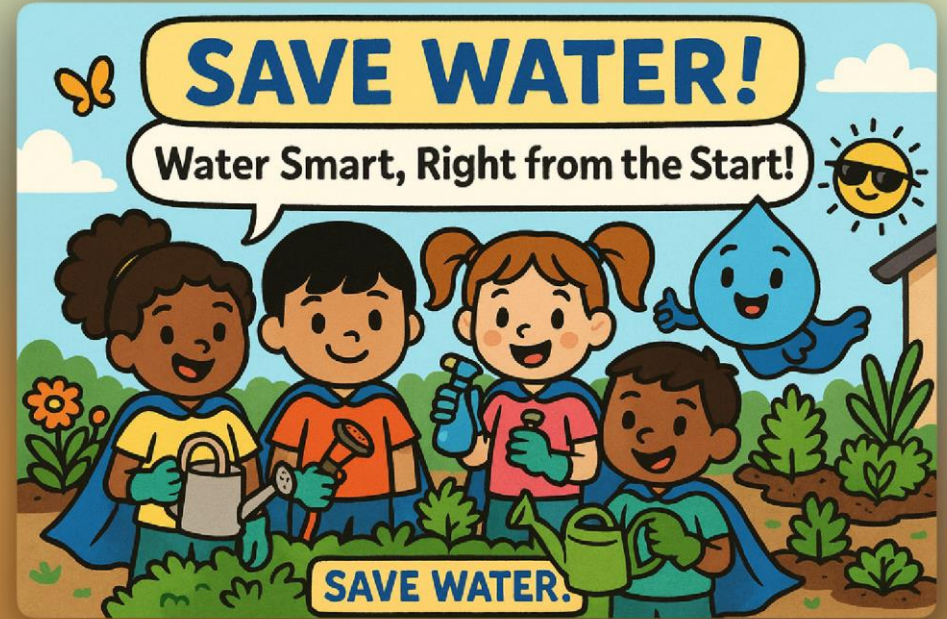

Water Management

Water conservation is essential for healthy gardens. Many professionals work to protect water, soil, and crops.



Water conservation is a career field

NRCS helps protect:

- Soil moisture
- Water quality
- Irrigation systems



Who Protects Water for a Living?



Water Resources Specialist

Monitors water usage and protects water quality in gardens and farms.



Environmental Engineer

Designs irrigation systems and solutions for water conservation.



Conservation Engineer

Develops systems to maintain healthy soil moisture and manage resources.
