	Gather basic supplies (notebooks, pencils, binders, printer paper)
3.	Curriculum & Resources
	Choose your core subjects (Reading, Math, Science, History)
	Pick a curriculum, online program, or DIY resources
	Plan your first month of lessons (don't overdo it – start small!)
4.	Daily Schedule
	Create a simple daily rhythm (morning routine, reading time, outdoor break

	Set a consistent start time that works for your family
	Add breaks and fun activities to keep kids engaged
5.	Record Keeping
	Decide how you'll track attendance and progress (binder, app, spreadsheet)
	Save samples of your child's work for your records
