Your goal is to find Each “TH, R, & L” sound as you work to increase your speed. The goal sounds are bolded in the first half of the reading below. The second half will require that you find each “TH, R, L” yourself. Review your recording and highlight all the “TH, R, Ls” you missed and try again. You can listen to your recording in slow motion to help you listen for your goal sounds.

Try to improve your reading speed and beat the time of your previous recording while maintaining a high accuracy for “TH, R, & L.”
